## From The Principal

### International Day of Peace – A College commitment

Saturday 21 September is the International Day of Peace. Each year there is a theme for the day, and this year's theme is 'Climate Action for Peace' which celebrates the 13th Sustainable Development Goal ratified by the United Nations, which urges us to "Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts." Climate Action is a call for immediate action by all to lower greenhouse emissions, build resilience and improve education on climate change.

This year's International Day of Peace draws inspiration from the encyclical, *Laudato Si, mi' Signore* – "Praise be to you, my Lord." Based on the teachings of St Francis, the concept of the encyclical is integral ecology; the fundamental relationship of the person with God, with one's self, with other human beings and with creation. "Everything is connected," the Pope writes. "Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined with a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society."

Ten key messages offered by the encyclical are characterised by commentators as:

1. The spiritual perspective is now part of the discussion on the environment.
2. The poor are disproportionately affected by climate change.
3. Less is more.
4. Catholic social teaching now includes teaching on the environment.
5. Discussions about ecology can be grounded in the Bible and church tradition.
6. Everything is connected -- including the economy.
7. Scientific research on the environment is to be praised and used.
8. Widespread indifference and selfishness worsen environmental problems.
9. Global dialogue and solidarity are needed.
10. A change of heart is required.

### NAPLAN 2019

The 2019 NAPLAN Results will be sent home with Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students on Thursday this week. The Individual Student Report outlines each student's result, the national average, the school average and the range of achievements for each test domain. A copy of each report is retained at the school.

Parents/Carers are invited to make a time to discuss the individual results and any implications for your child's learning. In Years 3 and 5 and 7 this would be with the Class Teacher. With Year 9 students their Numeracy results can be discussed with their Mathematics and teacher and Literacy results with the English teacher. Home Group teachers may also be helpful when discussing any concerns you may have.

Parents/Carers of Year 9 students may recall that there were disruptions when students were sitting the 2019 Writing test. Some students did miss an amount of time that may have affected their result in this test but chose not to resit this test. ### Transforming The Pines – Starting from Week 10, Term 3

To commence our College building program and fulfilling our Master Plan we are transforming The Pines, from a zone of 6 classrooms to a location that will house: Poplars; 12 classrooms; staff preparation area; breakout spaces; student and staff toilets; and wonderful grounds, with increased play and quiet spaces, that accentuate our ecological commitment. We are aiming to have this area ready for 28 January 2020.

Civil works for the Pines Precinct are progressing well. This is impacting on the parking for some senior school students so permission has been granted to those affected to share the car park between the Pines and Thomas Ryan building.

To assist this preparation we will also be asking that at the end of week 9 classes shift from the current Pines classrooms, so transportable removalists and builders can start on the site in week 10. There will be some classroom challenges and parking challenges for week 10 and the first couple of weeks of term 4. However I ask our community to offer their support as much as they are able - it will all be worth it!

### Stage One - Architectural Consultation

Edge Architects will be present on Thursday conducting consultations with staff and Board members in relation to Stage One of our building project, gravitating around the ELCC expansion, Reception and Primary school build, OSHC service, Music redevelopment and The Pines transformation. It will be a busy day of bringing our deliberate and extensive efforts in the area of pedagogy, to life in the built form. I thank in anticipation all those who will be involved and I can't wait!

You will note the staggered start to the commencement of the year for students. This approach will assist students in the identified year levels to complete the best possible transition processes with the relevant teaching and support staff.

We also look forward to preparing transition programs that will accentuate our relationship with parents and carers in the support of student learning and wellbeing.

## From the Assistant Principal Student and Staff Development

This week I will focus on Student learning, reports and timetables. I will explain how to access information regarding your child's learning, their reports and timetables for Year 8-12 students.

### Accessing PAM

As parents/caregivers, we are always eager to be up to date with the learning progress of our children. The Parent Access Module (PAM) has the wonderful functionality to keep families informed of each child's learning progress through the course of the term and semester. Every family has access to a PAM account, which can be opened from the Tenison Woods College Website or entering [pam.tenison.catholic.edu.au](http://pam.tenison.catholic.edu.au) into any web browser.

### Your Child's Learning Area Tasks

A fantastic feature of PAM is being able to view students' progress in their learning areas. As we approach the end of Term 3, I recommended that parents view this information. Once logged into PAM, select your child and then select the 'Learning Areas' tab. This tab provides current and timely information regarding assessment tasks, and the learning your child has been engaged in.

### Term 4 Timetables

Timetables for students in Years 8 – 12 will be available for students to view in SIMON and parents to view through PAM. These are available from Tuesday 1 October, 2019. To access your child's timetable, log into PAM, select your child and then select the 'Student timetable' tab. Opening the tab will provide information regarding your child's weekly timetable for Term 4, including their teacher for each subject and lesson times.

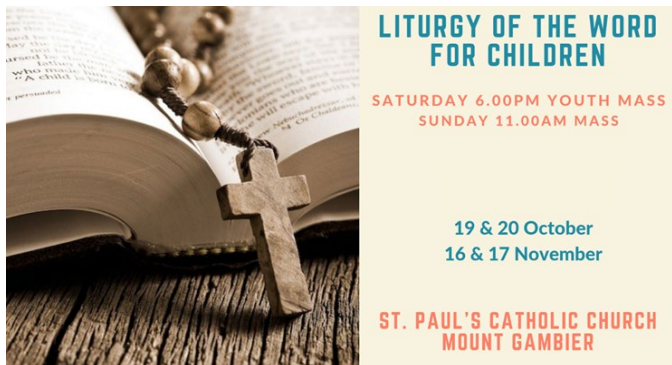
**Parish Mass:**

## Year 5 'Classrooms of the Past' Excursion

Last Thursday, the Year 5's ventured to Penola to explore what it was like to live in the colonial past as we have been learning about how the colonial settlement began, what life was like, how it progressed and how it changed the lives of the Aboriginal people. We have also been investigating the gold rush and Eureka Stockade.

We arrived in Penola at the Mary Mackillop Interpretive Centre and were greeted by the beautiful staff that work there. The students rotated between three different activities throughout the day. They were able to explore Petticoat Lane and learn the history of the cottages along the lane and the families who resided in them. They were able to learn more about Father Julian Tenison Woods and Mary Mackillop, the founders of the Sisters of Saint Joseph, from the exhibitions and the informative staff at the centre, who gave each group a mini tour of the sections. The students also experienced just what it would have been like to attend school in that era, entering into the original schoolhouse of the Sisters of St Joseph and having the very strict Mrs. Muller teach them just as students would've been taught in 1867.

The students thoroughly enjoyed stepping back in time for the day in their old fashion attire, enjoying games and schoolhouse experience.

There have been some great projects being completed by students already and I am looking forward to reading through more.

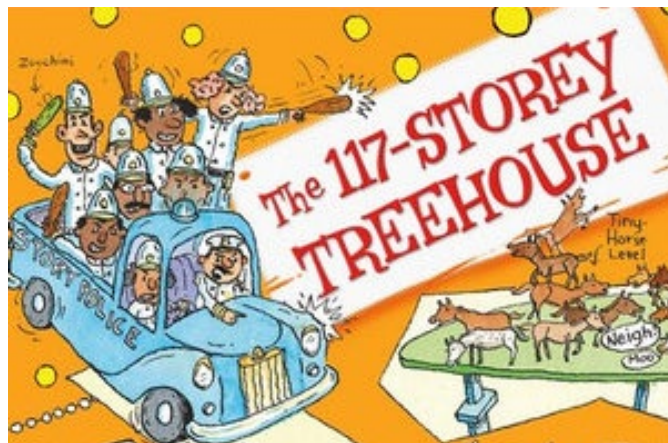

## Shining Light Awards Recipients Bob and Hopper Gabriel

### Introducing two of this year's Shining Light Recipients: Bob and Hopper Gabriel

Robert and Dorothy (affectionately known as "Hopper") Gabriel have been involved within the College Community since 1942. Bob was a student at Marist Brothers.

Bob and Hopper met in the early 1950's. Soon after, they got married and started a family; culminating in 7 children in just 9 years!

Bob began work as an apprentice for Phil Lambie at the age of 15. In 1959, Lambie retired and offered Bob the opportunity to take on his client list. In doing so, RW & DD Gabriel Electrical Contractors was born. The business was a true partnership between the couple, with Bob servicing customers and Hopper managing the clerical side, while at home with a young family. Gabriel Contractors has supported the community through local sporting clubs, donating the business' services and more.

Initially, Hopper became involved with the College as a parent. She then offered a hand in the canteen, assisted with College catering, became President of the Parents and Friends Society, was on the College Board and even spent two years as the College Netball Coach. In her later years, she and Bob also enjoyed getting out for a hit of golf.

Bob was involved with the local Lions club and was a member of the Knights of the Southern Cross. Within the College, he helped at sports days and with volunteering at events. Bob was more than happy to take a 'background' role – preferring to get things done "without too much fuss".

In 2005, Bob passed away peacefully with family by his side.

In more recent times, Hopper has supported local community groups, like St Vincent de Paul Society and the Probus Club.

The dedication and passion that Bob and Hopper have had for not only the College, but our local community, is one that is greatly felt, but rarely recognised. The Gabriel name continues to support the College to this day with their family regularly offering assistance to the College's Hospitality Students. 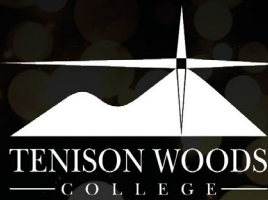

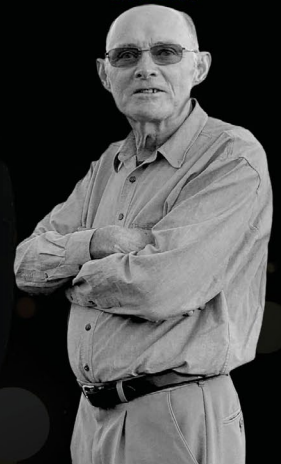
