

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## NAPLAN 2021

Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 will be undertaking the four NAPLAN tests of Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Numeracy in Weeks 3 and 4 this Term, commencing Tuesday 11 May.

Families of students in Years 3 and 5 will have details of testing times sent home via a class newsletter. Years 7 and 9 families will have a broadcast sent with times of the four tests.

Individual music lesson times will need to be negotiated by parents/carers to avoid these test times. We also ask your assistance in not scheduling any other appointments during test times as it is time consuming to organise extra catch up times for absent students.

Demonstration tests are available at the following site <a href="https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site">https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</a> if you are interested in familiarising yourselves with the type of questions asked. Students have already undertaken at least one practice test here at the College.

Students with their own devices should still have a Lock Down Browser installed to use for the testing. If students have new devices they may need to re-install this. It is also really helpful if students in Years 7 and 9 bring their own corded headphones, as all tests have an aural element. We do have some spare headphones if this is not possible.







### Counsellor's Corner

This week we will focus on how parents can teach their children to approach uncomfortable situations with a positve mindset. We invite you to read this insightful excerpt by parent expert Michael Grose:

Watching your child or young person manage their nervous moments can be challenging for parents, but it comes with the territory. How you react to an anxiety-inducing moment can influence the way kids approach uncomfortable situations in the future.

Sadly, avoidance is a well-entrenched pattern of behaviour that holds many kids back from experiencing life as they would like. The comfort zone that many crave to stay in can be like maximum security prison where there's no escape. It's incumbent upon parents to make sure participation rather than avoidance becomes the most likely response even when kids feel nervous and tense.
