# From the Assistant Principal Student and Staff Development

#### **Drop Off and Pick Up Safety**

The safety of our students and broader College community is of the utmost importance to us, particularly during pick up and drop off times. We ask that parents and carers utilise our drop off and pick up location points situated around the College such as the 'kiss and drop ' areas, the Marist Park parking area or Shepherdson Road where students can safely utilise the dedicated, patrolled crossing.

The smooth running of the 'kiss and drop' area depends on the courtesy of all users to keep the traffic moving. Should children not be at the 'kiss and drop' area ready for pick up, drivers are kindly asked to complete another circle of the area to ensure others can collect their waiting children.

If parents are dropping off or picking up their children from White Avenue, which is a 60kmh zone and a high traffic flow area, it is advisable that parents drop off and pick up on the Tenison Woods College side of the road. For safety reasons, please discuss with your children that if they are required to cross White Avenue, they must cross at the island crossing.

As a reminder, the speed limit within the College grounds is 15 km/hour and is designed to assist with ensuring the safety of all community members, particularly those walking or riding to school. Please keep in mind that the one-metre distance between car and bike still applies within the grounds.

## 3D Printing at TWC

We are lucky to have support from leaders at the College to fully integrate 3D printing into our curriculum. We have since made CAD and 3D printing a major focus of every Design and Technology subject. Our Year 5 to 8 students have become competent and confident with 'TinkerCAD' and in Years 9 to 12 students refine these skills using the industry leading Fusion360 program.

We use 3D printing as the 'carrot' to bring the students initial concept to life. It has been a long process to introduce this concept, but within three years we are on track to having every student using CAD and 3D printing in all Design and Technology subjects.

Our recent purchase of two Prusa printers brings us to a total of five 3D printers in the workshop. I don't believe that CAD/ 3D printing will take over the world, but it is a great way to support hands-on workshop learning by aiding in the creation, modification and optimisation of a design. Plus, the students are starting to teach me more about the programs than I thought was actually possible!

## Counsellor's Corner

Grounding has become something essential to fostering a positive wellbeing state.

Grounding is about being in the present, noticing what is happening with you and around you. It is useful for settling ourselves when we are feeling overwhelmed. Grounding can help you to pull away from unwanted emotions, memories and negative or challenging emotions.

Grounding techniques can help distract you from what you're experiencing and refocus yourself to be anchored in the present moment. Grounding also helps to restore balance in your body and mind.

Grounding skills can be divided into two specific approaches - Sensory awareness and Cognitive awareness.

Sensory awareness grounding exercises are about filling your awareness with the sensory experience.

A few examples may be:

- · Breathing deeply;
- · Getting up and moving your body;
- Placing your hands in water;
- Listening to soothing music;
- Keeping your eyes open, looking and noticing details in your surroundings;
- Placing a cool bath cloth on your face or holding something cool such as a can of soda;
- Putting your feet firmly on the ground or even walking on the earth with bare feet;
- Listing and saying aloud things in your environment to do with the sensesfive things you can see, four things you can touch, three things you can hear, two things you can smell and one thing you can taste.

Cognitive awareness grounding can re-orient yourself in place and time by asking yourself some oral of these questions:

A few examples may be:

- Using an anchoring phrase 'My name is....," "I am \_\_ years old". "I live at ....";
- Playing a memory game;
- Reciting something;
- Thinking in categories;
- $\bullet\,$  Using maths e.g. counting backwards from 100.

It can be helpful to have a selection of grounding exercises that you can draw upon at different times. Just like no one technique works for all people, we often find that not all techniques work at all times. There is no "wrong" way to ground yourself.

Whatever method you use, it is important to practice when you are calm so that it becomes easy during times of overwhelm. The main aim is to keep your mind and body connected and working together.
