Community LLL Perception Surveys – Thank you

Thank you for your assistance to help us improve as a school community. The CESA Living, Learning, Leading Perception Surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University and are focused on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework is taking place in schools as perceived by students, family and staff.

Your commitment has ensured that we continue to refine our processes and improve the learning, wellbeing and faith environment for your child or adolescent.

Respect, Dignity and Care in an Online World

The current COVID-19 context has underlined the importance of wellbeing and connection, which has been enhanced by our online opportunities. Such opportunities also underline for me the importance of our College 'village' in caring for the safety of our children, adolescents and emerging adults in environments which can on the one hand offer abundant support, and on the other hand significant risks.

In this space I turn to the work of Susan McLean, one of Australia's foremost authorities in cyber safety, who encourages us to realise that:

- Respect and responsibility are to be used with consistency in the eWorld.
- Sending mixed messages about cyber safety is not life giving to children and confuses them.
- You can't have complacency online.
- Cyberspace is a public space and there is no such thing as private online.
- Nothing can be totally deleted – it always remains there in cyberspace.
- You are never anonymous online - everything can be traced, in that you always leave a digital footprint and your postings and comments can be found years later.

- Passwords are the key to your online security and must never be shared and should be changed every three months.
- Anyone can be anyone online – caution is critical.
- There is no such thing as a safe website or application.

Unfortunately, over 30% of Australian teens report being cyber bullied and Susan identifies "a new mean" through the online medium which is occurring at a younger age. She also critiques the role of popular television shows which do not portray the real consequences to such situations of sexting and risky cyber behaviours. It is also apparent that cyber safety issues often affect the students you least expected.

Susan McLean is clear about the significant dangers in relation to online grooming and encourages us to think of an online friend as actually a stranger, with the associated dangers. She clarifies the nuance of knowing the person as distinct from knowing of the person, encouraging children and adolescents to be choosy in relation to friends.

We understand that all internet enabled devices (iPad, phone, iPod, Xbox) are best placed in a common area of the house and not in the bedroom; or at least turning the internet off when a child is in the bedroom with the device. Susan speaks of the importance of passive supervision in well trafficked areas of the house.

Just as with the opportunities of our globally connected 'real world,' I encourage parents and teachers to embrace the cyberspace, understand the salient issues, acknowledge positives and negatives, as well as be proactive and consistent so that our children and adolescents are afforded the real and actual life-giving safety that we hope.

COVID-19 – HHDL The Way Forward

I thank the whole College community for their continued deliberate, careful and patient approach to the South Australian COVID-19 restrictions over the past week.

We will continue to deliberately and carefully continue with our HHDL Strategy in Term 3, asserting good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others, and good Learning regardless of student location.

As always, the health and wellbeing of students, families and staff remain our priority. If your family are needing to self-isolate please contact your child's teacher and they will ensure that your child's learning will progress through our Connect@Tenison strategy.

A friendly reminder that masks are still mandatory for Year 7-12 students. Therefore, whilst the College does have masks available for students who have not brought their own to school, students are reminded of the importance of bringing their own. Students who repeatedly forget to bring their mask will have a courtesy email sent home to their parent/caregiver.

It is clear to me that as has been shown by recent national events, complacency continues to be our enemy at this time, so I ask that you maintain the high HHDL standards which have been achieved since 2020 and continued into 2021. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

I advise parents and caregivers that interviews are well underway for all 2022 Term 1 Reception Enrolments. If you have a child who is due to start school in 2022 and have not lodged an enrolment form, please contact Tracey Davey on 8725 5455 who will help you organise this.

School Crossing Reminders

I remind parents about the 25kmph speed limit through the School Crossing when the lights are flashing or at any time when children are present.

Crossing monitors are on duty from 8:20am – 8:40am in the morning and from 3:10pm – 3:30pm in the afternoon to cross children safely. If a parent or child pedestrian is stopped there, waiting to cross, even before the crossing monitors have arrived please stop and allow them to cross.

As per legislation, you are also asked not to obstruct the crossing, whilst waiting in a line-up of traffic.

We are looking at measures with the City of Mount Gambier to minimise the congestion in and around our carparks, but I ask for your cooperation, presence and patience during these challenging winter weeks.

Social Justice Sunday

This Sunday 29 August is Social Justice Sunday. The celebration of Social Justice Sunday has a long tradition in the Catholic Church in Australia. Almost every year since 1940, our Bishops have joined together to issue a major social justice statement at this time.

Of course, the Bishops also make statements on matters of social and ecological justice at other times throughout the year too. These are often issued by individual Bishops delegated as spokespersons for particular issues, or by commissions of Bishops. By contrast, the social justice statement issued in time for Social Justice Sunday is approved by and issued in the name of the whole Bishops' conference. It is hoped that these statements will inspire reflection and action throughout the whole year.

The Social Justice Statement 2021-22 is titled Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor. You can download the Statement and accompanying prayer card as well as previous statements on the Australian Catholic Bishop's website.

Season of Creation

The Season of Creation spans five weeks between the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (1 September) and the Feast Day of St. Francis of Assisi (4 October). The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through repenting, repairing, and rejoicing together.

During the Season of Creation, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home. This year, amid crises that continue to shake our world, we are awakened to the urgent need to heal our relationships with creation and each other. During the season this year, we enter a time of restoration and hope, a jubilee for our Earth, that requires radically new ways of living with creation.

The Season of Creation unites the world's 2.2 billion Christians around one shared purpose. With so much injustice all around us, now is the time for Christians everywhere to come together and show the world how to love each other and creation.

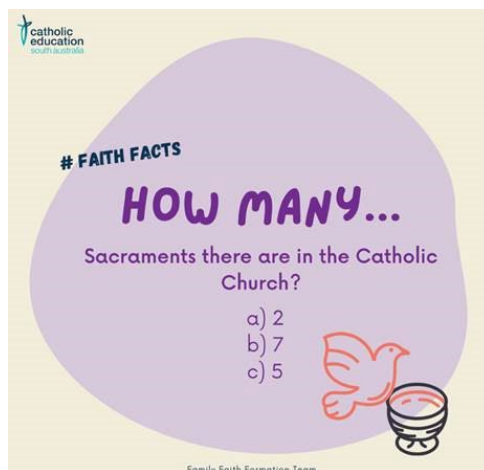

Hi everyone,

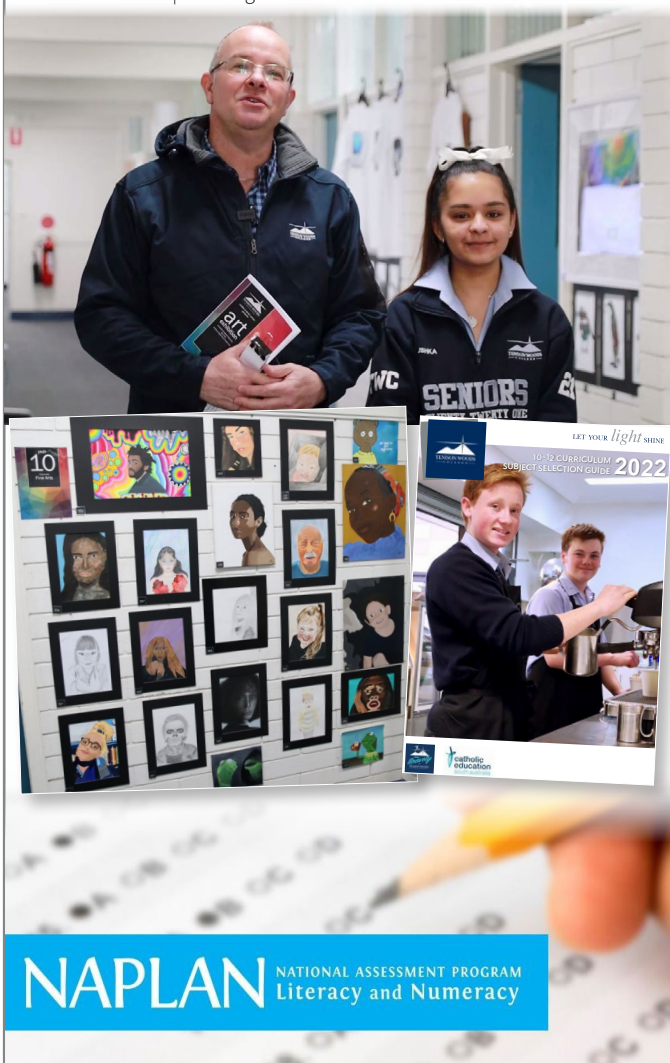
As we head towards the end of Term 3, it is great to get together and reflect on the great learning that has occurred within the last 5 weeks.

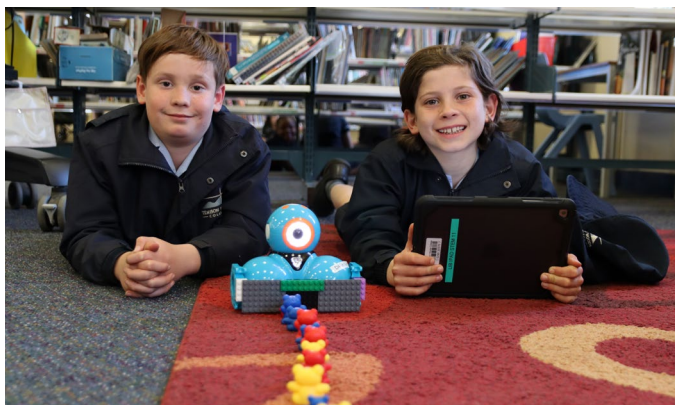
National Science Week

2022 John Benjamin Scholarship

Applications are being called for the John Benjamin Scholarship, on offer to students currently in Year 10 moving into Year 11 at Tenison Woods College in 2022.

John Benjamin was a staff member at Tenison College from 1984 – 1998. He started with the College as a Mathematics teacher in 1984 and took on the position of Deputy Principal in 1994. He held this position until his untimely death in 1998.

Since its inception in 2001, the Tenison Woods College Board has offered this Scholarship to a Year 11 student at the College in memory of John Benjamin. The Scholarship covers half the tuition fees for the student's next two senior years at the College (Years 11 and 12).

The Scholarship is intended for a student who upholds the Catholic ethos of the College and models the virtues of kindness, generosity of spirit with their relationships and has a positive attitude towards their learning and their school community.

Applicants are required to submit a written response to four short answer questions. From these questions, applicants will be short-listed and the finalists will then be required to attend an interview with the selection panel.

If students are interested in applying, they will need to complete an application form (available from the Pam Ronan Centre), signed by both a parent/carer and the student and return to Tanya Thomson in the PRC office by Thursday 2 September.

The criteria that needs to be addressed in the written response will be emailed out to applicants on Monday 6 September. The written task is to be received at the College by 10:00am on Friday 17 September.

Members of the College Board would very much like to see all Year 11 (2022) students apply. Please give this some serious thought as you can only benefit from this opportunity.

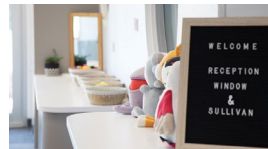
