Student Pulse Surveys – Student Wellbeing and Agency at the core of our Endeavours

During week 5, 6 and 7 all students in South Australian Catholic schools are being asked to complete the CESA Pulse Check. This Check has been designed to offer students an opportunity to provide information about how they are currently feeling about school and the information provided by students will give our school valuable feedback to help our school improve its care for our young.

I clarify that there are no right or wrong answers, but rather we are asking students how they are feeling about school - that is what we want to know about.

Significantly this survey is designed to help us help our students to become, as per the mission of Catholic Education South Australia, thriving people, capable learners and leaders for the world that God desires.

Phone Usage While Driving in the School Grounds – one of the FATAL FIVE

I appeal to parents about the discerning usage of mobile phones while driving in the vicinity of the school and on school grounds. Mobile phone usage has been identified as one of the FATAL FIVE (contributing to serious and fatal accidents in our roads).

I remind families that:

- You must not use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is moving or is stationary in traffic (e.g. at traffic lights).
- You may, however, use a hand-held mobile phone while your vehicle is parked.
- A mobile phone may only be used while you are driving to make or receive a phone call, provided the phone is secured in a commercially designed and manufactured mounting device affixed to the vehicle, or the phone can be remotely operated.
If the phone is used via Bluetooth or a headset or earphones without touching it, holding or resting the phone on your body, you may touch the headset or earpiece to operate the phone.
- It is an offence to create, send or look at a text, video or email and to rest the phone on any part of the body.

Using a phone includes:

- Holding the phone in your hand.
- Operating any function of the phone.

These laws apply to drivers and riders of all vehicles and the current fine for using a Hand Held Mobile Phone is \$ 554 + 92 (Victim of Crime Levy) = \$646 with 3 demerit points. SAPOL reminds us that "Good Drivers Just drive" and "Road safety is everyone's responsibility."

Parish Planned Giving Rebate

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2023 for a deduction to be made.

EY-12 Staff Professional Development Days – 8 and 9 June

Early Years to Year 12 Staff are looking forward to the staff professional development days Thursday 8th and Friday 9th June, when they will devote time to the critical literacy experiences and student agency throughout the school. Furthermore we will be evolving further our wellbeing approach at the school, focusing on coaching students to facilitate agency in the Resilient IMPACT approach.

I trust students and parents will experience the benefits of the days through our service to students and families throughout the College.

I remind families that these days are student-free days for the ELCC and the R-12 part of the school.

CESA COVID-19 Approach

The most recent CESA Covid 19 procedures state the following:

- Schools should continue to emphasise that students, staff and site visitors who are showing COVID-19 symptoms should stay away from school until acute symptoms (runny nose, sore throat, cough and fever) have cleared.
- Staff are required to notify the school if they return a positive COVID-19 test.
- Families are recommended to notify the school/centre if their child returns a positive COVID-19 test.

The adjudicator noted that the use of research and nuanced examination of the topic were the deciding factors in the debate, awarding the debate to Tenison Woods College! Congratulations Charlie, Mennatallah and Fred!

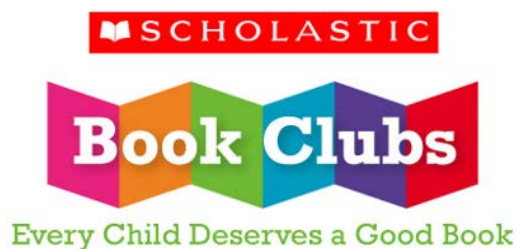
Reconciliation Week

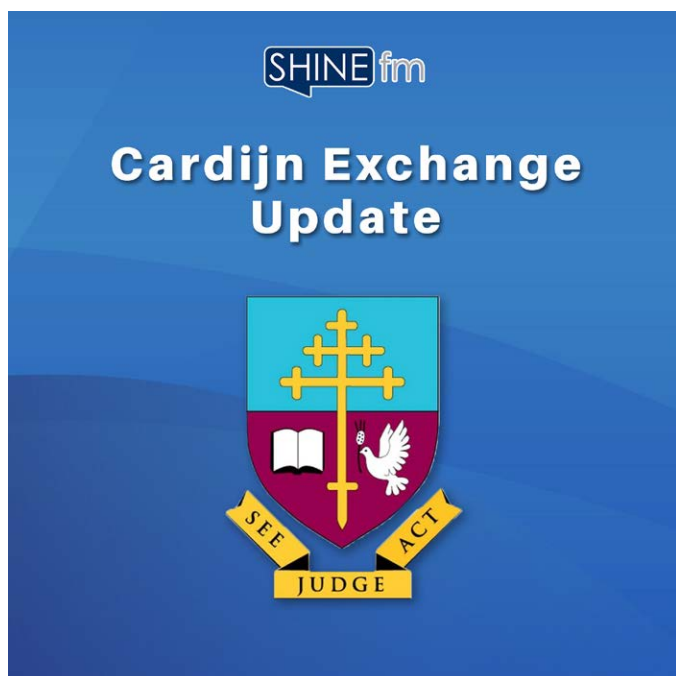



We look forward to sharing the total money raised once all funds have been collected and tallied. Thank you to the City of Mount Gambier for their generous contributions towards the evening.



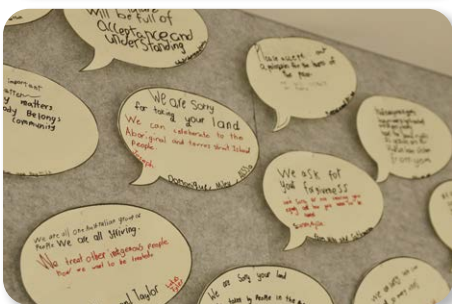

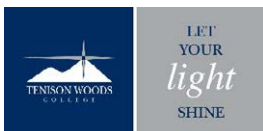
