Three way Student/Parent/Teacher Conferences - Conversations About Learning

We are looking forward to the revised approach to conversations about learning this year. The change in name reflects a change in focus to engage in conversations that provide valuable opportunities for the teacher, student, parents and/or carers to share and learn more about the student socially, emotionally and academically, while at the same time facilitating increased student agency and responsibility. As such, students are asked to attend all conferences with their parents/carers and teachers.

On all dates when the three-way conferences are held, students will be dismissed at 1.20pm. All buses will run on these days. Students may need support with class or subject work; they may be shy, disruptive, or just need someone to listen to them and show they care. LAP can be a positive factor in breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage.

The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor, sharing in the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The support and encouragement that a volunteer can give, fosters the development of a student's self-esteem and confidence.

The success of the program is based on five simple principles. These are that LAP:

- Is always one-to-one;
- Is about relationships;
- · Builds confidence and self-esteem;
- Takes a creative approach to learning; and
- Promotes parent and community participation in schools.
