The College Dux was awarded to Chloe Mackenzie with an outstanding score of 99.00. The College was also proud to present Academic Excellence Awards to over 150 Year 6-12 students from 2020. These awards were presented to Year 6-12 students who achieved 10 or more semester based 'A' grade passes (Year 6-11) or four or more 'A' grades (Year 12) in their chosen subject areas throughout the school year, demonstrating a strong commitment to their learning. What a wonderful way to kickstart the year!

Usually set in the Barrie Holmes Stadium, this year the College kept COVID-safe and moved the formalities outdoors to the picturesque and calming setting of the Gilap Wanga Learning Community. Mid-ceremony entertainment was provided by the College's very own Saxophone Ensemble, lead by Head of Performing Arts, Penny Mansell. The event concluded with a morning tea, held on the Gilap Wanga board walk.

Lenten Season and Project Compassion - Be More

Next week's Shrove Tuesday pancake fundraising day and Ash Wednesday liturgies mark the start of Lent; the season in which we prepare for Easter. Students are being encouraged in class to develop a communal action during the Lenten season to bring about change in our world. Fundraising throughout the six weeks of Lent will contribute to Caritas Australia's Project Compassion Campaign. Once again, this Lent Caritas Australia calls us to support Project Compassion under the theme of Be More. As Saint Oscar Romero said, "Aspire not to have more, but to be more." Through our generosity and by aspiring to "Be More," we are assisting some of the world's most vulnerable people build better futures for themselves, their families and their communities.

As a school community we are an accredited eSMART Alannah and Madeline Foundation school community where the smart, safe and responsible use of communications technology is the norm.

Junior School Morning Play

Following Junior School Staff reflection on the benefits of play in the morning, suggestions and consultation with the Year 6 Junior School Leaders and Founder Leaders, and consideration by the College Leadership Team, we look forward to implementing before school play in the Junior School. The following approach will be used:

8:20am Tenison Woods College Junior School Staff and Support Staff commence morning duty as per the yard duty roster.

Students arrive at Tenison Woods College from 8:20am. Tenison Woods College Junior School Students may play on the playground.

8:35am The first bell/music sounds. Staff on yard duty begin to support students in the yard to leave play equipment, to get organised for class which includes going to the toilet and washing hands, ready to start the school day with their class teacher.

8:40am The second bell/music sounds and the students are in classrooms ready to commence learning.

We ask parents to note the following to assist with the safety of all community members:

- All year levels play in their allocated playground zone.
- All ball games are to be played in areas allocated for ball games.
- Walkways are to be kept clear.
- Non-school aged siblings are supervised by parents/carers on playgrounds that are suitable and safe for their age.

We will review the approach as we 'live' the experience of morning play, so we look forward to your feedback and suggestions as we proceed this term.

Caring for One Another - Road Safety In and Around Our School

Following on from the theme of helping one another, I remind families of the importance to monitor their speed and adjust it accordingly as they approach the school on Shepherdson Road and White Avenue in the interest of safety for all, but particularly our young. I also remind students to utilise the various designated crossing areas which are monitored by our staff. Crossing the roadways at other areas adds to the danger for our young but also increases the difficulty for drivers in the area.

From the Deputy Principal



Over the past two weeks I have enjoyed moving around the College and visiting a whole range of indoor and outdoor learning areas. Students seem to have settled well and teachers and support staff are offering such a great array of learning experiences. In addition to this I have noticed the positive relationships between our students and their educators, where learning and wellbeing have reciprocal

importance. On Tuesday evening, what I observed, was affirmed by the many parents and students who talked positively about the start to 2021. I look forward to many more of these interactions in coming weeks. As mentioned last week, each week in the newsletter, I will focus on one aspect of daily operations to assist parents with the smooth running of the College. This week let's look at the way the school crossings work.

School Pedestrian Crossings

There are 4 main crossings to assist students to come and go from the College safely.

- The Flashing Light crossing on Shepherdson Road this crossing is manned by Tenison Woods College Staff with 'STOP' signs. Staff will stop all traffic to enable students to cross. They will try to do this when there is a break in the traffic along Shepherdson Road, to enable cars to exit the College driveway easily. The speed limit through this crossing is 25kmh when the lights are flashing.
- 2. The Pedestrian crossing on White Avenue this crossing is unmanned but does offer an island in the centre of the road for safety. All students crossing White Avenue should cross at this place.
- 3. The White Avenue internal crossing (PRC Mall) this crossing is manned by Tenison Woods College Staff with a 'STOP' sign. The purpose of this crossing is for groups of students to cross the driveway and for cars to be stopped at an appropriate place to allow the buses to exit the driveway

safely. Cars do not need to stop unless the STOP sign is upright- the traffic is kept moving as much as possible to avoid a bottleneck of cars.

4. The Shepherdson Road internal crossing (Marist Park) - this crossing is manned by Tenison Woods College staff with a 'STOP' sign. The purpose of this crossing is for groups of parents and students to cross the driveway to/from the Marist Park parking area. Cars do not need to stop unless the STOP sign is upright, as the traffic is kept moving as much as possible to avoid a bottleneck of cars in the Kiss and Drop Area.

We greatly appreciate the cooperation of all drivers to ensure the smooth flow of traffic and the safety of our students both before and after school.

Whole School Mass

The Beginning of Year Whole School Mass will be held at Marist Park tomorrow, Thursday 11 February at 9.00am. All parents and friends are welcome to attend. Please bring a hat and, if able, a chair. All visitors must sign in at the designated COVID check in table upon arrival at Marist Park.

Shrove Tuesday

Next Tuesday 16 February is Shrove Tuesday. There will be pancakes available to purchase for \$1. All money raised will go to Project Compassion which begins its appeal on Wednesday 17 February. Reception to Year 7 classes will visit the Pancake Kitchen during class time. Year 8-12 students will be able to purchase from stalls that will be set up on the lawns near the Home Economics Centre during recess time.

Ash Wednesday

On Wednesday 17 February we will mark the start of the 40 days of the Liturgical season of Lent. All classes will attend liturgies where each person will be marked with ashes on their forehead as a sign of repentance. The ashes are an outward symbol of the inward change we will make during Lent. Ash Wednesday is a time when we stop and assess how we are doing in our walk with God. Lent helps us identify spiritual areas in which we can grow and sinful areas that we need to avoid. To repent, put simply, means to turn away from sin and turn toward God.

Sacramental Preparation Program

This year, we are excited to work with 15 young people from our parish and school communities in preparing to receive the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and their first Holy Communion. A reminder that families involved in the program must attend the first session on Thursday 18 March at either 4.30-5.45pm or 6.45-8.00pm at St Paul's Hall.

Youth Mass

Youth Mass is held on the 3rd Sunday of the month at the 6.00pm Saturday Mass at St Paul's Church, Penola Road. The next Youth Mass will be held on Saturday 20 February. The music and readings at this mass are led by the young people from the College and the Parish. The monthly Youth Mass is followed by a Youth Group dinner and discussion group. Young people in Year 8 and above are encouraged to attend.

Learning Assistance Program Volunteers Needed

Tenison Woods College continues to offer the Learning Assistance Program (LAP) to our students and we are seeking interested parents and friends of the school to assist as volunteers.

The Learning Assistance Program is a program whereby volunteers, in partnership with teaching staff, work with students on a one-on-one basis, for one hour regular sessions each week.

This significant individual time creates more learning situations where students can experience success, and supports their achievement at school. There are often students in junior primary, who would benefit from individual time with a volunteer. Students may need support with class or subject work; they may be shy, disruptive, or just need someone to listen to them and show they care. LAP can be a positive factor in breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage. The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor, sharing in the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The support and encouragement that a volunteer can give, fosters the development of a student's self-esteem and confidence.

The success of the program is based on five simple principles.

- These are that LAP:
- Is always one-to-one;
- Is about relationships,
- Builds confidence and self-esteem;
- Takes a creative approach to learning; and

• Promotes parent and community participation in schools. (This information has been taken from 'Building Bridges With LAP' Coordinators' handbook)


