Friday's Staff Communities of Practice Conference, CoP21, was a wonderful success and very important for our College community. It was a celebration of communal and collaborative endeavour conducted in 2021 by teachers and co-educators in the learning environments of our school.

At this time of the Catholic Education South Australia (CESA) Living, Learning, Leading Framework, CoP21 was a commitment to continue reflecting on our craft as Catholic educators, who aspire to enable each and every learner at Tenison Woods College to shine, with all the deep reflection, critique, collaboration, humility, professional frailty and wonderful communal success that such whole staff endeavour brings.

I trust that the benefits of such endeavour will be richly seen in the creative, challenging and life-giving experiences of our students.

#### Portable relocation and building starts in Term 4 ...

Term 4 will be full of learning, events and rites of passage. And just to make the term interesting, Year 1, 2 and 5 transportables (10 in total) will be relocated in November 2021.

Friday 12 November (Week 5) will be FSD – Furniture Shifting Day, when effected classes will relocate. During Week 6 verandah removal and preparation for the portable relocation will occur. From Monday 22 November (Week 7) six portables will be relocated and four will be removed from the school site.

The construction site will be created in Week 8 and construction will commence on the new Year 1-6 building from December 2021. Construction of the contemporary building and nature play spaces will continue through 2022, ready for occupation by the twenty-four 1-6 classes in January 2023. It's starting to get very exciting! #### COVID-19 – HHDL and Face Masks

I thank the whole College community for their continued deliberate, careful and patient approach to the South Australian COVID-19 restrictions. I inform you that we have been notified of changes in relation to mask wearing in schools (not beyond schools) in South Australia.

From Monday 25 October, the wearing of face masks will be optional for all students and staff in schools, preschools and children's centres.

It may be necessary to make masks mandatory again in the future if conditions require. Therefore, please keep your supply ready to use.

We will continue to deliberately and carefully continue with our HHDL Strategy, asserting good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others, and good Learning regardless of student location.

As always, the health and wellbeing of students, families and staff remain our priority. If your family needs to self-isolate please contact your child's teacher and they will ensure that your child's learning will progress through our Connect@Tenison strategy.

### COVID-19 Immunisation Clinic & Community Days

SA Health are organising for a COVID-19 vaccination team to visit Tenison Woods College and offer free vaccinations to students aged 12 and above.



Parent consent packs have been issued to families of Middle and Senior School students this week for your voluntary consent to the vaccinations.

The Clinics will be conducted in the following vein:

- 1st visit will be from Wednesday 3 November through to Saturday 6 November 9:00am to 4:00pm.
- 2nd visit will be from Wednesday 24 November through to Saturday 27 November 9:00am to 4:00pm.

Vaccinations will be for Students and Staff only on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays (Staff 3:00pm to 4:00pm each day) and the Saturdays will be promoted as a Community Day, being open to the broader public on a walk-in basis.

The immunisation program will be conducted by Health Care Australia, who will be sending a team of 5 to us for the 4-day clinics: 2 immunisers, 1 first aider, 2 clerks/record keepers. Vaccinations will be conducted from 9:00am to 4:00pm.

### Year 11 Biology Excursion to Piccaninnie Ponds

Last week the Year 11 Biology classes visited Piccaninnie Ponds Conservation Park to learn more about the area's ecology. The excursion coincided with 'Water Week' and helped students to connect their classwork with a real-world context.

Students learned about the rehabilitation of the wetland and restoration of water levels that has enabled wildlife to flourish from Damien Bickley and Vanessa Freebairn from the Limestone Coast Landscape Board. Macroinvertebrates were examined and their importance as an indicator of water quality was discussed. Students also heard from Maureen Christie, from Friends of Shorebirds South East (FoSSE), who introduced them to the shorebirds of the district, some of which fly here from Siberia each year. They also learned about the impact of microplastics on sea and birdlife. It was inspirational to meet such dedicated people.

The Friends of Shorebirds South East are currently looking for volunteers to survey the local hooded plover populations. If you are interested in helping out, you will find a link on the Limestone Coast Landscape Board Facebook page.
