From the Principal

need, but Father Peter reminded us that it can also encompass other kinds of giving, such as giving time or talent. Ultimately charity is an act that seeks the good for another with no thought of receiving anything in return.

I trust these students will gain insights into the realities of life for our poorest neighbors of Timor-Leste in both village and urban contexts as well as to witness the work of the Church as it meets the material, pastoral and spiritual needs of the communities served by its presence. All money raised this year will be distributed to the communities that delegates will visit, such as the Bakhita Centre, the Dominican Orphanage and our sister school in Hatolia, San Francisco Xavier College. This year Bernadette Fisher and the delegation are also looking forward to a tour of Klibur Domin, a charitable home operated by the Ryder Cheshire foundation, which has strong links to Mount Gambier.

Through immersing themselves into the Timorese culture, students will embark on a transformative journey of learning and self-discovery. They will witness the resilience and determination of the communities they visit, gaining a deep understanding of their challenges, but at the same time their appreciation of their precious gift of life. It is hoped that this experience will foster empathy, compassion and an appreciation for cultural diversity and will inspire our students to strive for a more just and inclusive world.

I look forward to hearing the stories of the delegation and their insights into how the funds raised by our community this year will be donated and put to good use to support our neighbouring sisters and brothers.

Carpark Safety with the new MacKillop Junior School Building

Have you seen the new play equipment for the Junior School? I am delighted that work has commenced on our nature play areas adjacent to the south eastern side of the building \dots and it is looking great!

We are learning about the impact of the building and play areas on vehicle and foot traffic within our community. As such, could we ask that families use the driveway adjacent to the ELCC to drop off students and use the central path between the ELCC/ Reception building and the Administration building to access the MacKillop Junior School building.

If that approach causes families a challenge and the Pam Ronan Centre / Barrie Holmes Stadium driveway is used, could the walking paths to the MacKillop Junior School be used.

In essence, using paths designated for walking will be the safest way to access the MacKillop Junior School Building.

White Avenue Safety - Use the Koala Crossing

Families are finding White Avenue a good place to pick up their children. If children cross White Avenue I ask them to cross at the Koala crossing. Using the Koala crossing offers some extra safety, as cars slow down to navigate the narrowed road.

CESA COVID-19 Approach

The most recent CESA COVID 19 procedures state the following:

- Schools should continue to emphasise that students, staff and site visitors who are showing COVID-19 symptoms should stay away from school until acute symptoms (runny nose, sore throat, cough and fever) have cleared.
- Staff are required to notify the school if the return a positive COVID-19 test.
- Families are recommended to notify the school/centre if their child returns a positive COVID-19 test.

Student Exemption Form required for absences over 5 days.

If your child will be absent from school for more than 5 days, please ensure that you contact the Administration Office to obtain a Student Exemption Form. All absenteeism for more than 5 days is approved by the College Principal and entered into our Attendance system to ensure accurate records are maintained and family's government benefits and allowances are protected.

Parish Planned Giving Rebate

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2023 for a deduction to be made.




Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday


Little Lambs




