## From the Principal



#### Whole College back together again

I was thrilled to see the Tenison Woods College Community back together on site on Monday 14 February. It was a delight to see the enthusiasm of students to be back at school and several staff indicated that it felt so good to have

children and adolescents in front of them in classes.

I hope new families and new students will now get a strong sense of what it means to be part of the Tenison Woods College family, with all the supportive relationships that make us who we are.

I look forward to us developing a deep appreciation of how we can "Be the One" and look with renewed commitment at how we can be present with commitment and conviction to our family, school, local and global community.

#### **Our College Game Plan**

#### COVID-19 and HHDL

As the community would know we have had several staff members, and some students test positive to COVID-19 so far this year, and we have followed the SA Health and CESA protocols of:

- The COVID-19 positive person student is offsite, recovering and isolating for the required 10 days.
- Staff classroom contacts were notified immediately.
- Letters have been sent to the parents of the student classroom contacts and staff classroom contacts – clarifying the process going forward.

Parents are asked to monitor and test student classroom contacts as they deem necessary if symptoms develop. Staff have commenced the RAT "test to stay" approach.

We continue to accentuate HHDL (Health, Hygiene, Distance, Learning) as our approach to keeping the community safe, accentuating particularly

- the wearing of masks;
- natural ventilation;
- minimising movement and visitors within the school; and
- maintaining sub-school delineation as much as possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community.

To this end we ask that parents try to minimise their entry to the College as much as their child's wellbeing (not the parent's) will allow.

#### Masks on Buses

We reiterate to families the expectation that Year 7-12 students wear protective masks on buses. Younger children are encouraged to wear masks to offer optimum protection in the confined bus space.

#### Caring for One Another - Road Safety in and Around Our School

Following on from the theme of helping one another, I remind families of the importance to monitor their speed and adjust it accordingly as they approach the school on Shepherdson Road and White Avenue in the interest of safety for all, but particularly our young. I also remind students to utilise the various designated crossing areas which are monitored by our staff. Crossing the roadways at other areas adds to the danger for our young but also increases the difficulty for drivers in the area.

#### NDIS Local Area Coordination Family Information Sessions
