## From the Assistant Principal Student and Staff Development

### Evacuations

Our students, staff and visitors participated in a Lockdown Drill today.

As part of our Work Health and Safety regulations, we are required to have Emergency Evacuation drills every term; we have either a Fire Drill or a Lockdown Drill. These drills can occur at random times throughout the day which may include recess or lunch.

Students are educated in what is required for each drill and the reasons behind them, however it would be good to reinforce the idea that these drills are practiced for the safety of all those who are on College grounds. If you are on site when an evacuation occurs, please follow the instructions of a College staff member. Throughout the school, there are Evacuation Procedure posters outlining the process during a drill. Please make yourself familiar with the procedure.

### Summer Uniform

Term 4 is the official time to change to the Summer Uniform for all students. This uniform is outlined in the Student Planner and on our Website. As part of this uniform the wearing of hats is compulsory for all activities outside the classroom, including recess and lunch. Many students have grown over the winter months and I ask the parents/caregivers check the length of girl's dresses as they may need lengthening. The required length for all dresses is knee length.

Given the variances of Mount Gambier weather, if the temperature is below 23 degrees, students are permitted to wear their winter uniform.

For those students in Year 2 who have outgrown their Reception to Year 2 uniform, they are permitted to purchase the Years 3 to 12 Summer Uniform in preparation for their move to Year 3 in 2021.

## Ms Kolhoffer's Term of Dance

Term 3 has seen all Junior School students at the College engage and participate in the Dance Curriculum.

Each year level studied and practised different dance elements such as levels, pathways, locomotor and non-locomotor movements and body bases.

The students also worked on developing balance, moving in unison, repeating movements and creating a canon. A canon is a choreographic movement which is introduced by one dancer and is repeated exactly by subsequent dancers one after the other.

Students have been faced with the challenge of collaborating in groups, developing their own choreography and then applying the various dance elements.

Year 1 students observed traditional Indigenous dances that focused on the movements of animals such as Kangaroos or Emus. In small groups they were required to create choreography that included at least three movements based on the actions of that animal. Year 5 students were challenged to create choreography that included a canon and the use of a prop.

It has been encouraging and very rewarding to see all the students:

- Grow their capacity for flexible thinking;
- Collaborate with others;
- Develop their willingness to accept different ideas;
- Adapt to change;
- Work as part of a team;
- Be inclusive; and
- Problem solve.

## Stage 1 Geography Students Tour Wind Turbine

On Tuesday 8 September, the small but enthusiastic group of Stage 1 Geographers travelled to the Lake Bonney Wind Farm for their unique, COVID-19 safe field trip.

*I was extremely interested in the facts and was fascinated by how far technology has evolved (even in just the last 20 years), given that John was not only able to pause the turbine but change the direction of the blades, all from his own laptop!*

In a first for the long-running trip, John Hutchison (Vestas Service Technician) gained the necessary approval from Denmark to showcase a V90 3MW turbine from the nacelle. He was only a mere 80 metres (or three storeys) up, fully harnessed of course; streaming what he was seeing, via his phone, over the Microsoft Teams platform. The students gathered around my laptop in the Tenison Woods College minibus in an effort to gain an invaluable insight into how the wind is converted into the electrical energy that powers a large proportion of the State's generation needs.

I felt that being on-site whilst John gave us a very personalised tour has enabled each of the students to not only collect some invaluable data for their assignment, but also to deepen their understanding of how this amazing renewable energy source actually works!*
