Lent and our Ecology - Lives change when we think globally and act locally

Students are being encouraged in class to develop a communal action during the Lenten season to bring about change in our world. Fundraising throughout the six weeks of Lent will contribute to Caritas Australia's Project Compassion Campaign. Once again, this Lent, Caritas Australia calls us to support Project Compassion under the theme of Global Community – Go Further Together. We're at a time of increasing global change and tense dialogue, so the idea of the 'common good' is more important than ever.

Supporting Project Compassion is a way we can proclaim the faith that is in our hearts and help our brothers and sisters in need. During Lent, we are invited to take up the call to fast, pray and give alms - in solidarity as a global community.

During this time of Lent we also express a commitment "to give up something" and forgo one, or some, of our usual pleasures as a commitment to personal discipline and renewal. This also leads one's thoughts to the question: "How could we give up some behaviours that are undermining our planet's ecology?'

> At Tenison Woods College, our commitment to care for our planet is inspired by the hope that our young will learn to do the right thing for themselves, their families, our global community, now and for the future. It is important to realise that our commitment to ecological conversion and sustainability also expresses our Catholic identity to stand with the poorest in our society, walking tenderly and living justly for the benefit of our human family. Why do we say this? Because we know that often in situations where our planet is hurting, those affected most by this are the marginalised people, poor and those with least power to effect change. This therefore seems to me to be a wonderful area for further discussion, reflection, and renewed commitment during Lent.

Poplars Inclusive Learning Centre

I am delighted to inform the College community that the Poplars Inclusive Learning Centre in the Gilap Wanga Learning Community was occupied as of Monday this week.

While there is still significant external equipment to be installed, external cladding to be completed, and the adjacent Year 8 and 9 classrooms will still be under construction, the internal areas are fully complete and functional. There is also external fencing that separates the new Poplars area from the rest of the building site to ensure safety and our duty of care for our Poplars children and adolescents.

So, there are many things for which we are grateful at the moment, but still several issues to navigate and bring to a final state, requiring our full presence, attention and care in the new Poplars Inclusive Learning Centre, within the Gilap Wanga Learning Community.

I apologise for the challenges created for Poplars families over the past five months while the new Poplars Centre has been created, and thank you for the cooperation in bringing this exciting new Poplars Centre to a reality.

In a couple of weeks, we will see Year 8 classes take possession of some rooms and gradually classroom allocations will revert to a more appropriate scenario, and then eventually by the end of term we will have a wonderful Gilap Wanga precinct for 300 students.

Sincere thanks to the College community for your patience, persistence and goodwill – it has been greatly appreciated.

Gilap Wanga - A new beginning

A new beginning for Tenison Woods College – it starts in 2021. As of 2021 our major intake of students to the secondary setting, as part of our new Middle School of Tenison Woods College, will be in Year 7. Our Middle School will consist of students in Years 7 to 9. In 2021 we will also have a significant Year 8 intake, for the last time.

Mary MacKillop Memorial School and Saint Anthony's School students are invited to join us at Year 7 in 2021 or wait until Year 8 2022, as determined est by their families.

In 2022 our major intake will be in Year 7, but there will be a place for Mary MacKillop Memorial School students and Saint Anthony's School students if they choose to join us as Year 8 students. Years 7 to 9 at Tenison Woods College will look different, feel different and be different.

The Gilap Wanga Learning Community will be different. It's about your child and their learning pathway. Every child's learning pathway is different. Every child needs to be challenged differently.

You, your child and their teacher will personalise the learning pathway together. There will be a curriculum pattern, but it will be personalised, to ensure rigor, individual excellence and a well-rounded education so that your adolescent shines now and into the future.

With the heightened media discussion and alerts about the spread of the Coronavirus throughout the world, please take time to discuss hygiene precautions with your family members. This is not to scare them but rather to reinforce the need for correct infection control and to instil the idea that prevention is the key to staying healthy. Respiratory infections have the ability to spread easily via the transmission of germs through the air, carried on droplets. If dispersal of these droplets can be prevented then infection transmission can be reduced. Things to remind your children:

- Sneeze, blow nose or cough into a disposable tissue.
- If no tissue is used, sneeze or cough into your upper arm or sleeve, not your hands.
- Turn away from people when coughing or sneezing.
- Wash hands after coughing/sneezing/blowing nose.
- Wash hands before eating.
- If no access to soap and water use hand sanitizer (available in many classrooms and office areas).
- If your child is unwell please keep them home to avoid spreading infection.

Year 10 Construction Class Hard Work Pays Off

The 2019 Year 10 Concept-to-Construction class completed their course last year with great success. They were given instructions to design an outdoor table/seat that could be placed in the school. It needed to be able to last in the weather, be strong enough to seat six people, low maintenance and manufactured within the provided budget.

Once they had finalised their individual designs, students used our 3D-printer to create to-scale models. They then made a decision as a class on what design best suited the brief. The design they went with was powder coated to protect the table from rust. Planks were made from recycled plastic to outlast timber which also requires very little maintenance.

The goal was for the students to collaborate and work effectively in groups to complete three impressive tables which would be placed around the school. The quality of the tables is exceptional, which they are all very proud of. We are currently laser etching a label to be screwed to the tables with the students' names to recognise their success for many years to come.

Counsellor's Corner

How can we prepare children to thrive in a world where it's estimated that over 20 per cent of today's jobs won't exist in just five years' time? How do we prepare them for a work-life of multiple careers and job changes?

South African educator and author Nikki Bush believes that the future will belong to those who develop a broad range of personal capabilities rather than a narrow number of academic abilities. She has outlined five key personal factors that will help kids succeed in the future world of work. These are:

Creativity and innovation Love of learning

In a world where people working into their seventies and beyond will become common place, a degree of qualification obtained in the early twenties won't guarantee continued success. The future will require people to be in charge of their own learning and be willing to continually upskill. Continuous learners rather than those who close themselves off to new ideas and concepts will thrive in the future.

Resilience

Life doesn't unfold in a straight line. It never has, but the future of work will have more twists and curves than ever before. Kids will need to be resilient and flexible enough to cope with rapid workplace change and lack of security, as well as be able to manage risk to earning a living.

Self-knowledge

Personal knowledge of strengths, capabilities and talents has long been a skill that we've neglected to develop in kids. When the future is fluid and work continually changing, self-knowledge will become a passport to happiness and success.

Love of learning

In a world where people working into their seventies and beyond will become common place, a degree of qualification obtained in the early twenties won't guarantee continued success. The future will require people to be in charge of their own learning and be willing to continually upskill. Continuous learners rather than those who close themselves off to new ideas and concepts will thrive in the future.

Teamwork

The ability for your child to work as part of a team both virtually and in the real world will be more important than ever in the future world of work. Even jobs that have an individual skill focus will require people to work cooperatively alongside each other.

Reassuringly, there is a great deal you can do as a parent to prepare your child to capitalise on the changing career and jobs landscape. Use these five personal factors for future success as a starting point as you ponder how to prepare your child to prosper in the age of disruptive change.
