CESA Community LLL Perception Surveys

By the conclusion of week 5 of term 3 all Catholic Schools in South Australia will have completed the CESA Living, Learning, Leading Perception Surveys. The surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University and are focussed on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework is taking place in schools as perceived by students, family and staff.

Teacher and student surveys will be conducted at school between Weeks 1 and the end of Week 3, Term 3. Parent surveys can be conducted anytime up to the end of Week 5.

There are 7 surveys in total as described below. 1. Middle Primary Years 3 and 4

- 2. Upper Primary Years 5 and 6
- 3. Middle School Years 7, 8 and 9
- 4. Senior School Years 10, 11 and 12
- 5. Teacher survey
- 6. ESO staff
- 7. Parent survey

The surveys will be deployed to all schools ready for completion by the end of Week 3 in Term 3. Each survey has been trialled, refined and piloted in a range of CESA school settings and the development team is confident that schools will derive very useful information for planning and improvement. Year 8 and 9 Future Thinking



Timor-Leste Immersion Trip'A'

Students embark on life-changing journey to Timor-Leste.

A group of Year 11 & 12 Students and supporting staff have recently returned from the villages of Timor-Leste, with a new perspective on life.

Tenison Woods College and it's sister school San Francisco Xavier College in Hatolia, have continued a tradition of an annual visit to Timor-Leste, after spending the year fundraising. This immersion has been a long-standing event on the Tenison Woods College calendar, but due to the travel restrictions, has not been held since 2019.

Immersion organiser Bernadette Fisher, is beyond proud of the students for their efforts. This incredible group demonstrated their dedication through fundraising efforts in the lead up to the immersion, showing great compassion and empathy during their travel experience to Timor-Leste. These young leaders were able to see first hand the differences in education, living conditions, poverty, amongst other issues and, this has given students more reason to continue the support upon their return.

The immersion group spent 10 days in Timor-Leste, visiting the Bakhita Centre at Palaca where they visited the local catholic school before taking a short trip across the Indonesian border into West Timor. It was at Hatolia that they visited their sister school, and entertained a large crowd at a cultural night with a stirring rendition of 10,000 Reasons and an energetic dance, Waka waka. The crowd rose to their feet and demanded an encore at the end of the night.

Students and staff also visited the small village of Malura and despite having to drive through a river to get there, students were amazed to see the sight of a finished school, that past fundraising efforts have achieved.

On their way back to Dili, the group visited Klibur Domin for a tour of the facilities which help students with disabilities, as well as holding a TB clinic and mental health facilities. In Dili, students and staff were entertained by students at the orpahngae and saw the sights including the Resistance Museum, the World War 2 Memorial at Dare, climbing to Cristo Rae and enjoying a swim at the beach.

A highlight of the trip was meeting the President of Timor-Leste at the Presidential Palace. Students were able to ask questions about the President's role and values, and he spoke to the group about his vision for a better Timor, which included improving the health of women and children and pollution reduction. He spoke about being awarded a Nobel prize for his contribution to find peace and independence in his country. After the meeting students took the opportunity to help serve 200 students as part of a nutrition program fully funded by the President from his personal income.

Bernadette comments: "The Timor immersion presents us with opportunities to become global citizens and look outside our own community to help those that are most vulnerable. This year we were presented with living conditions for a group of 40 boarders at our sister school that shocked and distressed us all. We have made it our mission to raise the \$8,000 needed to complete new living quarters for these young women.

The students impressed me with their thoughtfulness and generosity, donating their own money to the priest to buy rice for students who do not have enough food to eat every day.

Following on from our meetings with the President and the Secretary for Education we have great plans for the future. We intend to trial a program in which we connect with our sister school for one hour per week in hopes of improving their English. This will further develop and enrich our relationship with the school and its students. An extension of this will be to look into the possibility of an exchange program where both teachers and students can visit our school for a period to continue to improve their English skills."

School Captains Gael Chizungu and Aden Clarke were honoured to have been able to attend the immersion in 2023.

Gael comments "The highlight for me was experiencing the culture and bonding with the children, all who have grown up much differently than myself. It was great for me to be able to fully immerse myself in this trip.

I struggled a lot with knowing about the many opportunities I have that these children will never experience, being from a third world country.

It is comforting that they are able to find happiness in the life they have and is a reminder to us all that material things don't equate to happiness.

Meeting the president was an inspiring experience. I was in awe of his knowledge and the way in which he holds himself, he was a very humble man.

Our time at the School in Hatolia was eye opening. The poor condition of the dorms has motivated me to continue fundraising, in hopes of making their living conditions better in the future."


