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# Catholic Education Awards Ceremony



I am delighted to inform you that our very own Project Recology and SEED Framework was awarded one of the 12 inaugural Catholic Education SA Awards as an Innovative Program.

I am also delighted to share with you the 12 outstanding recipients of the inaugural Catholic Education Awards for 2022. The Awards were presented on Thursday 12 May at Sacred Heart College in the presence of recipients' friends, families and school supporters. Special guest presenters included the Hon Blair Boyer MP, Minister for Education, Training and Skills; Ms Sally Egan, Deputy Director NCEC; and Professor Denis Ralph, Chair of the Commission. I was joined at the Awards by Louise Stanley and her parents, Michelle and Nathan, Colby and Chris Ind, Tom Linnell and Neal Turley, who all represented the College. Louise and Colby received the award and offered an acceptance speech on behalf of the College.

As part of our deep long-term commitment to sustainability we have established a Sustainability and Ecological Environment Education Development (SEED) Framework. The purpose of this is to integrate sustainability and ecological conversion to ensure a sustainable future and address our environmental footprint.

We are on track for achieving zero waste by 2025 and zero reliance on the energy grid by 2030 through student led initiatives. Our Project Recology Centre is the vehicle for an innovative Electro-technology program involving student supported solar installations, installation of a 100kg anaerobic bio-digester to capture and process our streamed organic waste through student managed micro-enterprise and implementation of a "Precious Plastics" program, where students repurpose the College's plastic waste into bespoke usable items.

We partner with local, national and international organisations and hope to share the SEED Framework with other school communities in implementing sustainability into their curriculum, culture and community.

I say thank you to the community – it is a credit to all our students, staff and parents who know that a commitment to ecological conversion and sustainability, and ultimately caring for the planet is an expression of our Catholic identity; to stand with the property walking tenderly and living justly for the benefit of our

#### Attendance - The First Step - Duty of Care

The way Tenison Woods College cares for each learner commences with its diligence in relation to school attendance. That is not only because each child or adolescent matters unequivocally, but also because the College has a significant legal obligation to accurately record student attendance. As such our collaborative approach with carers and parents in relation to this issue is foundational to our partnership.

#### As such:

If a student is absent, parents/carers are asked to either,

- (1) call the absentee phone line 8724 4659 and leave a message
- (2) send a text message to 0429 134 568 or
- (3) provide an email to their Pastoral Care teacher stating the child's name, their homegroup, and the reason they are away for the day.
- Students must sign in at the school office using the Kiosk (R-6 at the Front
  Office, 7-9 Middle School Student Office & 10-12 at the Pam Ronan Centre) if
  they arrive at school after 8.45am.
- If a student needs to leave early, parent communication to the College is required to confirm arrangements, prior to signing out at the Kiosk.
- If a student is to be absent from school for a one-week period or more, a
  pre-arranged exemption form is to be completed and forwarded to the
  Principal for approval.
- An SMS will be sent (0429 134 568) if a parental call has not been made, to confirm absence and also to provide an opportunity to confirm a reason for a student's absence.

#### **HHDL Four Point Plan**

I reiterate the settings for schools in South Australia, which will complement our continuing deliberate and careful HHDL Strategy in Term 2.

- Masks will continue to be required to be worn by Year 7-12 students, staff and adults indoors. Masks are also strongly encouraged for Years 3-6 students.
- Asymptomatic close contacts will no longer be required to quarantine.
   They will instead be required to take five Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) over seven days and wear a mask when leaving home. To access free RATs, close contacts must register <a href="here">here</a> and nominate on the form the collection point from which they will collect a free pack of RATs.
- Close contacts who develop symptoms are still required to get a PCR test and isolate until a negative result is received.
- Parents are permitted to enter school grounds and classrooms. Though
  parent meetings/events may generally resume as usual, schools should
  continue to hold parent meetings/events online where this can reasonably
  occur (such as for most parent teacher interviews).

I thank you in anticipation for your attention to HHDL Four Point Plan; good Health, good Hygiene and hand washing, good Distancing and care for others and good Learning regardless of student location.

During Term 2, the health and wellbeing of students, families and staff remain our priority. We will continue to ensure that our school is a safe environment, maintaining the additional cleaning regime, which was commenced in 2020, accentuating natural ventilation, minimising movement and visitors within the school, and maintaining Subschool delineation as much as is possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community.

#### Masks on Buses

We reiterate to families the expectation that Year 7-12 students wear protective masks on buses. Younger children are encouraged to wear masks to offer optimum protection in the confined bus space.

#### Need a tutor? Studiosity is our free online tutoring service

I remind families that students of Tenison Woods College in Years 7-12 have access to a free online tutoring service. Students are able to connect to expert tutors for live, one-to-one conversations about homework, assignments and exam preparation from  $3:00\,\mathrm{pm}-10:00\,\mathrm{pm}$  Monday to Friday.

#### **Parish Planned Giving Rebate**

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2022 for a deduction to be made.

#### EY-12 Staff Professional Development Days – 9 and 10 June

Early Years to Year 12 staff are looking forward to the staff professional development days Thursday 9 and Friday 10 June, when they will devote time to literacy experiences in the Junior School, integrated curriculum in the Middle School, Student Agency in the Senior School, as well as evolving further our wellbeing approach at the school, focusing on our response to attachment issues and trauma. Early Learning Centre Staff will devote time to their significant whole staff inquiry in relation to communication with parents, in addition to the College's wellbeing focus. Education Support Officers will also be involved in the two days, which will additionally offer all staff the opportunity to refine their SEQTA Learning Management skills.

I remind families that these days are student-free days for the ELCC and R-12 students.

# Middle School Students excel at the 2022 South East Cattle Handling Workshop

Year 7 Student Stephanie Bolte and Year 9 Student Sammie Considine recently attended the 2022 South East Cattle Handling Workshop with excellent results. The day was a hands-on learning experience where the girls handled cattle, were shown washing, drying and clipping techniques, steer selection, judging including discussions around the structure of the cattle and ringcraft etiquette. The day also included a very informative careers talk offered by a panel of industry experts, offering their insights into careers in the agriculture industry.

Both girls came together to combine their talent of cattle judging, and after applying their expert eye and speaking about their findings, the girls judging was found to be on-par with that of the main cattle judge and were therefore declared the winners of the School Trophy for Cattle Judging, out of 60 students across 7 schools! This was an excellent effort, also being the only two representatives for Tenison Woods College.

The girls have their sights set on a Stud Beef Handlers Camp in Geelong next year, as well as continuing to show their cattle at local shows. Congratulations Stephanie and Sammie!



## Year 3 Teacher Discovers Unique Teaching Technique


