From The Principal

Transforming The Pines – Term 4 Planning

To commence our College building program and fulfilling our Master Plan we are transforming 'The Pines' from a zone of 6 classrooms to a location that will house:

- Poplars;
- 12 Classrooms;
- Staff preparation area;
- Breakout spaces and
- Student and Staff toilets;

all set amongst wonderful grounds, with increased play and quiet spaces, that accentuate our ecological commitment. We are aiming to have this area ready for 28 January 2020.

Civil works for the Pines Precinct are progressing well. With the commencement of the next phase of the construction at the rear of the College, there continue to be unavoidable disruptions to car parking and road usage in the College grounds. Navigation of the car park at the rear of the Moorak/Thomas Ryan Building will be restricted to one way only. Vehicles will only be able to enter this car park via the White Avenue driveway. Cars entering via Shepherdson Road will only be able to drop students off outside of the Music building and then exit again via Shepherdson Road.

In amongst the busyness of concluding the year, term four will also be coloured by classroom transitions that are required to ensure the new Pines Precinct will be ready for 28 January 2020.

I apologise in anticipation of the inconvenience, but we have attempted a variety of scenarios, and the one below is the best one we could come to, given a range of parameters, particularly associated with the removalist and building schedules. Key features of the transition include:

Over the past year, these 12 staff have been working with the internationally recognised Dr Stephen Brown from The Brown Collective, along with co-facilitator Amanda Ypinazar. Stephen and Amanda acknowledged the importance of identifying, supporting and developing a diverse range of leaders, and through the program providing an opportunity for individuals to reflect on their leadership capabilities, understand the importance of interpersonal relationships in their leadership, and make a contribution to the shared direction of their school and the broader system.

Tenison Woods College Staff and Staff from the three South East Catholic schools, Mary MacKillop Memorial School, Penola and St. Anthony's Catholic Primary School, Millicent participated in the program, and were accompanied by the Principals from the three Catholic Schools in our region. Senior personnel from Catholic Education South Australia Phil Holmes, Steve Genesin and Chris Pyne also supported the yearlong program by mentoring the staff and participating in the Leadership Challenge presentation day.

Since 2017, Forty-two staff have now completed this brilliant course; a course of international credibility offered in a regional location by two experienced, highly credentialed and passionate facilitators, with mentoring commitment from CESA senior leaders. Rowena Ulbrick has lead us through this and we have also drawn connections to the Living Learning Leading Framework (Catholic Education South Australia, 2018) where there is a clear intent for Catholic Schools prepare young people "to become, 'thriving people, capable learners, leaders for the world God desires.'

At this time of the Catholic Education South Australia (CESA) Living, Learning, Leading Framework, AR19 is a commitment to continue reflecting on our craft as Catholic educators, who aspire to enabling each and every learner at Tenison Woods College to shine, with all the deep reflection, critique, collaboration, humility, professional frailty and wonderful communal success that such whole staff endeavour brings.

Father Julian Tenison Woods Feast Day

October 7 was the Feast Day of Father Julian Tenison Woods. October 7 commemmorates 140 years since his death.

Julian Edmund Tenison Woods was born in London on 15 November 1832. Father Julian's first appointment was to the parish of Penola. During his ten years there, he met Mary MacKillop. They shared a vision to assist families and the poor and together they founded the Sisters of Saint Joseph (1866) to begin an education and social ministry that continues today.

In 1867, Father Julian was appointed Director of Catholic Education and moved to Adelaide. Young women were joining the new congregation and so he was able to invite the Sisters of Saint Joseph to open schools across many parishes. Four years later, circumstances forced him to find work as a missioner in other parts of Australia – he travelled extensively particularly in Tasmania, New South Wales and Queensland and spent much time also doing scientific research, writing papers, articles and letters to newspapers and giving lectures about his discoveries.

From 1883 – 1886 Father Julian travelled to Asia to continue his research and writing, returning with serious health problems and being cared for in Sydney until his death on 7 October 1887.

"Every Learner has a Pathway"

The College's Early Learning Community Centre values the importance of sensorial learning and the wellbeing of self and others.

The ELCC created a sensory and wellbeing path for children to walk barefoot amongst the weeping trees, listen to the sounds of birds visiting the bird bath and feel different textures under their feet. The children are able to explore all their senses including smelling the flowers and tasting the herbs growing in the wellbeing garden.

The children explored their senses this term; tasting, touching, smelling, hearing and seeing different items and textures.

The elements within the new path include water, tiles, mosaic squares, river rocks, sandstone, grass, sand, bark and bricks as they "embrace their learning journey" with the vision of Earth, Fire, Water and Air incorporated.

Native plants were also chosen by the children in respect to the Boandik people in the ELCC's wellbeing/sensory path area.

Programs run for a varying number of weeks but generally no less than 20 weeks. Programs are mostly delivered to children in Years 1 to 5. I have 2 session times available for next term, which would ideally lead to continuing the program in 2020. The program does require substantial parent commitment and is \$50/session.
