COVID-19 and HHDL - Settings for Week 5-8

I would like to thank the school community for all the collaborative effort in mitigating against COVID-19. I am delighted with the staff teamwork, student cooperation and parent support.

So far this term we have had 112 cases of COVID-19 reported to us and requiring student and staff isolation. That has also necessitated several staff deliberately monitoring their health through the RAT 'testing to stay' approach. We have notified classes of cases and ceased notifications in relation to

individual cases in a class where there already exists a case. We have and will continue to notify classes where a significant sudden increase is reported in a class, so that parents have a good sense of the trends within the classes that students attend.

In the event of your child testing positive to Covid-19, or being deemed a close contact outside of an educational setting, please phone the Front Office and give details of the date the test was taken or the date the contact occurred. From this information, the dates your child will be away from school can be accurately calculated and recorded.

Please note that isolation is for 10 full days with the day of the test being calculated as Day 0. This effectively means that the student returns to school on, or after Day 11. With 7 or 14 day isolation for Close Contacts the day of return is Day 8 or Day 15 (as per advice from SA Health).

We continue to accentuate HHDL (Health, Hygiene, Distance, Learning) as our approach to keeping the community safe, accentuating particularly

- The wearing of masks
- Natural ventilationMinimising movement and visitors within the school
- Maintaining Sub school delineation as much as is possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community

To this end we ask that parents try to minimise their entry to the College as much as their child's wellbeing (not the parent's) will allow.

Masks on Buses

We reiterate to families the expectation that Year 7-12 students wear protective masks on buses. Younger children are encouraged to wear masks to offer optimum protection in the confined bus space.

Nude Food and Minimising Bins Within the School

Buoyed by the Junior School's successful Nude Food initiative and the reduced waste within the school, we are continually looking to reduce the large dumpsters across the school. We will replace these large dumpsters with smaller bins and work toward a situation where we have a refined approach to external bins for:

- General waste
- Bottles and containers
- Mixed recyclables such as paper, cardboard etc
- Green waste

There are a range of issues for us as a school to address, and then some issues for us to discuss with the City of Mount Gambier Council so that there is greater integrity in our recycling processes as a school and as a community. The Grounds Team and Cleaning Team are committed to assisting the College in realising this ambition if all of the community is on board and works together in a collaborative way.

This issue is one of the major life learnings of our time for our young, and I am committed to ensuring that we act with integrity as a school community and teach our children, through our actions, about the care for our planet. Anything you can do and advise as a family in relation to refining our processes will be gratefully received. I trust that with deliberate, creative and collaborative endeavour we can take this very ordinary issue of waste and achieve extraordinary outcomes for our school and global community.



Caring for One Another – Road Safety in PRC Carpark and Marist Park Area I remind the community that the carpark adjacent to the Pam Ronan Centre is a senior student carpark and not a kiss and drop zone. The kiss and drop zones



are on the driveways running alongside the PRC off White Avenue and in front of the Front Office area off Shepherdson Road. Adherence to this approach will protect the safety of our young and avoid any unfortunate accidents.

I also remind families of the importance to monitor their actions in the Marist Park area, which can be quite hazardous given the terrain and the less organised parking approach given the nature of the property. Please keep an eye out for one another as we enter and leave Marist Park.

There has been lots happening in the Catholic Identity and Mission space so far this term as we start the Lenten season. Tuesday 1 March was Shrove Tuesday, also known as Pancake day. This is where students could purchase a pancake with the money to be donated to Project Compassion, assisting those in need. Traditionally Shrove Tuesday was a feast day to use up luxury items like sugar, milk and eggs, in preparation for the 40 days of fasting for Lent.

This was followed by Ash Wednesday on March 2, where we marked the start of Lent with a Whole School Liturgy. Unfortunately, COVID restrictions prevented us from having large groups of people in the chapel and it was delivered via Teams to all the classes. A big thank you to Deacon Olek, Mrs Shanahan and all staff involved in the organisation of the Ash Wednesday service.

Pope Francis also announced March 2 as the World Day of Prayer and Fasting for Peace in Ukraine. To mark this day, we invited the school community to tie yellow and blue ribbons on the trees in the mall whilst praying for the Ukrainian people.

Project Compassion is an initiative led by Caritas each year throughout Lent to raise money for some of the world's most vulnerable people. This year the theme for Project Compassion is 'For All Future Generations' which reminds us that the good that we do today will extend and impact the lives of all generations to come. All donations are greatly appreciated and will have a significant impact on people living in poverty now and for all future generations.

On March 10, the College will celebrate our first Whole School Mass of the year, which will be held at Marist Park. This will be our new parish priest Fr Peter's first mass with our community. Volunteers Needed!

Tenison Woods College continues to offer the Learning Assistance Program (LAP) to our students and we are seeking interested parents and friends of the school to assist as volunteers.

The Learning Assistance Program is a program whereby volunteers, in partnership with teaching staff, work with students on a one-on-one basis, for one 40mins sessions each week. There are often students in junior primary, who would benefit from individual time with a volunteer. Students may need support with class or subject work; they may be shy, lack confidence or just need someone to listen to them and show they care. LAP can be a positive factor in breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage. The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor, sharing in the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The support and encouragement that a volunteer can give, fosters the development of a student's self-esteem and confidence.

The success of the program is based on five simple principles. These are that LAP:

- Is always one-to-one;
- Is about relationships;
- Builds confidence and self-esteem;
- Takes a creative approach to learning; and
- Promotes parent and community participation in schools.


