Whether it's seeking proper environmental, cultural and heritage protections, Constitutional change, a comprehensive process of truth-telling, working towards treaties, or calling out racism, NAIDOC Week underlines the critical point that we must do it together.

NAIDOC Week is also time to celebrate the many who have driven and led change in our communities over generations; the heroes and champions of change, of equal rights and even basic human rights who have shown us how to **Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!** Such heroes of change have modelled how the relationship between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and non Indigenous Australians needs to be based on justice, equity, and the proper recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' rights.

Critically when we Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up! we must first understand who we are as individuals and the truth we individually speak that nurtures or own identity - spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially, and culturally. This is the understanding behind our concept of our Middle School Community **Gilap Wanga - Ngula wangingi mraata ba wanginyi Learning Community**, a place of deep listening to country, self and others; ultimately a place of reconciliation and growth.

NAIDOC 2022 invites us all to **Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!** To embrace First Nations' cultural knowledge and understanding of Country as part of Australia's national heritage and equally respect the culture and values of Aboriginal peoples and Torres Strait Islanders as they do the cultures and values of all Australians.

Phone Usage While Driving in the School Grounds – one of the FATAL FIVE

I continue to appeal to parents about the discerning usage of mobile phones while driving in the vicinity of the school and on school grounds. Three weeks ago for one afternoon pick-up period a SAPOL officer observed 12 drivers focused on their mobile phones and not their driving or surroundings.

SAPOL will be conducting random walk throughs over the next few weeks at key times such as school drop off and pick-up periods and issuing fines, as mobile phone usage has been identified as one of the FATAL FIVE (contributing to serious and fatal accidents on our roads).

I remind families that:

- You must not use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is moving or is stationary in traffic (eg at traffic lights).
- You may, however, use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is parked.
- A mobile phone may only be used while you are driving to make or receive a phone call, provided the phone is secured in a commercially designed and manufactured mounting device affixed to the vehicle, or the phone can be remotely operated.

If the phone is used via Bluetooth or a headset or earphones without touching it, holding or resting the phone on your body, you may touch the headset or earpiece to operate the phone. It is an offence to create, send or look at a text, video or email and to rest the phone on any part of the body.

Using a phone includes:

- Holding the phone in your hand.
- Operating any function of the phone.

• Resting the phone on any part of your body.

These laws apply to drivers and riders of all vehicles.

The current fine for using a Handheld Mobile Phone is \$ 554 + 92 (Victim of Crime Levy) = \$646 with 3 demerit points.

SAPOL reminds us that "Good Drivers Just drive" and "Road safety is everyone's responsibility."

COVID-19 and Flu Challenges - HHDL Four Point Plan

Thank you for the community's efforts in recent weeks to curb the impact of COVID-19 and the Flu.

At this time I reiterate our continuing, deliberate and careful HHDL Strategy in addition to minimising large gatherings of staff, students and parents.

The HHDL Four Point Plan entails good health, good hygiene and hand washing, good distancing and care for others and good learning regardless of student location. It as simple as it is powerful in mitigating the continuing risks.

Plenary Council – Second Assembly 3-9 July 2022

In October 2020 a historic gathering was due to take place in Adelaide; a Plenary Council. This Plenary Council presents an important opportunity for Catholic school communities to be involved in the shaping of the Australian Church. Due to COVID restrictions, this was postponed until October 2021 and held in an online format.

A Plenary Council is the highest formal gathering of all local churches in a country, and the last one was held 80 years ago over Australia in 1937. It is being held "in order to give the Catholic community in Australia time to listen, dialogue and discern with one another and, guided by the Holy Spirit, discuss the future, the role and relevance of the Catholic Church in Australia". Staff and students at Tenison Woods College were provided with opportunities in 2019 to provide feedback to be considered by the Bishops.

Pope Francis has invited us all to become a "synodal" Church – a Church of faith-filled people who speak boldly and with passion, and who listen

deeply with an open and humble heart. To do this, the voice of every person matters – whether currently involved in the Church or not. 16 questions formed the basis of the agenda of the small group discussions held throughout the week and proposals and requests for further investigation and research to create a more missionary, Christ-centred Church in Australia were put forward.

Issues such as ecological conversion, personal and communal conversion, learning from the early Church, opening dialogue with those who feel excluded from the Church, listening to the voices of First Nations people, and the understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Christ were discussed throughout the week.

The Second Assembly of the Plenary Council is currently taking place in Sydney, where 277 members will undertake the critical task of voting on more than 30 motions that have emerged over the last 4 years of consultations with Australian Catholics. The motions were outlined in the Framework for Motions document, published on 1 June. Our Parish Priest, Fr Peter Zwaans, is currently at the Plenary Council as a member of the 'secretariat', which means he will be assisting with keeping the official record of proceedings. We pray for all members of the Plenary Council, that the truth of the Gospel will shine through the Council and enable the Church to take up her mission to be a light to the nation of Australia.





4. Citation Assist offers students early opportunities to learn about citations and to work on their own referencing during the draft writing process.	Citation Assist is seamlessly contained within the core Writing Feedback service that your students already use. When students submit a draft for feedback, Citation Assist will check the file for potential matches to other text available online.
5. In 2022, Citation Assist will be free for selected schools.	For our existing school partners, we are including the new service free, to support all current students and teachers.
