## Respect, Dignity and Care in an Online World

The current COVID-19 context has underlined the importance of wellbeing and connection, which has been enhanced by our online opportunities. Such opportunities also reiterate for me the importance of our College 'village' in caring for the safety of our children, adolescents and emerging adults in environments which can offer on the one hand abundant support, and then on the other hand significant risks.

In this space I turn to the work of Susan McLean, one of Australia's foremost authorities in cyber safety, who encourages us to realise that:

- Respect and responsibility are to be used with consistency in the eWorld.
- Sending mixed messages about cyber safety is not life giving to children and confuses them.
- · You can't have complacency online.
- Cyberspace is a public space and there is no such thing as private online.
- Nothing can be totally deleted it always remains there in cyberspace.
- You are never anonymous online everything can be traced, in that you always leave a digital footprint and your postings and comments can be found years later.
- Passwords are the key to your online security and must never be shared and should be changed every three months.
- Anyone can be anyone online caution is critical.
- There is no such thing as a safe website or application.

Unfortunately, over 30% of Australian teens report being cyber bullied and Susan identifies "a new mean" through the online medium which is occurring at a younger age. She also critiques the role of popular television shows which did not portray the real consequences to such situations of sexting and risky cyber behaviours. It is also apparent that cyber safety issues often touched the students you least expected.

Susan McLean is clear about the significant dangers in relation to online grooming and encourages us to think of an online friend as actually a stranger, with the associated dangers. She clarifies the nuance of knowing the person as distinct from knowing of the person, encouraging children and adolescents to be choosey in relation to friends.

We understand that all internet enabled devices (iPad, phone, iPod, Xbox) are best placed in a common area of the house and not in the bedroom; or at least turning the Internet off when a child is in the bedroom with the device. Susan speaks of the importance of passive supervision in a well trafficked areas of the house

Just as with the opportunities of our globally connected 'real world,' I encourage parents and teachers to embrace the cyberspace, understand the salient issues, acknowledge positives and negatives, as well as be proactive and consistent so that our children and adolescents are afforded the real and actual life-giving safety that we hope.

#### **School Crossing Reminders**

I remind parents about the 25kmph speed limit through the School Crossing when the lights are flashing or at any time when children are present.

Crossing monitors are on duty from 8:20am-8:40am in the morning and from 3:10pm-3:30pm in the afternoon to cross children safely. If a parent or child pedestrian is stopped there, waiting to cross, even before the crossing monitors have arrived please stop and allow them to cross.

As per legislation, you are also asked not to obstruct the crossing, whilst waiting in a line-up of traffic.

We are looking at measures with the City of Mount Gambier to minimise the congestion in and around our carparks, but I ask for your cooperation, presence and patience during these challenging winter weeks.

#### **Parish Planned Giving Rebate**

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2022 for a deduction to be made.

#### **Founders Week and Charity Day**

#### **Social Justice Sunday**

This Sunday, 28 August, is Social Justice Sunday. The celebration of Social Justice Sunday has a long tradition in the Catholic Church in Australia. Almost every year since 1940, our Bishops have joined together to issue a major social justice statement at this time.

Of course, the Bishops also make statements on matters of social and ecological justice at other times throughout the year too. These are often issued by individual Bishops delegated as spokespersons for particular issues, or by commissions of Bishops. By contrast, the social justice statement issued in time for Social Justice Sunday is approved by and issued in the name of the whole Bishops' conference. It is hoped that these statements will inspire reflection and action throughout the whole year.

The Social Justice Statement for 2022-2023 is titled Respect: Confronting Violence and Abuse. You can download the Statement and accompanying prayer card, as well as previous statements, on the Australian Catholic Bishop's website

#### Year 11 Retreat

Next week the Year 11 students and staff will travel to Halls Gap for their annual Retreat. The theme of this Retreat is the Human Behind the Mask. The Retreat is an opportunity to spend time together as a year level and to learn more about the story behind each human face. The Retreat allows students to build connections between one another and to reflect on their sense of self and their relationship with God. The Grampians is a wonderful place to connect with the natural environment and spend time reflecting on the world created for us to care for.

# Season of Creation

The Season of Creation spans five weeks between the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation (1 September) and the Feast Day of St Francis of Assisi (4 October). The Season of Creation is a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through repenting, repairing, and rejoicing together.

During the Season of Creation, we join our sisters and brothers in the ecumenical family in prayer and action for our common home. This year, amid crises that continue to shake our world, we are awakened to the urgent need to heal our relationships with creation and each other. During the season, we enter a time of restoration and hope, a jubilee for our Earth, that requires radically new ways of living with creation.

The Season of Creation unites the world's 2.2 billion Christians around one shared purpose. With so much injustice all around us, now is the time for Christians everywhere to come together and show the world how to love each other and creation.

- · No facial hair is permitted.



# Students Excel at Maths Quiz Night

We recently sent seven teams across three divisions to compete in the Maths Quiz Night at Penola High School.

The event is one of several ran across the state by the Mathematical Association of South Australia (MASA) and takes the format of three rounds of Mathematical and General Knowledge questions and puzzles. The pace is quick and there is a lot of pressure on the teams to complete the questions before the round is up.

Prizes were awarded to the best Mathematics, General Knowledge and overall teams in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior divisions. Our students were very successful, coming back with 4 of the 9 prizes on the night in competitions with Mount Gambier High School, Penola High School, and St Martins Lutheran College:

- Year 7 students Gabriel Strachan and Kareena Ghosh won the Junior Division (7/8) Mathematics prize, a feat made all the more impressive for a duo of Year 7 students against teams of up to four Year 8 students.
- Year 8 students Nevae Brooksby, Maggie Collins, Bonny de Nys and Ruby Shepherd brought home the Overall Best Junior Team award.
- The Year 12 team of Flynn Davison and Aiden Mustey, again as a team of just two, won the Senior Division (11/12) Mathematics prize.
- Year 12 students Patrick O'Hehir, Patrick Brodie, Reuben van Eyk and Jensen Childs were well-clear of the opposition and won Best Overall.

Our Year 9 Intermediate teams put in an outstanding effort but could not quite match the Year 10 teams who had a greater depth of experience.

# Debating Eisteddfod

After two years of forced cancellations due to COVID, it was with no small sense of excitement that five teams across six year levels participated at the Mount Gambier Eisteddfod Debating at Wehl St Theatre last week. With the pandemic limiting opportunities for debating, this was the first time that our Primary and Junior Secondary students had participated in an 'official' debate against other schools. As such, there were plenty of nerves on the day of each debate!

We began on Wednesday with the Primary Division. The Year 6 team of Riley Hopgood, Xavier Georgiou and Ronan Fox put on an entertaining argument 'That school uniform should be optional' and were awarded the win. Thanks to Mrs Kristie Bateman for coaching this team. Thursday saw two teams entering the Junior Secondary divisions. We took the negative on 'That Hogwarts is the ideal school', with strong performances from Isabelle Neumann, Jake Parker and the late substitute, Adelaide Bradley, although they were defeated by the narrowest of margins. The second team of James Taylor, Charlie Hinchliffe and Fred Grey-Smith argued the negative 'that beauty is more useful than brains', presenting a well-researched and thoughtful argument, and were perhaps unlucky to be narrowly defeated.

The Senior Secondary Division was held on the Friday, with two teams presenting. The first debate, 'that humanity is the next dinosaur' was presented by Liam Nott, Ash de Jong and Sarah van Rijthoven. In an entertaining and fast-moving debate, the team successfully engaged the audience with humour and a strong knowledge of their topic and were awarded a victory. The second topic: 'that it is better to be one of the crowd' proved to be the most fiercely contested, with speakers on both sides presenting strong arguments. In the end, persuasive speeches by Flynn Davison and Mariam Kassim, along with excellent and sustained rebuttal from Campbell Fox, saw the team not only win their debate but win the division as best team. Campbell Fox was also awarded best speaker for the division.

The most pleasing aspect of the process this year was the number of new debaters willing to challenge themselves and step out of their comfort zones onto stage (often for the first time). Debating is a skill which takes years to master, and these students are all on the way. I encourage students interested in extending themselves and their confidence to try out the Debate Club, which meets every Wednesday at lunch, upstairs in the PRC.








#### SAPSASA Soccer
