#### A Time of Loss and Sadness

Some students, staff and families have experienced significant loss and grief in the past week. As we extend our prayers and thoughts to those in need, and wrap our communal arms around those feeling the pain of loss, I thank the staff who have played their part in our Headspace Be You and Catholic Education South Australia auspiced postvention plan. The Leadership Team and the College Emergency Response Team are deliberately working through a contemporary, nuanced approach to supporting particularly the Year 10 and Year 8 cohorts, Middle and Senior School students during this time.



### Phone Usage While Driving in the School Grounds - one of the FATAL FIVE

I continue to appeal to parents about the discerning usage of mobile phones while driving in the vicinity of the school and on school grounds. Two weeks ago during one afternoon pick-up period a SAPOL officer observed 12 drivers focused on their mobile phones and not their driving or surroundings.

SAPOL will be conducting random walk throughs over the next few weeks at key times such as school drop off and pick-up periods and issuing fines, as mobile phone usage has been identified as one of the FATAL FIVE (contributing to serious and fatal accidents on our roads).

I remind families that:

- You must not use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is moving or is stationary in traffic (e.g. at traffic lights).
- You may, however, use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is parked.
- A mobile phone may only be used while you are driving to make or receive a phone call, provided the phone is secured in a commercially designed and manufactured mounting device affixed to the vehicle, or the phone can be remotely operated.

If the phone is used via Bluetooth or a headset or earphones without touching it, holding or resting the phone on your body, you may touch the headset or earpiece to operate the phone. It is an offence to create, send or look at a text, video or email and to rest the phone on any part of the body. Using a phone includes:

Holding the phone in your hand.Operating any function of the phone.

• Resting the phone on any part of your body.

These laws apply to drivers and riders of all vehicles.

Current fine for using a Hand Held Mobile Phone is \$ 554 + 92 (Victim of Crime Levy) = \$646 with 3 demerit points.

SAPOL reminds us that "Good Drivers Just Drive" and "Road safety is everyone's responsibility."

#### COVID-19 and Flu Challenges - HHDL Four Point Plan

Thank you for the community's efforts in recent weeks to curb the impact of COVID-19 and the Flu. At this time I reiterate our continuing, deliberate and careful HHDL Strategy in Term 2, in addition to minimising large gatherings of staff, students and parents.

The HHDL Four Point Plan entails good health, good hygiene and hand washing, good distancing and care for others and good learning regardless of student location. It is as simple as it is powerful in mitigating the continuing risks.

If your child will be absent from school for more than 5 days, please ensure that you contact the Administration Office to obtain a Student Exemption Form. All absenteeism for more than 5 days is approved by the College Principal and entered into our Attendance system to ensure accurate records are maintained and family's government benefits and allowances are protected.

#### **Faith Facts**

Did you know the answer to last week's question, "Have you ever wondered what is the Sacrament of Confirmation?" Confirmation is the second Sacrament of Initiation. The Holy Spirit confirms and strengthens God's gifts of grace that were received at Baptism. The Renewal of Baptismal Promises helps to recommit to the beliefs and living of the Christian life.

#### Gospel of the Liturgical Year: Luke - the themes within the Gospel

Last week we discovered that one of the themes of Luke's Gospel was the power of prayer. Another key theme is one of the place of women in the Gospel. Women play a key role in Luke's Gospel. Mary, Jesus' mother, assents to God's will, sings God's praise, identifies with the poor and ponders things deeply in her heart. Elizabeth (Mary's cousin) and Anna (a prophetess) proclaim the true identity of Jesus. Female disciples are faithful to Jesus' death and Mary Magdalene and other women are the ones to announce his resurrection. Women feature guite frequently in other settings as well such as the widow of Nain, a sinful woman, Mary and Martha, a crippled woman and the parables of the lost coin and the widow and the unjust judge.

- If a child goes home sick, please let the Front Office know that they had a lunch order for that day (or phone the canteen directly on 8724 4607 to notify). Any children who are sick, without the canteen being notified prior to recess time will forfeit their order.
- Once orders are placed on the App, no changes can be made to the order.
- If a forward order is completed, the money will be deducted from the chosen bank account on the day the order is placed.
