### Easter Joy

As we move into the liturgical season of Easter, we wish all families abundant joy. This week students celebrated the joy of Easter in a variety of ways in their classrooms. The season of Easter continues until Pentecost Sunday on 23 May 2021.

Students in the Junior School held special prayer services on Tuesday morning and were treated to Easter Eggs. We would like to thank Tammy Flier, owner of *Unpackaged* in Commercial Street, for kindly donating Easter Eggs that catered for our students with dietary requirements.

### Pray for Timor Leste

Timor Leste are our world's poorest neighbours and a country that we hold close to our hearts here at Tenison Woods College. Our College has been involved in immersions to Timor since 2012 and over that time we have developed some long standing partnerships with local communities. We were unable to visit last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic and again, this year, our students are unable to visit. It is devastating to see that this country, on top of dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic, are grappling with widespread flooding across the country. Over 100 people have lost their lives, majority in the capital Dili, and the Timorese are now at risk of COVID-19 spreading as they break lockdowns to seek safety. We offer our thoughts and prayers to some of our most vulnerable neighbours.

## Creative Arts Spotlight

This term, Stage 1 Creative Arts students focused on their own skill development and were required to create pieces that reflected what they learnt in 8 weeks. Two students, Lara Dodds and Milla Buckingham, demonstrated particularly high standards of work. Both concentrating on skills, specifically in the animation techniques squash and stretch, tweening of movement, walking, and finally keying and green screen removal.

Lara produced four refined pieces involving the creation of original artwork in Adobe Illustrator, photography in front of a green screen, and animation in Adobe After Effects. In her own words "I have chosen animation as it has always intrigued me but scared me with how technical it can be, so I decided to go for the challenge. I intended to get a basic knowledge for the techniques behind animation and the processes of the software chosen. The specific styles of animation I chose were diverse and I felt would get me the best outcome for my goal".

# Year 4 Beach Clean-up Excursion

On Tuesday, Year 4 students joined the Department for Environment and Water to learn about beach pollution and its impact on marine life. They worked enthusiastically and diligently together to clean the beach at Carpenter Rocks, enjoying the opportunity to take practical action following their learning this term about sustainability. Children discovered lots of micro-plastics during the beach clean, which were difficult to remove, and are determined reduce the amount of plastics used and discarded by talking to others about what they found. Did you know that all plastics produced still exist on the earth today? Or that a plastic water bottle takes 450 years to break down? Large pieces of plastics left on the beach break down into micro-plastics, which are washed into the water, and ingested by fish and other marine species. As humans eat fish, these micro-plastics are also eventually ingested by us! The Year 4 classes encourage everyone to think wisely when visiting the beach, to care deeply for this beautiful environment, and to leave only our footprints when we head home from the beach!

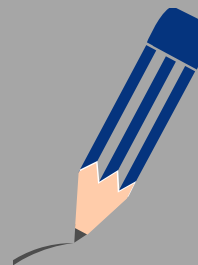

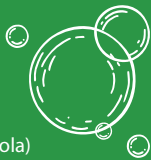
