At Tenison Woods College, we look forward to this transition taking place in 2021. The College Board has been preparing for this future for the past five years with an exciting and comprehensive [Master Plan](#). The first horizon of the Master Plan will include preparing for the stimulating opportunities offered to Year 7 Students; both current Students of the College, and those who will join us from the various Mount Gambier and Regional Primary Schools.

For those who are interested, I will elaborate on Stage One of the Master Plan in next week's newsletter.

2020 Pathways Expo and 2020 Year 8 to 12 Subject Selection Information Evening.

At Tenison Woods College every learner has a place and every learner has a pathway, every learner will shine. That is our challenge and our celebration. Staff Listening, Learning and Collaboration – AR19

I have often indicated that school communities are all about relationships, and good learning is nurtured by intentional, life-giving relationships. I am delighted that all teaching staff this year will continue to deliberately think about the ways they can refine and improve learning in their classrooms through reflecting on their craft. Each teaching staff member is implementing an Action Research Project, which is assisting them to reflect on the learning environment they are creating and how learning best unfolds in their care.

This is a wonderful commitment to professional learning because every Teacher at Tenison Woods College is aspiring to be the best they can be:

- For themselves as Teachers;
- For Students;
- For their colleagues - other Teachers and Co-Educators.

In all this, I think they are also illustrating the understanding that the two biggest determinants of success in life are curiosity and grit. In persisting with the Action Research project in the busyness of Term 3, I am hopeful of continuing a whole-school discourse about the elements of excellent learning environments, in such a way that we celebrate the craft of teaching and the impact of excellent teaching practice. I also look forward to staff celebrating their actions and findings during our staff conference day AR19 on 25 October - the Mount Gambier Show school closure day.

Television Viewing

Occasionally programs come up on television that focus on issues for young people. It is good for parents to be aware of them and to have some guidelines to support their teenagers if needed.

“The Hunting” is a new show that will air on SBS over four weeks, beginning Thursday 1 August. It is a confronting, raw and incredibly realistic mini-series. It conveys “strong messages about consent, trust, sexism, masculinity, online exploitation and friendship within school settings”. It will appeal to many of our young people in the Middle and Senior Schools.

If your teenager wishes to watch the program, it may be good to watch it together so that you can discuss the issues raised, however be aware that some of the scenes are quite sexually explicit.

There are various guidelines published for parents. Here is a snapshot of their advice;

- Allow your teen to sit somewhere where eye-contact isn't crucial so that you are not watching them watch the program.
- Use the program as an invitation for discussion regarding respectful and hope-filled relationships.
- Ask general questions rather than interrogate.
- Remind your teen that whatever mistakes they make there is always a way forward with mutual support.
- If your teen is distressed or exhibits behaviour changes, be ready to listen or seek support.
- Support is available from our two College Counsellors: Mairead Mackle and Laura Herbert.

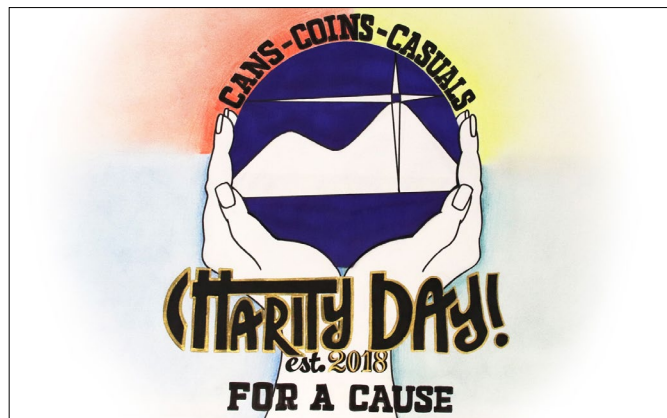

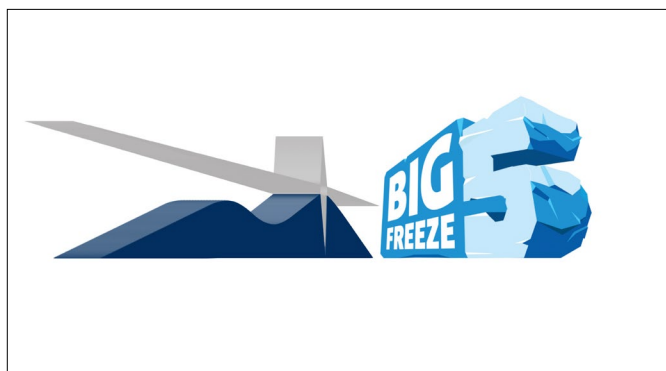

Collecting Bottle Caps 4 Kidz

"Caps 4 Kidz" is a project aimed at collecting plastic bottle caps to reduce landfill. The bottle caps collected during this campaign will be melted down to make prosthetic hands and arms for children. Working in conjunction with UniSA and Envision, the Students of Year 7C have volunteered to oversee the collection of these bottle caps for Middle and Senior School. In week 3, collection points will be set up around the College and in classes for the plastic bottle caps. \$500 is up for grabs to the school who raises the most bottle caps.

Here's how the campaign works;

1. Bottle caps will be collected during Weeks 1-5.
2. At the end of Week 5, representatives from UniSA will collect the bottle caps and measure each school's collection through weight.
3. UniSA: Mount Gambier will then notify the winning school later in the Term.

What type of bottle caps are eligible?

- Number 2 and Number 4 bottle caps are required. Please check caps before donating. If there is no '2' or '4' on the inside of the cap, please do not add to the collection. These caps are most commonly found on milk, juice and soft-drink containers.
- Bottle caps must be washed and dried.
- Please take out the plastic seal (ring) as this cannot be used by Envision.

Schools of all sizes have an opportunity to win!

The winning school will have the most bottle caps per capita. E.g. 1000 bottle caps/500 students = 2 per student. 1000 bottle caps/100 students = 10 per student. (Please note bottle caps will be measured by weight, rather than counting).
