The surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University. These surveys are focussed on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading.

Framework is taking place in schools.

Teacher and student surveys will be conducted in schools between weeks 1 and the end of Week 3, Term 3. Parent surveys can be conducted anytime up to the end of Week 5.

There are 7 surveys in total as described below.

- 2. Upper Primary Years 5 and 6
- 3. Middle School Years 7, 8 and 9
- 4. Senior School Years 10, 11 and 12
- 5. Teacher survey
- 6. ESO staff
- 7. Parent survey

Each survey has been trialled, refined and piloted in a range of CESA school settings and the development team is confident that schools will derive very useful information for planning and improvement.
