#### Recognising SACE Board Achievement and Excellence in 2020

I look forward to our Dux Assembly, and welcoming graduates from last year who achieved outstanding SACE Board results.

Due to our current COVID-19 protocols, the ceremony will be held on Thursday 5 February from 9.00am until about 10:15am in the Gilap Wanga Learning Community, and will be for Years 7-12 students and parents.

As a College community we are extremely proud of the results of these students and look forward to acknowledging their success before the Middle and Senior School communities.

### SunSmart Approach

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world, with two in three Australians developing some form of skin cancer before age 70. Melanoma is one of the most commonly diagnosed cancers in Australians aged 15–29. Yet most skin cancers can be prevented by using sun protection measures at appropriate times of the year. The sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation is the major cause of skin cancer. UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is strongly associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Given school hours fall within peak UV periods of the day, we have moved to a comprehensive policy will assist schools to adopt healthy UV practices.

We are pleased to introduce the SunSmart policy this year to our college community. Our SunSmart procedures such as wearing the College hats and sunscreen will be enacted according to the sun protection times forecasted by the Bureau of Meteorology for when the UV levels that are predicted to reach 3 or higher. Students will be notified during daily pastoral care about the need to wear their hat, and sunscreen will be supplied in the classroom. We encourage all students to leave their hats at school.

#### Drop off and pick up

There are 2 drop off and pick up zones in the College for those not wishing to use the car parks. One is off Shepherdson Road and the other off White Avenue. Cars in both of these areas are encouraged to keep moving and not to park, other than for children to get in and out of the car. Drivers are asked to remain in the car. The recently commissioned plastic sheet press has enabled us to make unique recycled sheets which have already been utilised in a variety of applications. We recently saw some technology students create a one-of-a-kind student play table from HDPE (#2) lids and an old computer bench frame, rescued from a landfill tip. This table has been donated to the Early Learning and Community Centre for their efforts in collecting and sorting this plastic and for highlighting the importance of sustainability at such a young age. ### Learning Assistance Program Volunteers Needed

Tenison Woods College continues to offer the Learning Assistance Program (LAP) to our students and we are seeking interested parents and friends of the school to assist as volunteers.

The Learning Assistance Program is a program whereby volunteers, in partnership with teaching staff, work with students on a one-on-one basis, for one hour regular sessions each week.

This significant individual time creates more learning situations where students can experience success, and supports their achievement at school. There are often students in junior primary, who would benefit from individual time with a volunteer.

Students may need support with class or subject work; they may be shy, disruptive, or just need someone to listen to them and show they care. LAP can be a positive factor in breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage. The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor, sharing in the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The support and encouragement that a volunteer can give, fosters the development of a student's self-esteem and confidence.

The success of the program is based on five simple principles.

- Is about relationships;

- Builds confidence and self-esteem;
  Takes a strative approach to learning:
- Takes a creative approach to learning; and
- Promotes parent and community participation in schools.
