Ready, set... for a very significant term

I look forward to Term 4 with all its rites of passage and the 'final quarter' effort that will ensure a wonderful conclusion to the 2021 academic year. In addition to all the finishing touches there will also be significant transition experiences to

ensure our students make the best possible start to 2022.

Portable relocation and building starts in Term 4

And just to make the term interesting, Year 1, 2 and 5 transportables (10 in total) will be relocated in November 2021 once Year 12 classes conclude at the College. Friday 12 November (Week 5) will be FSD – Furniture Shifting Day, when effected classes will relocate. During Week 6 veranda removal and preparation for the portable relocation will occur. From Monday 22 November (Week 7) six portables will be relocated and four will be removed from the school site. The construction site will be created in Week 8 and construction will commence from December 2021. Construction of the contemporary building and nature play spaces will continue through 2022, ready for occupation by the twenty-four 1-6 classes in January 2023. It's starting to get very exciting!

COVID-19 - HHDL and Face Masks

I thank the whole College community for their continued deliberate, careful and patient approach to the South Australian COVID-19 restrictions.

Could families ensure that Year 7-12 students arrive at school with a mask for the first day of Term on Monday 11 October. These masks are to be worn on public transport, school bus runs, and at school. Staff will ensure Middle and Senior School students are wearing a mask in enclosed spaces such as classrooms, tutorial rooms, offices and corridors.

We will continue to deliberately and carefully continue with our HHDL Strategy, asserting good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others, and good Learning regardless of student location.

Uniform Reminder – Extreme Hair

I remind families of the College policy in relation to uniform, and particularly students' hair. The policy indicates:

"Hair is to be clean and brushed or combed to maintain a neat and tidy appearance. Hair is also to be of a singular natural colour. All student hair, male and female, is to be tied up and secured neatly if at a length that can be pulled back. Students are not to have dreadlocks, rat's tails or other extreme styles and is a student's hard is charachie is to be a minimum number two sut?"

if a student's head is shaved, it is to be a minimum number two cut."

I further clarify that in a practical sense the College Leadership determine that hair which touches the collar of either the school shirt or school dress, would normally be tied up. This satisfies our duty of care, hygiene and Work Health and Safety obligations.

I further clarify for students and parents, the following haircuts are deemed as extreme: mullets of inappropriate length, rats tails, dreadlocks, mohawks, extreme uneven grades, extreme undercuts, and patterns or designs shaved into the hair.

I thank families in anticipation for your support in this matter. As I have often indicated, attention to the detail of clear and safe boundaries ensures that the larger issues do not eventuate in a school community.

Fr Julian Tenison Woods

Last Thursday, October 7, was the anniversary of the death of Fr Julian Tenison Woods. Fr Julian was a man of many talents: an environmentalist, scientist, priest, explorer,

Plenary Council

In October 2020 a historic gathering was due to take place in Adelaide; a Plenary Council. This Plenary Council presents an important opportunity for Catholic school communities to be involved in the shaping of the Australian Church. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, this was postponed until October 2021. With the lockdowns occurring along the eastern seaboard, the First Assembly of this historic gathering was moved to an online format in the second week of the school holidays.

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country, and the last one was held 80 years ago over Australia in 1937. It is being held *"in order to give the Catholic community in Australia time to listen, dialogue and discern with one another and, guided by the Holy Spirit, discuss the future, the role and relevance of the Catholic Church in Australia".* Staff and students at Tenison Woods College were provided with opportunities in 2019 to provide feedback to be considered by the Bishops.

Pope Francis has invited us all to become a "synodal" Church – a Church of faith-filled people who speak boldly and with passion, and who listen deeply with an open and humble heart. To do this, the voice of every person matters – whether currently involved in the Church or not. 16 questions formed the basis of the agenda of the small group discussions held throughout the week and proposals and requests for further investigation and research to create a more missionary, Christ-centred Church in Australia were put forward. Issues such as ecological conversion, personal and communal conversion, learning from the early Church, opening dialogue with those who feel excluded from the Church, listening to the voices of First Nations people, and the understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Christ were discussed throughout the week.

Carers SA Young Carers

Carers SA supports Young Carers, people up to 26 years of age, who find themselves caring for someone who has an illness, a disability, a mental health issue, are frail aged or who has an alcohol or other drug problem. The person(s) receiving care may be a parent, partner, sibling, their own child, relative or friend.

Carers SA estimates there could be 30,500 young carers aged 25 years and under. Many of these are hidden carers.

Many young carers emphasise that caring is a positive experience. However, research clearly indicates that, when inadequately supported, young carer's health, mental health and wellbeing can be seriously affected. This, in turn, can influence schooling, socialising with friends and future careers.

The Young Carer worker may be able to support these young people further by linking them with FREE services such as:

- Counselling: Young Carers can access six sessions of counselling with a qualified youth counsellor.
- Carer Directed packages to help fund supports like cleaning and food preparation services, ensuring Young Carers can spend some time engaging in fun, meaningful activities to give them a break.
- Carer Directed Packages that provide financial support to keep Young Carers engaged in their education (for example financial contributions to textbooks or tutoring).
- Assisting Young Carers to access financial scholarship programs to help with the ongoing costs of education resources www.youngcarersnetwork.com.au
- Outreach Case-management for 3- 6 months, supporting Young Carers to work on their goals while building wellbeing and resilience in their caring roles.
- Peer Support Programs which provide group activities for Young Carers, allowing them an opportunity to connect with each other and have fun on a regular basis. This could be pizza nights, trips to the beach or cinema. We will look at creating activities based on the feedback and needs of the Young Carers involved in the program.
- Information sessions for school students and/or staff members to raise awareness of Young Carers in the community and the supports available for them, including the Carer Gateway and Young Carer Programs.

The Young Carer Bursary Program supports young carers to continue with their education. Young carers may be caring for parents, siblings, or grandparents that have an illness or disability. The program offers 1000 bursaries of \$3000 each year. Young carers aged 12-25 across Australia can apply now until 30th September.

The money can be put towards electronic equipment such as a laptop, school fees, uniforms, school camps, transport, and a range of other options. These items and expenses are often what young carers will go without when they are in a caring role. Please note that the application is not income tested.
