## National Child Protection Week and Safeguarding Sunday

Safeguarding Sunday is on 10 September and was formerly known as Child Protection Sunday. Safeguarding Sunday comes at the end of National Child Protection Week (5 – 10 September). The theme this year for National Child Protection Week is Every child, in every community, needs a fair go. The theme invites us think further and appreciate that to treat all of Australia's children fairly, we need to make sure every family and community has what kids need to thrive and be healthy. ## Mount Gambier Voice Treaty Truth Forum – Today 6 Sept 2023 - Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre

The Burrendies Aboriginal Corporation, ac.care and the South Australian Council of Social Services are partnering to deliver an informative forum in Mount Gambier on the Indigenous Voice to Parliament.

There are two, 2 hour forums today at the Sir Robert Helpmann Theatre. One was held this afternoon with the second being held this evening from 6.30-8.30pm, community members are encouraged to take part in a session.

It is a unique opportunity for anyone to learn about the Voice to make an informed vote at the upcoming referendum, feel confident speaking about the issue with others and also gather with local Aboriginal community leaders and First Nations people as a unifying demonstration of support in learning and walking together towards a more reconciled nation.

A unique aspect of the forum will be a special guest and facilitator - Ngarrindjeri, Kurna and Wirangu woman Melissa Clarke, who was a delegate at the Constitutional Convention at Uluru and a signatory to the Uluru Statement - Voice, Treaty, Truth.

The forum will include an overview of the Uluru Statement and the referendum process, followed by a panel discussion, question and answer session and a call for action to help take our nation forward.

## Timor-Leste Delegation \$8,000 Challenge

We have 'locked on to' the challenge put to us by our Timor-Leste delegates. We now have a goal to raise a further \$8,000 before the next delegation departs on 23 September, so that the boarding school dormitory for girls in Hatolia can be completed. The delegation was shown the dormitory for 40 young girls who board at the school. The conditions were very basic and quite upsetting to see.

A new dorm is in the process of being built and as a group the delegation have made a promise to the girls to raise the required \$8,000 to finish the project before the next trip. So we were urged to roll up our sleeves as a community and raise the funds needed.

## Parent Teacher Student Conferences

Parent Teacher Student Conferences commenced this week and there are a few slight changes that have occurred to this term's events that are anticipated to improve the event even further for all involved. These changes have occurred as a result of parent, student and staff feedback from semester one.

The first change is that we will be running two separate events in Week 7 and week 8, a Junior School event, for all involved in Reception to Year 6, and a Secondary School event, for all involved in Year 7 to Year 12.



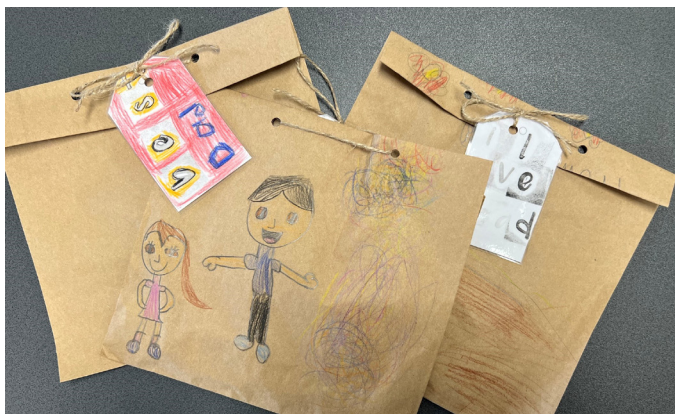

## 9/10 Girls Netball

The Year 9/10 team demonstrated remarkable resilience throughout the duration of the Knock Out Netball carnival, even in the face of adversity. Despite contending with multiple girls being sidelined due to injuries, the team admirably adapted to the situation, leading to some adjustments in potential combinations.

In the first match against Immanuel College, our team showcased a strong start by effectively capitalising on turnovers, securing a 3-goal advantage at the conclusion of the first break. However, Immanuel's impressive determination narrowed the gap, with them ultimately emerging as 5-goal victors.

The subsequent game pitted our team against the formidable Westminster School, a truly sleek opponent. From the outset, Westminster exhibited a fierce ball pressure on our girls, resulting in an 11-point deficit by half time. Responding to the challenge, changes were implemented, and the girls adeptly adjusted to the mounting pressure, winning the quarter by a single goal. The second loss meant the opportunity to compete for the 5th position against St Mary's College.

Despite enduring further setbacks in the form of additional injuries as the day progressed, our team remained steadfast. The final match, although not our best showing, was characterised by fierce competition and consistent closeness throughout. Fluctuating opportunities to establish a lead were countered by the need to make up margins, culminating in an overtime situation. Regrettably, an excess of turnovers proved detrimental, resulting in a narrow two-point loss.

Nonetheless, it's imperative to recognise the exceptional performance of our girls, particularly considering the hot weather conditions. Their ability to secure the 6th position in the Year 9/10 category is a testament to their perseverance and dedication.

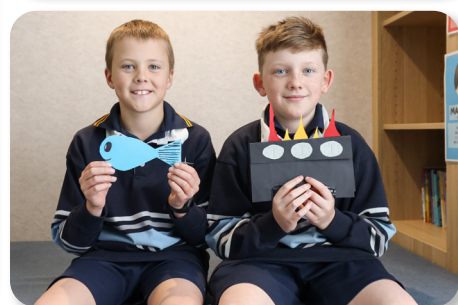

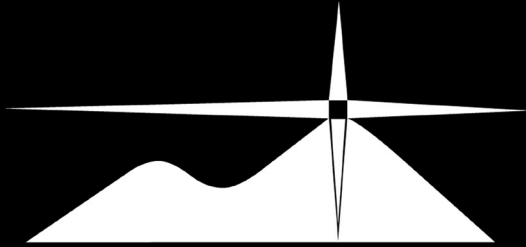
