National Child Protection Week and Safeguarding Sunday

Safeguarding Sunday is on 12 September and was formerly known as Child Protection Sunday. Safeguarding Sunday comes at the end of National Child Protection Week (5 - 11 September). The theme this year for National Child Protection Week is Every child, in every community, needs a fair go. The theme invites us think further and appreciate that to treat all of Australia's children fairly, we need to make sure every family and community has what kids need to thrive and be healthy. Furthermore, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference sees Safeguarding Sunday as a day which seeks to acknowledge the immense damage caused by the sexual abuse of children and adults at risk, including by priests, religious and lay people within Catholic contexts. As such there is a focus on raising awareness of child protection in the context of all types of harm and promoting safeguarding policies and procedures.

Safeguarding Sunday is an opportunity to celebrate children in the life of the parish, recognise that they are valued, respected, heard and parishes encourage opportunities for children to be involved on the day. Children who attend Mass on Safeguarding Sunday will be gifted a notepad with a reading and indigenous artwork acknowledging the importance of cultural diversity.

National eSmart Week

As an eSmart School we commit ourselves to the eSmart Schools Framework, which is auspiced by the Alannah and Madeline Foundation, and which helps us maintain a supportive and connected community to reduce online and offline bullying, and increase wellbeing.

During this National eSmart Week we also explore the themes of Responsible Action; responsible online sharing, peer sharing, reporting and reflecting. By taking responsible action we can all work to keep our young safe online and offline, improving cyber safety and reducing cyber bullying, and bullying more generally.

R U OK? Day 2021

During Child Protection Week we also celebrate R U OK? Day on Thursday 9 September. The message this year is 'Are they really OK? Ask them today.' The message appreciates that life's ups and downs happen to all of us. So chances are someone we know might be struggling, and our genuine support can make a difference whatever they are facing, big or small. R U OK? Day encourages not to wait until someone is visibly distressed or in crisis. Rather we are urged to make a moment meaningful and ask them how they're really going.



While we will encourage students and staff to wear a touch of yellow, and there will be some items to purchase, we are stressing to the school community that the day isn't substantially about yellow ribbon and cupcakes. Rather the day comes from our Catholic Christian educational and values perspective of deep care for people. By embracing the R U 'really' OK? Day message for our College community, we commit to caring extraordinarily for every member of our community every day of the year.

COVID-19 - HHDL The Way Forward

I thank the whole College community for their continued deliberate, careful and patient approach to the South Australian COVID-19 restrictions over the past week.

We will continue to deliberately and carefully continue with our HHDL Strategy, asserting good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others, and good Learning regardless of student location.

CIM Team News

Staff Reflection Day Last Friday 3 September, Tenison Woods College staff participated in our annual Staff Reflection Day, offering an opportunity to engage with the latest Social

Justice Statement *Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor.* It also allowed staff to engage with their Head, Heart and Hands as they served our community and provided flexibility in how staff structured their day for their own personal faith formation. Staff explored their knowledge, understanding and practices about the Catholic faith tradition and the Catholic Identity and Mission of the College.

Staff started the day with prayer. Examples of different forms of prayer that were explored was the use of Catholic prayers online, attending a Liturgy at the College, attending an online Liturgy, listening to worship music or spending time meditating and praying in nature. The next part of the day was spent exploring, engaging and learning about aspects connected to our Catholic faith tradition through our Heads. Staff watched famous Catholic movies, engaged with the new Crossways curriculum, read Scriptures from the Bible, engaged with the Social Justice Statement and listened to podcasts. This was followed by activities to enact our faith through our Hearts and Hands, bringing alive the mission of the Catholic Church to listen to the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. In these sessions, there were lots of group and individual activities. Staff made prayer cards, visited nursing homes, prepared meals for the Sunset Community Kitchen, beautified the Tenison Woods College grounds, and collected items for families in need, just to name a few.

The day was varied and engaging and it was inspiring to learn about the depth of engagement from staff from across a range of activities throughout the day. The day concluded with Mass at St Paul's, gathering together to celebrate the Eucharist and to give thanks for God's creation that we are called to care for. **Sacrament Celebrations**

Last Saturday, the children preparing to celebrate the Sacraments gathered for a Family Retreat Day after participating in the Family Mass. The children worked with the Parish Rosary Group to make a Rosary that will be blessed and given to them on Sunday. They also had a tour of the Sacristy with two Altar Servers and practised for the Sacraments of Eucharist and Confirmation. Students prayed together and reinforced their knowledge and understanding of the Sacraments and the Church through an online quiz.

We ask you to keep these children and their families in your prayers as they prepare for a significant weekend.


This webinar is designed for parents and carers of young people aged 8-13.

This week we will focus on Micro Habits to parent better and help the parent/ child relationship. We invite you to read this insightful excerpt by parent expert Michael Grose:


