### 33rd Annual Cardijn Exchange

I was very pleased to hear of the spirit with which students from Tenison Woods College competed at Cardijn College in 33rd annual exchange early in the week. ### Timor Leste Charity Ball - Be More, Not Want More

Once again, as part of the Timor-Leste fundraising, we will be holding a Charity Ball this Friday, 31 May. The Charity Ball is an opportunity for students in Year 11 and 12 to join together for a night of socialising and dancing at the City Hall, Main Corner while raising much needed funds and awareness for our closest neighbours in Timor-Leste. The theme of the Charity Ball this year is, 'Where flowers bloom, so does hope'.

Each year, Tenison Woods College sends a delegation of students to Timor-Leste. These students are 'self-funded' on their trip, and upon arrival in Timor-Leste they will immerse themselves in the culture of the communities they visit, while financially helping those with the greatest need. The students will visit schools, kindergartens, museums, NGO's and explore the beauty of the country and beautiful coastline.

At the Ball, students will hear from past immersion participants about the difference we are able to make in the lives of those we meet during a short presentation.

We ask students to consider how they are contributing, by way of being selfless and forgoing an item or luxury that they may otherwise have

spent; 'being more' as distinct from 'wanting more'. For example, the expense of their outfit, manicure, professional hair / makeup.

We encourage families to have this discussion with their children, and as much as we want students to look their best, we would like students to be mindful that in Timor-Leste, \$40 can feed a family of four for one month.

Please consider a conservative approach to this event. Perhaps borrow a dress or use one you already have? Don't buy new shoes, use existing shoes. Why not try Vinnies for that suit or slacks, or to accessorise your outfit. How about donating the money you would normally spend with a hairdresser directly to the cause? See if you can 'go without' an item or luxury appointment to help those in Timor-Leste who have very little. Every cent we raise will go directly to this cause, so please think about this.

#### **Catholic Education Week**

From Monday 3 June until Sunday 9 June we will celebrate Catholic Education Week in South Australia, underlining the many benefits of our system of schools, where ultimately every child matters.

I trust Catholic Education Week will offer members of our Tenison Woods College family an opportunity to reflect on the community we are, and the community we are called to be.

Catholic schools have been educating students in South Australia since the 1860s and today, 20% of South Australia's students attend a Catholic school with over 6,000 staff teaching 48,000 students.

## Year 12 Drama performance 'Empty Chair' – Wednesday, 5 June 2019


Next Wednesday, 5 June, the Year 12 Drama class have the opportunity to

## Renewables road trip helps students gain an insight into clean energy

Over 30 Tenison Woods College Year 10 and 11 Electrotech students were in Tailem Bend and Adelaide last Thursday and Friday.

The group were fortunate to get an insight into the States leading sustainable energy industries.

Vena Energy Australia's Tailem Bend solar farm, Sonnen Batterie and Tindo Solar each welcomed our students into their businesses and provided a glimpse into how South Australia is becoming a leader in a sustainable future. The students were in awe of the scale of Vena Energy's solar farm, with nearly 400,000 panels sprawled across the dusty plains at Tailem Bend. Tindo Solar's advanced robotics and manufacturing of their state of the art panels was another highlight, which was further heightened by the energy and enthusiasm of the company's CEO, Shayne Jaenisch. Sonnen Batterie provided the missing piece of the puzzle of Tenison Woods College's off grid ambition, allowing for modular storage of the power captured by our growing solar installations. The convoy are extremely grateful to these companies for opening their doors and providing a unique learning opportunity. This experience has given confidence to these young people about future career paths in the renewable energy industry. Tension Woods College has a deep and long term commitment to sustainability. We believe that it is only through a connected community that sustainability can be successful, which is why we are constantly partnering with local, national, and international organisations to further the impact and ultimately, improve the world our young people will inherit.


