Stage 2 Approval by SACCS - Years 1-6 Junior School

I am delighted to advise the College community that, at its June meeting, the South Australian Commission for Catholic Schools approved the Capital Development Application from Tenison Woods College for the construction of a new 2 storey Junior Primary (Years 1-6) building as well as new outdoor nature play learning spaces. Transportables will be relocated in November 2021 once Year 12 classes conclude at the College, and construction will commence in December 2021. Construction of the contemporary building and nature play spaces will continue through 2022, ready for occupation by the twenty four Year 1-6 classes in January 2023.

CESA Community LLL Perception Surveys

By the conclusion of Week 5 of Term 3 all Catholic Schools in South Australia will complete the CESA Living, Learning, Leading Perception Surveys. The surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University and are focused on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework is taking place in schools as perceived by students, family and staff.

The surveys will be deployed to all schools ready for completion by the end of Week 5 in Term 3. Further details about the administration of the surveys are located here. Each survey has been trialled, refined and piloted in a range of CESA school settings and the development team is confident that schools will derive very useful information for planning and improvement.

The four day Aviation Program will run from 15 - 19 Aug 21 at the Edinburgh base in Adelaide. The aim of Aviation Program is to provide aspiring women with an overview of life in the Air Force, particularly in aviation and engineering roles. With a total of 43 flying hours completed (31 with an instructor and 12 solo), Isabella has already gained her passenger carrying endorsement which allows her to take passengers. Isabella's father was her first passenger and she was able to fly him over Mount Gambier (including her home), the Blue Lake, Mount Schank, Port MacDonnell and along the coastline to Nelson before successfully landing at the Mount Gambier Airport. Placements were completed in Mount Gambier, Naracoorte, Penola, Millicent, Adelaide, Queensland and Victoria. Employer feedback during teacher visits and phone calls indicated that students performed well, followed instructions, asked questions and were keen to be involved. Students chose areas such as physiotherapy, teaching, pharmacy, mental health support, a range of trades, hospital, forestry, business, veterinary, real estate, airport services, media, and law. Students will now complete a reflection piece in Term 3 on how work placement may have shaped their views on future career options.
