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

### From The Principal

#### Catholic Education Week - Raising Hearts and Minds

Every day, in every Catholic School we help to raise hearts and minds.

Catholic Education in South Australia has been doing that since the very early days of white settlement in the South East of South Australia, when Fr Julian Tenison Woods and Mother Mary MacKillop established the first Parish School in Penola in 1866.



#### 140 Years of Mercy Education

A pilgrimage of Mercy Sisters was due to visit the South East to retrace the steps of those early courageous women in 1880 from their arrival by boat in Beachport, to their journey to Millicent, Mount Gambier and Penola. We had planned a range of commemorative and story telling celebrations, which we look forward to enjoying now in 2021. However, I for your interest share the link to the Mercy Story, here.

Mercy and Marist Charisms in the Fabric of our Region

The Sisters of Mercy began teaching in Mount Gambier in 1880 and moved into the Penola Road Convent in 1908, at that stage called St Joseph's Convent of Our Lady of Mercy. In 1952 the Parish School of St Paul's was merged with St Joseph's to become Mater Christi College, however in 1969 the primary section once more became St Paul's School with secondary education functioning independently as Mater Christi College.

In 1972 Tenison College was formed following the merging of Mater Christi College and Marist Brothers Agricultural College. In the ensuing years since, both St Paul's and Tenison College emerged as significant Catholic educational institutions within the South East of South Australia.

Marcellin Champagnat, the founder of the Marists and Catherine McAuley, founder of the Mercy Order, had similar aims when they established their orders of Religion. They would teach children, but in the Catholic faith. They devoted themselves to the poor, often the rural poor, whose need for a Catholic education had not been met.

The Marist and Mercy charism that reached out to the people of Mount Gambier and outlying districts in those early years of Catholic education continues to thrive today. It is marked by deep faith in Jesus and His mother, Mary and a desire to serve Christ through educating young people. The lay leadership of both schools brought new challenges and successes to the community and will continue to do so as responsibility for 'Church in the World' is devolved to the laity, working closely with the Mount Gambier Parish to support the faith formation of the whole family.

#### Tenison Woods College - A Rich Legacy

The amalgamation of St Paul's Primary School and Tenison College in 2001 formed Tenison Woods College, starting a new chapter in the history of Catholic Education in the Mount Gambier region. Tenison Woods College has a strong commitment to educating all students to achieve their personal best in academic, spiritual, social and sporting achievements. We enjoy a College community of abundance and we pay tribute to all those who have played their part in evolving and intensifying the story of service that is expressed richly through faith, hope and love of our young.

#### Connect@Tenison

Thank you for your commitment to the start of Term 2. Overall students in the community were learning in the following way in Week 1:

### Webinar for Parents - Supporting Young People through Uncertainty - Thursday 7 May 6:30pm-7:30pm

This webinar is tailored for our community to assist families at this challenging time.

During this period, we believe that maintaining a focus on wellbeing and resilience is even more important than ever. The approach of our partners LBI Foundation in these difficult times is to consistently reinforce three major pillars of the IMPACT approach:

- 3. Growth as a mindset.

LBI has heavily invested in online integration and learning management systems and LBI developed resources, tools, videos and methods that draw upon Resilient IMPACT which can support your family through this period. So, don't forget to log in using the link sent via email on Monday.

#### Carpark Care

I remind families of the care required in the carpark area. The speed limit of 15km / hour is designed to assist with maintaining the safety of all community members. Likewise, the smooth running of the 'kiss and drop' area depends on the courtesy of all users to keep the traffic moving. Should children not be at the 'kiss and drop' area ready for pick up, I ask parents to complete another cycle of the area to ensure others can collect their waiting children.

#### Food Allergy Awareness - Awareness, Avoidance and Action

Living with the risk of a severe allergic reaction, or anaphylaxis, takes planning, diligence and clear communication. At Tenison Woods College we believe that our community has a significant role in supporting those who live with the risk, so that through awareness, education and training they and their families can lead normal, healthy lives.

We encourage anyone who suspects they may have an allergy or those who have already been diagnosed to consult their allergist, immunologist, paediatrician or GP for personalised treatment and care. This includes regular follow-up so that they can access up to date information on managing their risk of anaphylaxis, and communicating that information to our staff so that our community can support them in the best possible way.

### Shining In the Classtroom

Term 2 has seen Junior School students continue with their Visual Arts curriculum.

The first art project for students from Reception to Year 2 was to create an animal leaf collage using resources found in nature such as leaves of different shapes, sizes and colours, bark, flowers, petals, sticks, stones, nuts, berries etc.

Students were required to explore their outdoor environments, select and collect a range of these natural objects and then arrange them to form some kind of animal or insect.

This activity helped to draw student attention to the Line, Shape and Colour of objects. These are important elements to consider when constructing artworks. It gave students the opportunity to explore their ideas and use their imagination as well as experiment with different materials.

Like most art projects, this activity also sought to help foster wellbeing and develop the student's connection with the world.

Students took on this challenge with gusto and as you can see, they have produced very creative results.

After extensive amounts of research and development, they decided that the chosen product needed to integrate traditional hands-on skills, design, electronics and emerging technologies; such as laser.

One of our key Design and Technology teachers led the charge with the concept of redesigning a speaker, which needed to better suit the interest of a specific client - themselves! The students worked through a range of tutorials, on our laser design software to finalise their individual designs for client approval.

Over the course of four weeks the students deconstructed an existing speaker, critiqued, redesigned, laser cut, soldered and assembled their own portable Bluetooth speaker. An excellent outcome! Well done to the students for the outstanding final designs!
