# Lighting it up in Metal Technologies

Year 10 Metal Technology students have recently finished their LED sign as part of their major product. During this assessment task students were asked to create a CAD design and a cardboard template of their proposed LED sign to assist them in bending and shaping metal rod using the oxy/acetylene welder and a jig they fabricated specifically for this assessment. Once the metal rod had been shaped to the desired design, students applied a thermo-plastic coating to their metal, to form a protective layer. The last step of this project involved installing a LED strip, acrylic inlay and backing in order to bring the LED sign to life! All students involved did a wonderful job with this task which required a lot of hands-on work using a wide selection of tools and machines in the workshops at the College. I was very pleased to see everybody's skills and understanding improve over the semester – well done to all involved!
