

### Nut and Allergens Awareness Policy

As we commence Term 4 I remind families of our Nut and Allergens Awareness Policy that is concerned with the whole school approach to the health care and management of those members of the Tenison Woods College community who suffer from specific allergies.

The Policy, which can be viewed on our website: <u>https://www.tenison.catho-lic.edu.au/\_files/d/44251073/W\_Nuts\_and\_Allergens\_Awareness\_2019.pdf</u> is based on the College position not to guarantee a completely nut and allergen free environment, rather to minimise the risk of exposure, encourage self-responsibility and plan for effective response to possible emergencies.

The College recognises that a number of students and staff suffer from potentially life-threatening allergies to certain foods or toxins. The College

seeks the support of students, staff and parents in maintaining a minimised risk environment whilst at the same time ensuring we provide an effective response to potential anaphylactic situations.

Current medical advice from immunologists suggest that, in nut-free environments, allergic children and families run a real risk of letting their guard down and thinking they are in a totally safe environment. The College is aware of the stresses imposed on students, parents, care-givers and staff when having a student who suffers allergic reactions in their care. Therefore, the provision of procedures and systems to effectively manage such stress is also the aim of this policy.

The Nut and Allergens Awareness Policy accentuates the responsibilities of parents, students, staff and College Leadership. As Principal, where the safety of each individual community member is of paramount importance to me, I take my responsibilities seriously and look forward to: regularly reminding parents of the 'Nut and Allergens Awareness Policy' in the newsletter; reviewing this policy on a regular basis; and ensuring current medical information is available to staff.

### From the Assistant Principal Student and Staff Development

#### **Television Viewing**

Every once in a while programs come up on television that focus on issues for young people and it is good for parents to be alerted to them and to have some guidelines to support their teenagers if needed. The Hunting which recently aired on SBS is a confronting, raw and incredibly realistic mini-series. It conveys "strong messages about consent, trust, sexism, masculinity, online exploitation and friendship within school settings". It will appeal to many of our young people in the Middle and Senior Schools, so as parents it would be beneficial to be prepared and if possible watch this with your teenager.

If your teenager wishes to watch the program it would be good to watch it together so that you can discuss the issues raised, however be aware that some of the scenes are quite sexually explicit. There are various guidelines published for parents and I will give you a snapshot of their advice.

- Allow your teen to sit somewhere where eye-contact isn't crucial so that you are not watching them watch the program.
- Use the program as an invitation for discussion regarding respectful and hope-filled relationships.
- Ask general questions rather than interrogate.
- Remind your teen that whatever mistakes they make there is always a way forward with mutual support
- If your teen is distressed or exhibits behaviour changes be ready to listen or seek support.
- Support is available from our two counsellors: Mairead Mackle and Laura Herbert.
