#### Attendance - The First Step - Duty of Care

The way Tenison Woods College cares for each learner commences with its diligence in relation to school attendance. That is not only because each child or adolescent matters unequivocally, but also because the College has a significant legal obligation to accurately record student attendance. As such our collaborative approach with carers and parents in relation to this issue is foundational to our partnership.

If a student is absent, parents/carers are asked to either,

- (1) call the absentee phone line 8724 4659 and leave a message or
- (2) send a text message to 0429134568
- (3) provide an email to their Pastoral Care teacher stating your child's name, their homegroup, and the reason they are away for the day.
- Students must sign in at the school office using the Kiosk (R-6 at the Front
  Office, 7-9 Middle School Student Office & 10-12 at the Pam Ronan Centre) if
  they arrive at school after 8.45am.
- If a student needs to leave early, parent communication to the College is required to confirm arrangements, prior to signing out at the Kiosk.
- If a student is to be absent from school for a one-week period or more, a
  pre-arranged exemption form is to be completed and forwarded to the
  Principal for approval.

An SMS will be sent from (0429 134 568) if a parental call has not been made
to confirm absence and to provide an opportunity to confirm a reason for a
students' absence.

#### **HHDL Four Point Plan**

I reiterate the settings for schools in South Australia, which will complement our continuing deliberate and careful HHDL Strategy in Term 2.

- Masks will continue to be required to be worn by Year 7-12 students, staff and adults indoors. Masks are also strongly encouraged for Years 3-6 students.
- Asymptomatic close contacts will no longer be required to quarantine.
   They will instead be required to take five Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) over seven days and wear a mask when leaving home.
   To access free RATs, close contacts must register here and nominate on the form the collection point from which they will collect a free pack of RATs.
- 3. Close contacts who develop symptoms are still required to get a PCR test and isolate until a negative result is received.
- 4. Parents are permitted to enter school grounds and classrooms. Although parent meetings/events may generally resume as usual, schools should continue to hold parent meetings/events online where this can reasonably occur (such as for most parent teacher interviews).

I thank you in anticipation for your attention to the HHDL Four Point Plan; good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others and good Learning regardless of student location.

During Term 2, the health and wellbeing of students, families and staff remain our priority. We will continue to ensure that our school is a safe environment, maintaining the additional cleaning regime, which was commenced in 2020, accentuating natural ventilation, minimising movement and visitors within the school, and maintaining Sub-school delineation as much as is possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community.

#### Masks on Buses

We reiterate to families the expectation that Year 7-12 students wear protective masks on buses. Younger children are encouraged to wear masks to offer optimum protection in the confined bus space.

#### Need a tutor? Studiosity is our free online tutoring service

I remind families that students of Tenison Woods College in Years 7-12 have access to a free online tutoring service. Students are able to connect to expert tutors for live, one-to-one conversations about homework, assignments and exam preparation from  $3:00\,\mathrm{pm}-10:00\,\mathrm{pm}$  Monday to Friday. Give it a try – I know you will appreciate the service offered by Studiosity!

#### Food Allergy Awareness – awareness, avoidance, and action

Living with the risk of a severe allergic reaction, or anaphylaxis, takes planning, diligence and clear communication. At Tenison Woods College we believe that our community has a significant role in supporting those who live with the risk, so that through awareness, education and training they and their families can lead normal, healthy lives.

The website *Allergy Facts* offers support for individuals, parents and carers of people living with this risk, supporting the critical more personalised treatment and care. Please access it here. We encourage anyone who suspects they may have an allergy or those who have already been diagnosed to consult their allergist, immunologist, paediatrician or GP for personalised treatment and care. This includes regular follow-up so that they can access up to date information on managing their risk of anaphylaxis and communicating that information to our staff so that our community can support them in the best possible way.

#### Parish Planned Giving Rebate

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2022 for a deduction to be made.

#### EY-12 Staff Professional Development Days – 9 and 10 June

Early Years to Year 12 Staff are looking forward to the staff professional development days Thursday 9 and Friday 10 June, when they will devote time to literacy experiences in the Junior School, Integrated curriculum in the Middle School, Student Agency in the Senior School, as well as evolving further our wellbeing approach at the school, focusing on our response to attachment issues and trauma. Early Learning Centre Staff will devote time to their significant whole staff inquiry in relation to communication with parents, in addition to the College's wellbeing focus. Education Support Officers will

also be involved in the two days, which will additionally offer all staff the opportunity to refine their SEQTA Learning Management skills.

I remind families that these days are student-free days for the ELCC and R-12 students.

#### Gospel of the Liturgical Year: Luke - the World of Luke

This year, the gospel used within liturgical celebrations is Luke. There are some seasons of the liturgical year, like Easter, where Luke's Gospel is often used. Across this term, I invite you to engage with Luke's Gospel, just as our students

do each week during prayer. Our students are learning to interpret Scripture in their Religious Education lessons to make meaning of these passages for the modern world they live in. One way to explore these is to first consider the world of the author. Over the next few weeks, I will provide some snapshots of the world of Luke the evangelist.

Luke's Gospel was written in approximately 80 CE, some 50 years after the death and resurrection of Jesus. The author of Luke's Gospel is also attributed to having written the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospel was originally written in Greek for an audience predominately made up of Gentile Christians – someone who did not practice Jewish religious traditions before becoming a Christian. It is likely that this Gospel was written in and around the area of Antioch, located in modern day Turkey.

After not being able to gather as year levels indoors throughout Term 1, we are excited to be able to return to holding masses each week for year levels within the College community. Mass is celebrated each Thursday of the term and is led by a different class or year level each week. Mass begins at 9:15am in the College Chapel. As previously advised students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9 will be undertaking four NAPLAN tests during Weeks 2 and 3 of this term. Please avoid making any external appointments during this time for your child.

NAPLAN tests are constructed to give students an opportunity to demonstrate skills they have learnt over time through the school curriculum, and NAPLAN test days should be treated as just another routine event on the school calendar. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to reassure them that NAPLAN tests are just one part of their school program, and to advise them to simply do the best they can on the day.
