Science and Engineering Challenge inspires students



On Friday 21 June, nine schools gathered at Tenison Woods College to take part in the Newcastle University Science and Engineering Challenge.

The University has five crews travelling almost non-stop around the country promoting STEM. They involve students in problem-solving challenges that engage creative, logical and mathematical thinking. Twenty-six of our students from Years 8, 9 and 10 formed teams of up to four students. Everyone worked well, engagement was high and there was a general buzz of excitement.

By midway through the day, we had a 40-point lead over Grant High School in second place, and despite tough opposition that saw the margin drop, we managed to fend off Grant in the afternoon to win the day by 3 points.

The Tenison Woods College students will now be invited to attend the State Championship, being held in Adelaide during August.

Many thanks to Rotary for fundraising and for organising involvement by local businesses and thank you to those volunteers who offered their time and expertise to help with the running of the day.

A further 10,900 young people aged 12 to 18 are experiencing homelessness; most of these are estranged from their families.

Students will have the chance to experience a night of homelessness with only a sleeping bag and a simple meal. Sincere thanks to the students and staff for their commitment and perseverance.

Tip of the Week from the Deputy Principal

Term 3 Timetables

Students in Years 8 to 12 will be able to access an electronic copy of their Term 3 timetable by Wednesday 10 July 2019 (the first week of the school holidays) through Simon. Parents will also be able to view their child/ren's timetables through PAM. To do this, parents will need to log into PAM on 10 July, select the child and then select the 'student timetable' tab. Opening the tab will provide information regarding your child's weekly timetable for Term 3, including their teacher for each subject and lesson times.

Term 3 Timetable Changes

At Tenison Woods College, we understand there are, at times, personal and academic reasons for students to reassess their subject selections. Students have the option of changing their subject selections either at the end of term or the beginning of each term and semester. Students have a three week window to discuss their timetables and to make adjustments to new electives or semester based subjects beginning at the start of each semester or term. Students who wish to discuss adjustments to their timetable are to make an appointment at the PRC Office or Front Administration office during recess or lunch time. If students require subject changes, the process for this is outlined below:

- Student to collect a Subject Change Form from the Front office or the PRC Office and have it signed by the relevant staff and their parents/carers
- Student to then meet with the relevant personnel to discuss the subject change, students will be informed of these personnel at the start of Term 3.
- Once the subject change is made, the student changes class

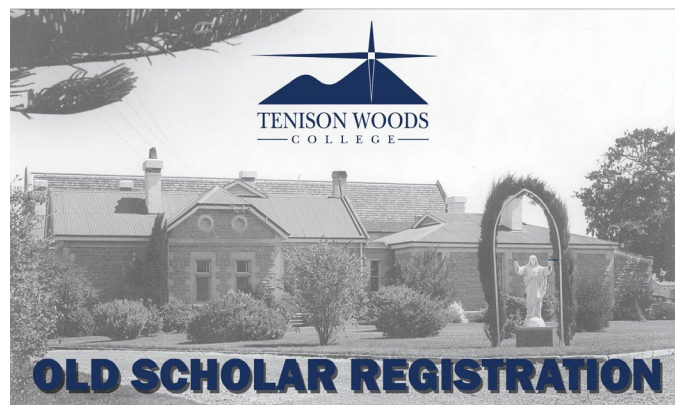

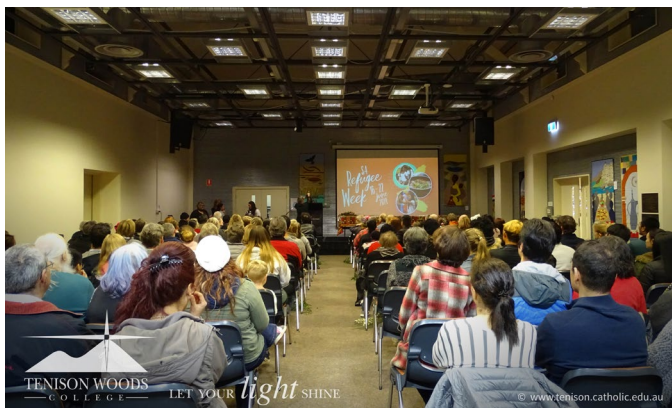

Refugee Week Celebrated with Multi-Cultural Feast

Refugee Week culminated in a Migrant Resource Centre and Mount Gambier City Council collaborative community event at the Main Corner on Saturday night. Food and culture were celebrated throughout the evening. Cooking demonstrations, dance and music entertained the large crowd and cultural information was shared by presenters representing many cultures including Indigenous, Karenni, Congolese, Dutch and Iranian. The Tenison Woods College Hospitality Academy, under the leadership of Jen McCourt, were on-hand to serve the food to the 120 people present and ensure the kitchen ran smoothly. Tom's Sustainable School Tour Update from the US

For those who might be missing their resident 'Greenie', Tom Linnell, Tom reports he has spent much of Week 7 and 8 in the USA, visiting leading schools and community groups who are pioneering the integration of sustainability and education. Four days in California's San Francisco saw Tom spend a day each in two schools in the Bay Area, both of which had very unique programs with strong links to the local community. Although his flight arrived without any of his luggage, Tom didn't complain at the opportunity to pick up a few new items for his wardrobe. Just before leaving California, he made the trek four hours north to Yosemite National Park and stumbled across the Wilderness Centre, which provided the community with a range of educational resources about caring for yourself and nature while in the park. After missing a train, only to be later delayed by five hours at San Francisco airport, Tom finally arrived in Chicago, Illinois. The highlight of his visit to Chicago was a day spent in an R-8 school, The Academy for the Global Citizen. This International Baccalaureate public school is bilingual (two languages spoken in all classes), educating the children with a major focus on sustainability. The cafeteria, which the students ate breakfast and lunch at every day, consisted of only organic ingredients and meals made from scratch on campus. This was a very unique feature of the community, most of which was from low socioeconomic backgrounds. Tom was also able to visit a number of Chicago's 100 rooftop gardens and some very productive community ran urban farms. One particular program partnered with a local hospital, with the doctors prescribing patients with VeggieRX, a prescription for local organic vegetables that they could pick up from the farms for free, as well as complimentary cooking and gardening lessons. Stay tuned for Tom's next update from New York and Boston.



Timor-Leste Team wrap up epic Fundraising efforts

As we get ready to head off on the 2019 Timor-Leste Immersion Tour, I would like to share with you all what we will be taking over with us. With multiple fundraising events and generous donations from school and community members, we have raised \$16,000! On top of this, we have already sent \$2,000 over to Mulara earlier in the year so they could continue working on their school building. Two computers were purchased for the Dominican Orphanage at a cost of \$650 each and we will take over \$12,000 (AUS) cash to gift to the communities we visit. We are also taking over 150 'Days for Girls' sanitary packs and over 100 Stationery packs put together by our Junior school STARS. I would like to sincerely thank both the school and parish communities for their amazing support.

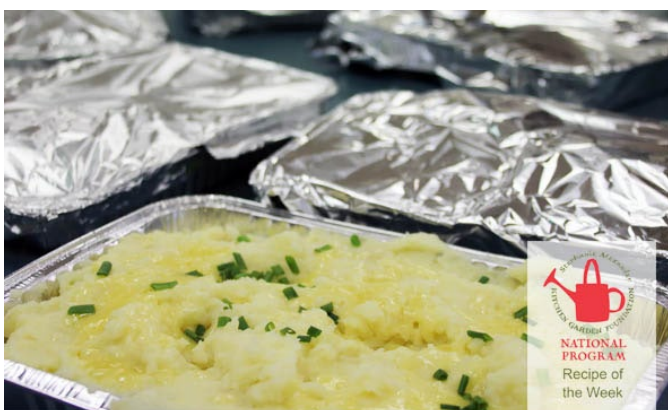
Shining in the Classroom Dancing with Miss K
