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Vinnies Day

Last Thursday 17 June, Tenison Woods College celebrated is annual Vinnies Day, taking part in an appeal which provides emergency relief to people at risk and experiencing homelessness in our communities. Through the generous support of students, families and staff, the College was able to make a difference to the lives of many this winter.

All students were encouraged to wear casual clothes and donate a gold coin which goes directly to the Winter Appeal. Early Learning children and Junior School students donated brand new beanies, socks, gloves, scarves or an item of canned food, while Middle and Senior School students donated canned food. Founder points were also awarded per food item that was donated. Year 12 students helped with delivering all food items to the Vinnies and Foodbank sites.

Middle School students ran a Vinnies Book Sale in the Library all day, with a total of \$591 raised! Staff were also 'dressed by Vinnies', purchasing items of clothing from our local Vinnies shop to wear on the day, to support this wonderful cause.

The Year 6 Student Leaders presented Jeanette Elliott, President of the Mount Gambier Vinnies Conference, with the many beanies, gloves, socks and scarves that students and staff had generously donated.

Over the course of the day the College raised \$1547.55 from Casual Day donations, 1200 canned goods, approximately 100 boxes of cereal, and hundreds of beanies, gloves, scarves and blankets; a tremendous result!

Well done to all students and staff for making the day such a successful event of fundraising for those in need; we're incredibly proud of our College Community.

From the Principal



Principal's Retreat - Listen to what the spirit is saying

Last week I had the pleasure of attending a Principal Retreat with colleague principals titled 'Listen to what the spirit is saying' in Darwin. The retreat, lead by Christian Brother Damien Price cfc, asked us to leave that which is urgent

and attend to that which is important, moving to a space that our indigenous sisters and brothers call Dadirri, a space of deep listening and quiet still awareness. In that space of 'deep listening to deep' we were asked to reflect on the theology of guest and how that helped us care for those in our community. The theology of 'guest' helped us reflect on the theology of presence, which followed through to reflections on compassion and forgiveness. A highlight of the retreat was celebrating Mass with Bishop Charles Gauci and Emeritus Bishop Eugene Hurley, and hearing about their life of ministry in the Northern Territory.

Miriam Rose Ungunmerr Baumann and Dadirri

During the retreat I was also delighted to spend some time with Miriam Rose Ungunmerr, 2021 Senior Australian Citizen of the Year. Miriam Rose Ungunmerr Baumann first shared 'dadirri,' a word, concept and spiritual practice from the Ngan'gikurunggurr and Ngen'giwumirri languages of the Aboriginal peoples of the Daly River region (Northern Territory, Australia). For Miriam Rose the gift of deep listening is about breathing and breathing deeply. To listen deeply is to connect with no judgment and in a reciprocal relationship; listening to self, community, country, and place. According to Miriam Rose it is a deep inner spirit that we all have to offer, that will blossom and grow not only in ourselves, but across the whole community if it is nurtured.

It was a privilege to hear Miriam Rose's thoughts about dadirri, inner deep listening and quiet still awareness, and its origin, as well as her hopes for the future. I also reflected how I as a Principal can work toward supporting a listening and healing culture in our school as well as local community. We spoke of establishing a strong link between children and adolescents of Daly River with our students at Tenison Woods College, and how we could support her foundation, the Miriam Rose Foundation https://www.miriamrosefoundation.org.au/ Miriam was also very positive about visiting our community, so I look forward to exploring that further as our connection continues into the future.

I also shared with Miriam Rose our partnership with Burrandies in developing our Reconciliation Action Plan, and our work with local Boandik students who created together, with the support of local artists, sporting tops which acknowledge the Boandik journey. I indicated how we are committed to this work and its critical importance in valuing the Boandik identity and contributions of our students. I thanked Miriam Rose because there have been so many wonderful experiences for us which have evolved because of her gift of dadirri, and our subsequent journey of working with Burrandies and our local Boandik community in the spriit of reconciliation.

Vinnie's Day

Mary MacKillop was quoted as stating, *"Never see a need without doing something about it"* and it was wonderful to see this lived out by our College community last Thursday. With over 1200 canned food items and 100 boxes of

cereal, hundreds of gloves/beanies/scarves/socks and over \$1500 from casual day donations going to the Winter Appeal, it was a tremendous effort to support those most in need in our region this winter. Our local Vinnie's Conference will assist in distributing the donations over the next few weeks to the 12-15 families each week that seek help from the Society. Foodbank were also fortunate enough to receive donations from our community. 239kg of food donated by our community was delivered by our Year 12 students, which equates to 477 meals for those in need in our local community.


