Junior School Italian Day Celebrated on Friday



Last Friday, Tenison Woods College held “Italian Day” throughout the Junior School. This marked the College’s first Italian Day since 2016 and the return of the ‘Palio di Tenison’ after nearly 10 years! Students came to school dressed in Italian colours such as red, white and green and even the colours of their favourite soccer teams.

Throughout the morning students were involved in various activities within their year levels. With help from a member of our Italian community – Frank Eramo - our Year 2 students taught our Reception students how to play Bocce. Bocce is an Italian ball game similar to lawn bowls. Our Year 1 students learnt the story of Pinocchio, the puppet, made by the Italian woodcarver Geppetto, who came alive! Students then made their own Pinocchio figures. Year 3 students drew inspiration from Italian items to create their own mosaic art works. Mosaic art was very popular during the Ancient Roman times and can be seen today in many different buildings all across Italy. Our Year 5 students drew inspiration from various Italian artists and used this inspiration to create their own art works. They particularly focussed on trying to sculpt like Michelangelo by sculpting cakes of soap and turning these into various different things. They also created fruit face art works in the style of 16th century Italian artist Arcimboldo.



Perhaps the highlight of the day was created by the College’s Year 4 students. After learning about the “Palio di Siena” in their Italian lessons, students recreated the event here at the College. The Palio di Siena is the most famous Italian horse race in which the ‘Contrade’ of the town of Siena are represented and race against each other for the coveted Palio prize. Our Year 4 students firstly participated in a ‘Corteo Storico’ in which they paraded around the race track in their teams showing the horses they had created, banners, colours and team names to the entirety of the Junior School. They then participated in their own relay races involving hurdles and metre ruler horses. The entire Junior School cheered loudly throughout the afternoon and enjoyed being spectators of what was an excellent event. Perhaps the loudest cheer of all came for Professor Vecchiarelli and his Year 9 class who had also come down to watch the Palio. Once the Year 4’s had finished racing the Year 9’s and Professor Vecchiarelli were let loose in a race of their own.



The day culminated in an Italian themed Junior School Assembly in which the students were able to show what they had been working on during the day and the winners of the Palio were presented.

Feast Day of Venerable Catherine McAuley, Monday 11 November

Our College draws inspiration from our four founders. One of them is the Venerable Catherine McAuley and from her "House of Mercy", which opened in 1827 through to the founding of her religious order, Religious Sisters of Mercy, in 1831 through to today where there are more than 12,000 Sisters of Mercy worldwide, running 200 health care facilities, 19 colleges, 58 schools and provide many other services that help people of every age, their mission has remained constant. Catherine knew that to be a real help to the poor and needy, she needed to be among them so that she could see the realities of the struggles they faced on a daily basis.

Known in Ireland as the "walking nuns" because they spent so much time in the community helping people, the Sisters of Mercy gave (and still do) voice and hope to many in our world. Catherine died in 1841 and Pope John Paul II declared Sister Catherine McAuley "Venerable" in 1990. This is the first step on the path to sainthood.

Catherine always said that "proof of love is deed." For Catherine McAuley, 'putting her hand up to help out' was her daily endeavor and it is an inspiring example of how we can let our empathetic and caring deeds be the proof of our love for Jesus and others.

Student Attendance

This week I would like to focus on the process relating to student attendance. Student attendance is taken at the start of each day and is an important activity in the daily procedures of Tenison Woods College. Student attendance data is used for legal, student welfare and achievement purposes, as well as school resourcing.

The following process is highlighted to parents in relation to student attendance and in particular, if your child is not attending for the day or consecutive days.

- If a student is absent, parents/carers are asked to call the absentee phone line (08 8724 4659) or send a text message to 0429 134 568, or if known prior to the date, provide a written explanation to their Homegroup teacher.
- If a student is late, a note explaining why must be written in the student's planner.
- Students must sign in at the school office using the SIMON Kiosk (R-9 at the Front Office, 10-12 at the Pam Ronan Centre) if they arrive at school after 8.45am.
- If a student is to be absent from school for a one week period or more, an exemption form is to be completed and forwarded to the Principal for approval. These are available from the Front Office.
- When sick for three consecutive days or more, a Doctor's Certificate is required.

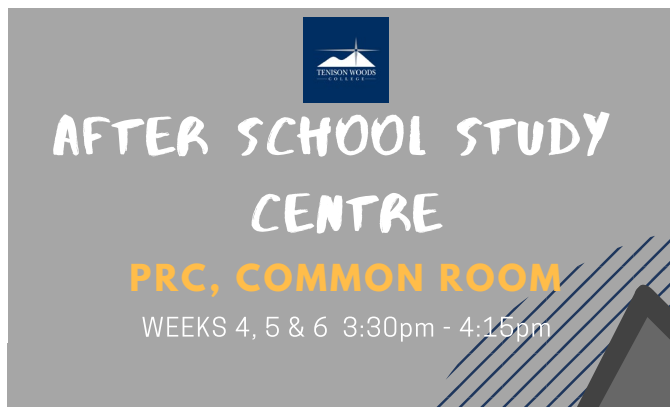

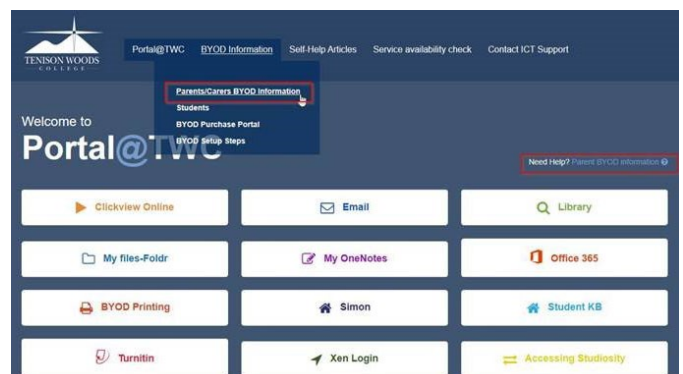

The Ultimate Renewable Forest Learning Pathway Program is a partnership approach providing a unique opportunity for students to develop skills which support future pathways in this Industry. The pathway program incorporates a range of classroom and field-based experiences.

In 2020, 15 places will be open for Year 10 students from across the region. Students will participate in an Industry Exploration program learning about the different aspects of the industry from seed to end product. Students undertake core modules from Nationally Recognised Industry courses as well as a range of industry led development opportunities. In Year 10, students will learn about wood science, genetic selections & cell structures, what makes a good tree, statistics and carbon footprint. That was the scenario for this year's Year 8 and 9 STEM days held last week. Fifteen teams in each year level vied for the most points; representing the greatest amount of artwork saved. This was the second year that we have run a STEM day for Year 8 and 9 students and we see them as an excellent way for students to develop their collaborative and communication skills while working on some fundamental engineering problems. P.A.R.T.Y. Outreach Program

On Wednesday 30 October, 18 Year 10 & 11 students that are completing or have completed the Stage 1 Integrated Learning – substance misuse course, attended P.A.R.T.Y, which is Preventative Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth Program.

The P.A.R.T.Y. Outreach Program was led by two experienced emergency nurses discussing risks and statistics, personal stories of trauma along with spokespeople from SAPOL, Ambulance and the CFS. The students were taken on a devastating journey of a trauma patient by participating in a simulated emergency room situation, applying first aid including CPR. The recovery and rehabilitation was led by Occupational Therapists around the realities of life after trauma related injuries. The day ended with Jack Annear, a past 2006 scholar bravely sharing his journey of recovery from his life threatening injuries after being involved in a traumatic car accident in 2007.

The aim of the program was to give young people the skills to recognise potential injury-producing situations and make better choices to minimise their risk of being involved in a trauma situation.

To conclude the Stage 1 Integrated learning – Substance Misuse course the Year 10 students will present to families' information they have learnt from the course.
