- · How we SHINE with SWAG (Skills, Work Ethic, Attitude, Game)



As a school community we are an accredited eSMART Alannah and Madeline Foundation school community where the smart, safe and responsible use of communications technology is the norm.

Caring for One Another - Road Safety In and Around Our School

Following on from the theme of helping one another, I remind families of the importance to monitor their speed and adjust it accordingly as they approach the school on Shepherdson Road and White Avenue in the interest of safety for all, but particularly our young. I also remind students to utilise the various designated crossing areas which are monitored by our staff. Crossing the roadways at other areas adds to the danger for our young but also increases the difficulty for drivers in the area. Please remember all College driveways are two-way.

I remind families of our first Working Bee on Saturday 18 February.

The two significant focus areas will be the grounds of the Early Learning and Community Centre, and the grounds of the Middle School Gilap Wanga Learning Community.

Sunsmart Approach

Australia has one of the highest rates of skin cancer in the world, with two in three Australians developing some form of skin cancer before age 70. Melanoma is one of the most commonly diagnosed cancers in Australians aged 15–29. Yet most skin cancers can be prevented by using sun protection measures at appropriate times of the year. The sun's ultraviolet (UV) radiation is the major cause of skin cancer. UV damage accumulated during childhood and adolescence is strongly associated with an increased risk of skin cancer later in life. Given school hours fall within peak UV periods of the day, we have moved to a comprehensive policy will assist schools to adopt healthy UV practices.

We are pleased to introduce the Sunsmart policy this year to our College community. Our Sunsmart procedures such as wearing the College hats and sunscreen will be enacted according to the sun protection times forecasted by the Bureau of Meteorology for when the UV levels that are predicted to reach 3 or higher. Students will be notified during daily pastoral care about the need to wear their hat, and sunscreen will be supplied in the classroom. We encourage all students to leave their hats at school.

CESA COVID-19 Approach

COVID-19 continues to affect the community and we all have a part to play in keeping our school community safe and minimising the disruption to learning that can occur when illness circulates at school. As such I ask you to follow the approach below:

- Students/staff who are unwell should stay home if they have cold or flu-like symptoms and get tested for COVID-19.
- If students/staff have COVID-19, please advise the school as soon as
 possible, and stay at home until all acute symptoms (runny nose, sore
 throat, cough and fever) have cleared.
- Staff "Test to Stay" remains part of the CESA COVID-19 Management Plan for staff who become close contacts at school.

We look with anticipation to occupying the Year 1-6 MacKillop Junior School Building from Term 2 through the wonderful efforts of Edge Architects and Mossop Construction and Interiors. I thank the Junior School students, staff and families for their collaboration in Term 1 to ensure the best possible learning environments within a context of increased student numbers (and as such classes) and limited spaces at the moment.


