Tenison Woods College Reunion - A great deal to celebrate, but next year!

I inform the College community that we have regretfully decided to postpone this year's celebration of the 2020 Shining Lights Awards due to the unpredictability of COVID-19. Our 2020 Shining Lights will be acknowledged and celebrated next year on a date yet to be confirmed.

COVID-19 – We all Have a Part to Play

Thank you for demonstrating care for others in our community by a very deliberate approach to our HHDL strategy, asserting good **H**ealth, good **H**ygiene and hand washing, good **D**istancing and care for others, and good **L**earning, regardless of student location.

As you would be aware, the South Australian Government now requires all essential travellers entering the state to have a COVID-19 test every 7 days. This includes students aged 16 years and over. I know our families living in Victoria are already addressing this, as a COVID-19 test result must be provided to an authorised officer (on request) relating to a test undertaken in the previous 7 days. Such families will then continue being tested every 7 days until further notice.

A referral for this test is not required, and a list of South Australian COVID-19 testing sites can be found <u>online</u>. If you are based in Victoria and there are no dedicated testing sites within the 40km zone, the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services recommends contacting your doctor, local health service or local hospital for assistance. More information can be found on the <u>DHHS Testing Information Page</u>, or call 1800 675 398.

You can also call the government's COVID-19 Health Information Line on 1800 020 080. The line operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

This is a difficult time for our local community and I reiterate that we are here to support you and your children. As I indicate often, my most important task as Principal is to keep each child, family and staff member safe, so please be assured of our steadfast support for all families at this time.

Please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher, your Head of School or myself if you have any further questions.

OSHC Renovations

I advise families that renovation works on the OSHC facility will be commencing as of next Monday 17 August.

Below is a summary of the interruptions to our 'normal' operations. We will send out reminders as each date draws closer:

- Entrance to and from OSHC from the 17 August will be through the doors at the southwestern corner of the Gym.
- We will be relocating to the Pam Ronan Centre from the 31 August to the 12 September.
- We will be using the Gym for after school care on the 3 September and 8 September.
- We plan to return after school care to the OSHC room from the 14 September. Before school care will remain in the Pam Ronan Centre.

We hope to resume normal operations from the OSHC facility as of the 28 September. We apologise for any inconvenience in the short term, but we look forward to moving back into the newly renovated OSHC room upon its completion. We are also excited about the learning and care opportunities that the renovations will afford our young.

Gilap Wanga Ring Road Approach

We have commenced using the Gilap Wanga Ring Road and I reiterate a few key points for us all to consider in this area:

- The road will be one way entering from the Moorak Homestead entrance and exiting adjacent to the College greenhouse onto the large roundabout road.
- We ask that merging traffic respect the alternating 'zip merge' approach so that traffic can flow most efficiently.
- I ask that parking on the area occurs from 24 August (Week 6). This is because the turning of wheels in the parking maneuver will tear up the top layer of the hot mix if it is not adequately cured and hardened first.
- We ask that student drop off and pick up does not occur on the Gilap Wanga Ring Road.

Lines will be marked on the ring road and parking area in the Term 3 holidays.

Gilap Wanga Donations for the Native Gardens

I ask families for donations of any redgum or bluegum logs that could feature in the Gilap Wanga native plant garden areas. These logs will act as features in the gardens and possibly also be used as rustic seating. If families could assist us in accessing such logs that could be used as features and seating in the area, they would be warmly received.

Early Learning and Community Centre Expansion and New Reception Building Commences

We are delighted that the expansion of the ELCC and new Reception Building has commenced. The OSHC renovations and new entrance to the Barrie Holmes Stadium will commence subsequently. As such, parents who enter the College site will note some continuing and increased parking challenges. Could I ask that you continue your care in the College driveways and parking areas, and particularly adjacent to the Early Learning and Community Centre.
