#### COVID-19 Provision Of Rapid Antigen Tests to Support Future Possible **Testing Of Classroom Contacts**

This week your child will bring home two Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) for you to store at home in case of a potential outbreak of COVID-19 at school. Please rest assured that this is a precaution and not an indication of any immediate concerns within the College community.

SA Health defines an outbreak in an educational setting as five or more COVID-19 positive students in a home/class room across a seven-day period. In the event that there is an outbreak in your child's home/class room, you will be notified that your child is a classroom contact and if they are asymptomatic, they are recommended to utilise one of the provided RATs prior to returning to school. This approach takes into account the updated advice provided by SA Health to educational settings. Note that all students in our school have been provided with two RATs to store at home.

#### **School Crossing Reminders**

I remind parents about the 25kmph speed limit through the School Crossing when the lights are flashing or at any time when children are present.

Crossing monitors are on duty from 8:20am – 8:40am in the morning and from 3:10pm - 3:30pm in the afternoon to cross children safely. If a parent or child pedestrian is stopped there, waiting to cross, even before the crossing monitors have arrived please stop and allow them to cross.

As per legislation, you are also asked not to obstruct the crossing, whilst waiting in a line-up of traffic.

We are looking at measures with the City of Mount Gambier to minimise the congestion in and around our carparks, but I ask for your cooperation, presence and patience during these challenging winter weeks.

#### Student Exemption Form required for absences over 5 days.

If your child will be absent from school for more than five days, please ensure that you contact the Administration Office to obtain a Student Exemption Form. All absenteeism for more than five days is approved by the College Principal and entered into our Attendance system to ensure accurate records are maintained and family's government benefits and allowances are protected.

#### Term 3 Masses in the College Chapel


Mass is celebrated each Thursday of the term and is led by a different class or year level each week. Mass is held at 9:15am in the College Chapel.
