### From the Principal

The Wizard of Oz and Performance Wizardry

I offer my congratulations to all the students, staff and parents involved in the 2022 Musical "The Wizard of Oz". #### Remembrance Day - A Day to Recognise Leadership

At 11:00am on 11 November 1918, the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous warfare. In 1997, Governor-General Sir William Deane issued a proclamation formally declaring 11 November to be Remembrance Day, urging all Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11:00am on 11 November each year to remember those who died or suffered for Australia's cause in all wars and armed conflicts.

On a day when we give thanks for the shoulders on which we stand, our 2023 School Captains, Gael Chizungu and Aden Clarke, along with students and staff representing Airforce Cadets of 612 squadron and the 48 Army Cadet Unit, laid a wreath at the local cenotaph with other members of the community.

We also held our annual assembly in the Barrie Holmes Stadium, hosted by our 2023 School Captains, Gael and Aden. During the commemoration, the 2022 Tenison Woods College Flyers Award was presented to Craig Baker by the President of the Mount Gambier R.S.L., Bob Sandow. Craig was recognised for his mature, motivated, and hard-working approach to school life. Currently undertaking two simultaneous certificate III level programmes, Craig fulfils two jobs whilst completing his SACE pathway with his characteristic positive, 'can do' disposition.

Aden Clarke was also presented with the Student Citizenship Award by Eric Roughana from the Order of Australia Association - SA Branch. This award recognised Aden's commitment to service within and beyond the College community, care for others and building an inclusive community.



#### Hair

- Hair must be clean and brushed or combed to maintain a neat and tidy appearance.
- Hair must be of a singular natural colour and to be tied up if touching the collar of either the school shirt or school dress.
- Hair length should be a minimum of a number 2 cut and hairstyles that are deemed extreme are not permitted, such as mullets of innapropriate length, rats tails, dreadlocks, mohawks, extreme uneven grades, undercuts, or patterns shaved into the hair.
