Prayer for Peace in the Holy Land

The Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem and all the Ordinaries of the Holy Land called for a day of fasting, abstinence and prayer on Tuesday 17 October.

As we witness the crisis which is unfolding in Israel and the Gaza Strip we are horrified by the deliberate slaughter of innocent men, women and children and the imminent suffering of Palestinians who are now besieged in the Gaza Strip, cut off from food, water and power and fearing the violence which is coming to their homes.

As the impact of war and violence is felt in our hearts and in our communities, we are called to "open our hearts in special way" and pray for peace and the end of violence in the Holy Land. As expressed by Father Peter in the Sunday Parish bulletin, while we watch "the horror unfolding of the Israeli-Hamas conflict it is easy to imagine that what's wrong with the world is 'out there.' It's true, we can't fix the world, but we can fix ourselves. We are called to be peacemakers, we are called to forgive seventy times seven times, we are called to turn the other cheek. We must pray for them, but we must change ourselves."

As the year flies by and we look also to 2024, I remind families that if they are thinking about purchasing a device for next year, just check out our Bring Your Own Device page on our website.



Uniform Reminder - Extreme Hair

I remind families of the College policy in relation to uniform, and particularly students' hair. The policy indicates:

Expectations

Hair is to be clean and brushed or combed to maintain a neat and tidy appearance. Hair is also to be of a singular natural colour. All student hair, male and female, is to be tied up and secured neatly if at a length that can be pulled back. Students are not to have dreadlocks, rat's tails or other extreme styles and if a student's head is shaved, it is to be a minimum number two cut."

I further clarify that in a practical sense the College Leadership determine that hair which touches the shoulder would normally be tied up. This satisfies our duty of care, hygiene and Work Health and Safety obligations.

I further clarify for students and parents, the following haircuts are deemed as extreme: mullets of inappropriate length, rats tails, dreadlocks, mohawks, extreme uneven grades, extreme undercuts, and patterns or designs shaved into the hair.

I also ask that as many students may have grown over the winter period, can dresses please be adjusted to knee length.

I thank families in anticipation for your support in this matter. As I have often indicated, attention to the detail of clear and safe boundaries ensures that the larger issues do not eventuate in a school community.
