Being the One During Holy Week – A Celebration of Life and Love

Last weekend we celebrated Palm Sunday, the Passion of the Lord and the beginning of Holy Week.

The Easter Triduum (a period of three days' observance, specifically Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. We remember the night before his suffering and death when Jesus gathered to celebrate the Passover Meal with his apostles.

The Stations of the Cross on Good Friday morning are celebrated in our churches across the region and in the afternoon we celebrate the Lord's Passion in both St Paul's and St Alphonsus' churches. We are reminded that Good Friday is a day of both abstinence (refraining from eating meat) and fasting (eating less food).

There is no Mass on Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil in the afternoon. At our Masses on Easter Sunday, we renew our Baptisms and are blessed with the Easter water before receiving Holy Communion.

These celebrations of Holy Week help us acknowledge our own share in sin and seek the forgiveness and healing of Jesus. In the words of Pope Francis we are called to "a renewed personal encounter with Christ. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ, joy is constantly born anew."

Being the One at Easter

In the vein of Being the One, our theme this year as a College community, there is no better example than the Easter story.

Our Catholic faith affirms the way Jesus 'became the one.' The eternal Son of God became a baby, became a carpenter, and the people who knew him growing up could not accept that the divine could live in such a person.

And then He did all that he did so that others may 'be the ones' to accept the invitation of our God. Jesus takes ordinary people; fishermen and tax collectors and tradesmen, and gives them authority over evil spirits. They are able to preach, drive out demons, and heal many sick people. Part of what Jesus came to do is to invite us to an appreciation of a reality beyond what we know in this world. Not that they became divine, but that He shared His authority with them, working through them to do more than they could do in their own power.

In the same way, God lives in us by His Holy Spirit. He helps us in our ordinary lives do greater things by being the ones to accept God's love and invitation to a relationship with our God. Father Peter reflects on how we might be present to this invitation during Holy Week, in his Parish Bulletin reflection, and I invite you to consider his provocations to us all. In all our Easter Masses we are invited to renew our Baptismal Promises. Here we symbolically die with Christ so as to rise with him to new life. At this time, we consciously and deliberately renew our commitment to Christ and his way of life as we renew our Baptisms.

I remind the College community that we are in the season of Lent right up until Easter Sunday (April 17) and as such we do not give out Easter Eggs prior to this time. From Easter Sunday we are in the season of Easter for 50 days which gives us more than enough time to hand out Easter Eggs and celebrate the joy of Easter.

End of Term Gratitude

This final newsletter for Term one provides an opportunity to reflect on the journey and give thanks for the many good things that have happened throughout the term. I congratulate students on their commitment to school life, which has been evident in application to learning experiences, school events and class activities.

I have seen many examples of staff, students and parents prepared to 'Be the One' and in doing that commencing to realise, or be present, to their own talents and then indeed the talents of our community. Such journey starts small, but with confidence and support of those around us I am confident that we will see our commitment to 'Be the One' to serve others make a significant communal impact on those around us in a variety of ways.

Such impact has been expressed significantly through student, staff and parent efforts in relation to Caritas Australia's Project Compassion Campaign.

The school's commitment to fundraising has been one rich expression of our community's desire to assist those in need now and For All Future Generations.

The groundwork established in Term 1 will provide a very good foundation for students to build upon in Term 2. I trust students will find time this week to thank staff members for their work and parents for their support throughout the term.

As we move into Week 11, I am delighted with our success in minimising the risk of COVID-19 in our College community.

Similar to Week 9, last week (Week 10) we noted 57 cases spread across several classes within the school, with most cases in Years 5, 7 and 9. Six staff also contracted COVID-19 during the past week. I thank students, families, and staff for adhering so well so well to the HHDL strategy and arresting the trajectory of cases from our early peak last month.

We continue to accentuate HHDL (Health, Hygiene, Distance, Learning) as our approach to keeping the community safe, accentuating particularly

- The wearing of masks
- Natural ventilation
- Minimising movement and visitors within the school

• Maintaining Sub-school delineation as much as is possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community

To this end we ask that parents try to minimise their entry to the College as much as their child's wellbeing (not the parent's) will allow.

We wait on government advice in relation to the wearing of masks at school in term 2.

Year 12's and their Reception buddies took to the oval to fly kites together! It was a great way for them to form deeper connections with each other!














