



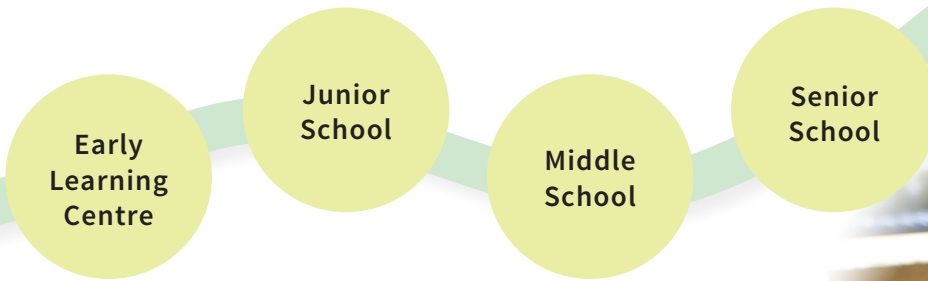
# WATER CONSERVATION
