## NAPLAN 2021 at Tenison Woods College

Tenison Woods College was amongst the first schools in the state to conduct NAPLAN online and will be doing so again in 2021 after a period of practice for both staff and students. Students in Year 3 will still sit the Writing Test in paper form. All schools conducting NAPLAN testing online are required to participate in the Nationally Coordinated Practice Test (NCPT) on Thursday 25 March. The NCPT is an important event that confirms readiness to administer NAPLAN Online at the school, jurisdiction and national levels. The practice test runs for 45 minutes and student performance is not assessed. Please note that not all classes will sit this test.

Students in Year 7 and Year 9 are required to install a NAPLAN Lockdown Browser on their personal laptop before this date. Staff are assisting with this process.

The official NAPLAN "testing window" is Tuesday 11 May – Friday 21 May. Classes will be sitting tests at differing times during this window and a timetable will be sent home at the start of next term. Once you have this timetable please schedule any out of school appointments at other times. Instrumental music lessons will also need to be rescheduled in consultation with that teacher.

## Old Scholar Revisits the College to Reconnect with Fond Memories

The Tenison Woods College community recently welcomed Old Scholar Brian Gray to the College for a visit.

From Coleraine, Brian Gray attended Marist Brothers Agricultural College (now Tenison Woods College) as a boarder in the early 1950's, finishing his Leaving Year (4th Yr.) in 1953. During this time, he distinguished himself as an outstanding sportsman particularly excelling in football.

He was Captain of the First 18 in 1952, 1953 and both years was the winner of the Best and Fairest Player in the Premier South-East Colt's League, captaining Marist Brothers to a Grand Final win in 1953 and being named Best on Ground. He didn't confine himself to football and in 1953, as well as being the best Footballer at the school, he was also the school's Best Cricketer, Senior Tennis Champion (a game he still plays 2 hours every week at 83 years of age) and Senior Athletics' Champion. He was the inaugural House Captain of Lavalla which won the House Competition that year. The Malkin Shield, as it was known then, was won from combining points from Tennis, Athletics, Football, Cricket and Debating. Despite Brian saying he put more effort in to sport than study he also topped Leaving Year Religion.

Being good at sport did not excuse him from any of the duties of a boarder at an agricultural college and he remembers working in the dairy, feeding the pigs and working in the large vegetable garden. At this time his footballing ability was drawing the attention of the SANFL teams but he returned home over the border to Coleraine. At the age of only 17, after playing a pivotal role and winning the 1955 football Grand Final in Coleraine, he was signed up by Collingwood.

This was the start of a distinguished career from 1956 to 1965 playing 111 games for Collingwood. Highlights of his career included regularly appearing in the best players list. In his first year in Melbourne, he played in an exhibition match at The Olympic Games (1956). In 1958 when he was only 20 years old he was part of the Collingwood Grand Final winning team. He has been a runner up and 3rd in Collingwood's' Best and Fairest and represented Victoria in the Victorian Interstate side twice in 1961 and 1962. In 1962 he was equal 6th in the Brownlow Medal count.

Sadly, injury ended his career but not before he achieved life membership of Collingwood by playing 100+ games. He then gave back to the game and had a successful career as a coach winning a flag with Melbourne Under 19s in 1971. He then spent many years helping out local juniors around his Melbourne home in Aspendale.

Still remembered amoungst his peers as a unique sight, Brian turned up to his first training at Collingwood fresh from the country in the only football jumper he owned, his Marist Brothers Agricultural College guernsey. Pale blue with a royal blue sash and Marist Brothers College Emblem.
