Meet Scarlett. She is 8 years old and has a spinal cord injury from a tumour that was removed when she was almost 2. Today we are sharing her story to celebrate International Wheelchair Day

"Scarlett got her first manual wheelchair when she was 3.5 and then we added a power assist attachment to a new chair when she was 6." Says Mum, Nicole.

"She loves the independence her wheelchair has given her and the power assist in particular has enabled her to keep up with her friends at school and navigate different terrains easily. She learned to manoeuvre around quite quickly and if she's going somewhere, it's usually at full speed!"

"Scarlett attends the Women's and Children's Hospital (WCH) on average once or twice per month for procedures and outpatient appointments. She doesn't always enjoy her visits but has built good relationships with her team of doctors. She likes spending time in the Starlight Express Room the most!"

"She is obsessed with all things art and attends a weekly art lesson that she loves. She also loves nature photography, swimming, reading, telling jokes, spending time with her family and relaxing with her favourite companion Max the dog."

"We think Scarlett is amazing. She's a cheerful, friendly girl with a positive outlook who just wants to get out there and do what all the other girls her age are doing."

"She's been through such a lot but she doesn't let anything slow her down or stop her from doing the things that she loves."

Learning Assistance Program Volunteers Needed

This significant individual time creates more learning situations where students can experience success, and supports their achievement at school. There are often students in junior primary, who would benefit from individual time with a volunteer.

Students may need support with class or subject work; they may be shy, disruptive, or just need someone to listen to them and show they care. LAP can be a positive factor in breaking the cycle of educational disadvantage.

The volunteer becomes the student's friend and mentor, sharing in the challenge and excitement of learning through a variety of experiences. The support and encouragement that a volunteer can give, fosters the development of a student's self-esteem and confidence.

The success of the program is based on five simple principles. These are that LAP:

- Is always one-to-one;
- · Is about relationships;
- · Builds confidence and self-esteem;
- Takes a creative approach to learning; and
- Promotes parent and community participation in schools.
