From the Principal



Social Justice Sunday - Listen, Learn, Love - A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples

Sunday 27 August 2023 marked Social Justice Sunday and the Australian Catholic Bishops' Social Justice Statement entitled, "Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples" is available for download <u>here</u>.

In 1967, Australians gave overwhelming support to a referendum that recognised Australia's First Peoples as citizens. In 2023, we will be given a chance to vote in another referendum to constitutionally recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples through a Voice to Parliament.

Australia's Bishops see it as an opportunity for all Australians to renew our engagement with the First Peoples of Australia. They have come to this view through much listening to the First Peoples and they encourage us all to listen to them in a spirit of love and humility. The Bishops invite the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) to speak directly about their experiences of injustice and about their hopes for the future.

NATSICC addresses the many injustices their people have faced since colonisation until now. They speak of many concerns including high suicide rates and incarceration, shorter life expectancy and poorer outcomes in employment, education and housing. They also identify racism as an on-going challenge. The information they use includes the Closing the Gap Report and the witness of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples who spoke about their concerns during visits to many communities during the preparation of this statement.

NATSICC also acknowledges the achievements of many of their people despite these challenges and notes the many efforts by First Nations communities to address these problems. They note with approval the efforts made within the Church to support their communities. They conclude by giving their support to the referendum on the Voice. They see it as a positive step in efforts to improve the lives of First Nations people.

The Bishops acknowledge the pain and hardship experienced by First Nations Peoples. They point to the Church's efforts to stand in solidarity with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples since the early days of colonisation. Nevertheless, they acknowledge that the Church played a part in the injustices First Nations People have experienced.

The Bishops invite us, as Catholics, to begin a new engagement with the First Peoples to overcome injustice, an engagement grounded in love. This love is at the heart of Jesus' message. This love is characterised by a commitment to encounter and dialogue, reciprocity, mutual accompaniment and a desire to put the other at the centre of our attention.

The Bishops offer us some simple actions which could help us to begin this new engagement. The Bishops do not tell us how to vote in the referendum, but they encourage us to inform ourselves about the issues through respectful dialogue, especially with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

The Bishops and NATSICC join together at the conclusion of the statement to call for us all to walk together in love on a journey of healing, whatever the outcome of the Voice referendum.

Mount Gambier Voice Treaty Truth Forum - 6 Sept 2023 - Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre

I am pleased to inform you that Burrandies Aboriginal Corporation, ac.care and the South Australian Council of Social Services are partnering to deliver an informative forum in Mount Gambier on the Indigenous Voice to Parliament.

The two-hour forums on September 6 at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre will be repeated in the afternoon (1:00pm-3:00pm) and evening (6.30pm-8.30pm) to increase the opportunity for people to attend, and all community members are encouraged to take part in a session.

It is a unique opportunity for anyone to learn about the Voice to make an informed vote at the upcoming referendum, feel confident speaking about the issue with others and also gather with local Aboriginal community leaders and First Nations people as a unifying demonstration of support in learning and walking together towards a more reconciled nation.

Australians will vote in the referendum and everyone should be informed with accurate information. This will be provided at the forum with a focus on the Uluru Statement from the Heart and its call to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Constitution, implement a First Nations Voice to Parliament and work towards Treaty and Truth-telling as key steps on Australia's journey to reconciliation.

A unique aspect of the forum will be a special guest and facilitator - Ngarrrindjeri, Kaurna and Wirangu woman Melissa Clarke, who was a delegate at the Constitutional Convention at Uluru and a signatory to the Uluru Statement - Voice, Treaty, Truth.

The forum will include an overview of the Uluru Statement and the referendum process, followed by a panel discussion, question and answer session and a call for action to help take our nation forward. If you are available to attend, please register via this <u>link</u> – which allows separate bookings for the afternoon and evening sessions.

Timor Leste Delegation \$8,000 Challenge

We have 'locked on to' the challenge put to us by our Timor Leste delegates. We now have a goal to raise a further \$8,000 before the next delegation departs on 23 September, so that the boarding school dormitory for girls in Hatolia can be completed. The delegation was shown the dormitory for 40 young girls who board at the school. The conditions were very basic and quite upsetting to see.

A new dorm is in the process of being built and as a group the delegation have made a promise to the girls to raise the required \$8,000 to finish the project before the next trip. Declan Shines in Prime Minister's Spelling Bee

Year 3 student Declan Lee has recently participated in the Prime Minister's Spelling Bee, along with his peers.

Declan, who has been blind since birth, was able to participate using Braille. Declan is the first ever Braille-assisted participant to have taken part.

Declan was able to complete the practice test a few times, so that he would know what to expect on the day. On the day of the competition, Declan was assisted by ESO Carolyn Jones, and guided by his teacher Narelle Drew. Declan was set up in a quiet space with his Perkins Braille Writer and the laptop so he could hear the words.

Carolyn used the laptop to guide him through the test, as it is online, and Declan used his braille writer to record the answers.

Declan got to hear the same as other students who competed, the only difference for him, was that instead of typing the answers directly into the competition website, he wrote in braille which was then transcribed by Carolyn afterwards. Declan's entry was also filmed so that judges could see that he was not assisted at all to spell the words.

Declan had outstanding results, and got 23 out of 30 words correct, however one word was not written inside the allocated time, making his total score 22 out of 30. As the first ever student to compete using braille, hopefully this will pave the way in the future for students who need an adjustment to the format to be able to compete.
