After being on a two-year hiatus due to COVID-19, the national Big Band and Choral competition, Generations in Jazz, returned to Mount Gambier this year. 2022 was the festivals 35th year running, and the music students and staff from Tenison Woods College were extremely excited to be a part of the festival, although in a slightly different format. This year, submissions by ensembles were to be virtual instead of the usual weekend spent at the Barn competing live, with a crowd of 5000+ student's and public attending the festival.

Tenison Woods College has a long tradition competing at Generations in Jazz, which is always a highlight of the year for those students involved. This year, four Tenison ensembles competed: Big Band (directed by Jack Heaven), Concert Choir, and Senior Vocal Ensemble, Senior Boys Ensembles (both directed by Beth Creedy and Jody Swiggs).

After waiting over a month for the adjudication results, they finally came last Thursday night, June 16th, at the finale concert held at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre. Tenison Woods Colleges students that had competed were fortunate enough to attend this concert and were treated to musical performances from the likes of James Morrison, Megan Washington, Daren Percival and the GIJ Alumni Big Band, along with many others. This already special night became even more so when it was announced that Senior Vocal Ensemble had come 3rd in the Open (Small Ensemble) Division, and Big Band 2nd in Division 4+.

In addition, three students from the Big Band, Ryan Creedy (Drums), Mia Van Gaans (Bass) and Edie Jones (Bass), were selected for the honorary title of "Superband" members for Division 4+. This honour identifies these students as the best players from across Australia in their Division on their instrument.

A big thank you goes out to all the students and staff for their hard work in these trying times to achieve such a good outcome in this national competition.

#### **Building Site Activity**

Things will start to get a bit exciting on the building site after significant civil engineering, plumbing and concrete work completed in the early part of the year. The following milestones will take place from next week: Saturday 25th June

Large crane will arrive and be located at the south-western corner of the building site.

Sunday 26th June

Riggers will be on site to commence preparation of precast installation. *Monday 27th June* 

Precast construction will commence.

25 panels will be delivered on trucks that day to commence the first section of the build from 7:00am in the morning.

Thursday 30th June

Trucks will deliver significant amounts of steel and erection of steel will commence.

These deliveries of pre-cast panels will conclude by the end of July. Watch this space as it sure will be a busy, exciting time.

#### Phone Usage While Driving in the School Grounds - one of the FATAL FIVE

I appeal to parents about the discerning usage of mobile phones while driving in the vicinity of the school and on school grounds. Last week during one afternoon pick-up period a SAPOL officer observed 12 drivers focused on their mobile phones and not their driving or surroundings.

SAPOL will be conducting random walk throughs over the next few weeks at key times such as school drop off and pick-up periods and issuing fines, as mobile phone usage has been identified as one of the FATAL FIVE (contributing to serious and fatal accidents in our roads).

#### I remind families that:

- You must not use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is moving or is stationary in traffic (e.g. at traffic lights).
- You may, however, use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is parked.
- A mobile phone may only be used while you are driving to make or receive
  a phone call, provided the phone is secured in a commercially designed
  and manufactured mounting device affixed to the vehicle, or the phone can
  be remotely operated.

If the phone is used via Bluetooth or a headset or earphones without touching it, holding or resting the phone on your body, you may touch the headset or earpiece to operate the phone. It is an offence to create, send or look at a text, video or email and to rest the phone on any part of the body.

Using a phone includes:

- Holding the phone in your hand.
- Operating any function of the phone. Holding a phone includes:
- Resting the phone on any part of your body.

These laws apply to drivers and riders of all vehicle.

Current fine for using a Hand Held Mobile Phone is \$ 554 + 92 (Victim of Crime Levy) = \$646 with 3 demerit points.

SAPOL reminds us that "Good Drivers Just drive" and "Road safety is everyone's responsibility."

#### COVID-19 and Flu Challenges - HHDL Four Point Plan

As you may know, the past two weeks has seen the College Middle and Senior School experience some COVID-19 and Flu challenges amongst the student and staff cohorts. At this time I reiterate our continuing, deliberate and careful HHDL Strategy in Term 2, in addition to minimising large gatherings of staff, students and parents.

#### Face Masks

While masks remain recommended by the Chief Public Health Officer, from 30 May, staff, parents, adult visitors and secondary students are no longer required to wear masks when attending the school. Those who continue to choose to wear masks will be supported to do so.

However, families are asked to note that masks continue to be required to be worn by those aged 12 years and over:

- 1. when riding on public transport; and
- who are close contacts, for 7 days after exposure, as per the SA Health close contact guidelines.

Additionally, face masks will be required to be worn in education settings where COVID-19 transmission reaches certain thresholds, based on SA Health advice. In these instances, face masks will be required to be worn indoors by students in Years 7-12 only, and all staff and visitors in the school for a 14-day period. If we reach an outbreak threshold at our school, you will be advised of the dates that face masks will be required. Exemptions to mask wearing will continue to be made for students or staff who have a medical condition, such as problems with their breathing, a serious skin condition on the face, a disability, or a mental health condition.

#### **COVID-19 Positive and Close Contacts Protocols**

Thank you for continuing to support our school as we follow the SA Health advice and in particular for your cooperation in keeping students home from school if they display even mild symptoms.

Asymptomatic close contacts are required to take five Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) over seven days and wear a mask when leaving home. To access free RATs, close contacts must register <a href="here">here</a> and nominate on the form the collection point from which they will collect a free pack of RATs.

Close contacts who develop symptoms are still required to get a PCR test and isolate until a negative result is received.

I thank you in anticipation for your attention to HHDL Four Point Plan; good health, good hygiene and hand washing, good distancing and care for others and good learning regardless of student location.

During Term 2, the health and wellbeing of students, families and staff remain our priority. We will continue to ensure that our school is a safe environment, maintaining the additional cleaning regime, which was commenced in 2020, accentuating natural ventilation, minimising movement and visitors within the school, and maintaining Subschool delineation as much as is possible to minimise the risk of COVID-19 transmission across the College community

#### Vinnies Day - This Thursday

Given the current COVID-19 context within the College community, and to avoid large gatherings, we will switch Charity Day to Week 4 Term 3 (which is on the calendar as Vinnies Day) and Vinnies Day will occur tomorrow to support the significant Vinnies Winter Appeal. As in the two previous years, students will be invited to wear casual clothes, bring a gold coin donation and a can for the cause.

I remind families that students of Tenison Woods College in Years 7-12 have access to a free online tutoring service. Students are able to connect to expert tutors for live, one-to-one conversations about homework, assignments and exam preparation from 3:00pm – 10:00pm Monday to Friday. #### **Parish Planned Giving Rebate**

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2022 for a deduction to be made.




