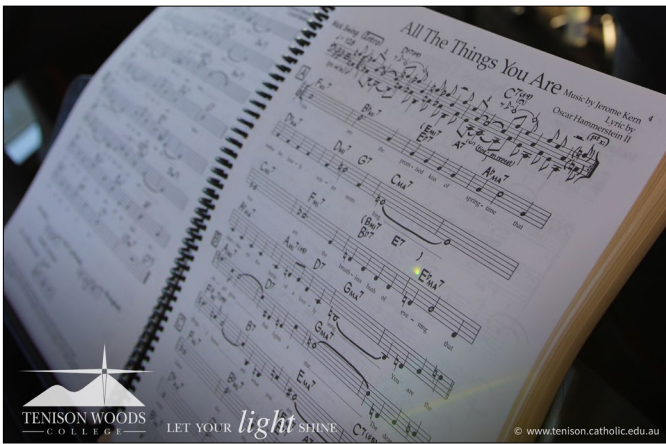

**Aleisha** – 100m Backstroke 7th, 200m Backstroke 8th, 100m Individual Medley 10th.

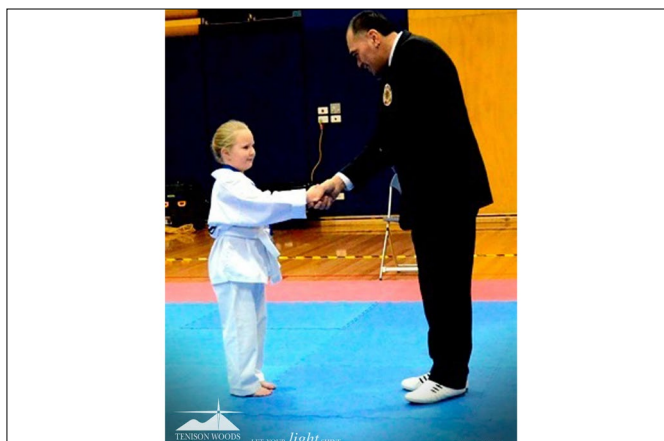


## Year 6/7 Boys Perform Well at SAPSASA Football
