Dickson and Nick Patzel, and Poplars Coordinators, Natasha Davis and Alex Window, as well as the respective teaching staff for planning and presenting the celebrations. It was wonderful to see the students acknowledged and celebrated for their achievements, but also in their time of transition.

The Year 9 End of Year Celebration on Tuesday evening was another wonderful rite of passage event, and poignant reminder of just how fast our young develop and how precious, as it is fleeting, is this time with them. Thank you to Nick Patzel, Brad Maney, and the Year 9 staff for their efforts this year in creating the 9Shine program, leading to the 9Shine camp and the significant family event for our young.

As we have celebrated over the past two days we have accentuated this year's theme "growing our gifts together" and how we have lived our PERMA framework, which we have made our own through SHINE. During the Year 6 and Year 9 Graduations I asked the audience to think of a time this year when they felt good about being a member of Tenison Woods College.

I asked was it when you:

- H helping others to be their best?
- I getting involved and in the flow? •
- N when you were known by name, seen and you mattered?
- E enjoying positive emotions that lifted your spirits?
- + being healthy and nourished in your body?

I reiterated that if they felt good about being at Tenison Woods College they were expressing our SHINE approach to being well, living well or wellbeing.

We then turned our thoughts to a time when they did their best, or achieved at their best.

- I asked, was it because of your Skills when you 'nailed' your learning and you showed that so well?
- What about your Work ethic did you achieve because you tried hard as long as it took?
- How was your Attitude? Did you not give up? Did your attitude create your altitude? How did your attitude effect those around you?
- Did you know your Game what you were doing and why? Did your God, our God, help you play well, to see what was important and how we work together? We remember God's game is a game of respect and care for others.

I queried, whether in achieving did you SWAGGER? I then put it to the audience that if you felt good and that you belonged you were SHINING (in the right place) and if you did well you were most likely SWAGGERing (achieving your pathway). At Tenison Woods College we say every learner has a place - expressing SHINE, and every learner has a pathway - using your SWAGger I underlined that having a place and a pathway are the two critical keys to a full and fulfilling life.

I finally thanked all present for their commitment to SHINE and SWAGGER, which has left a lasting impression on the fabric and story of our community; who we are and what we value. I am thankful to our community for stepping up to "grow our gifts together" to bring out the best in others so that we all have confidence to SHINE and SWAGGER.

The players were able to travel to a number of towns across Fiji's main island, seeing firsthand the third-world living conditions many of the children come from. They visited schools, trained with local kids and took donations of soccer boots, soccer uniforms and school stationery supplies.

The Fijian people with their warmth and genuine happiness, were a real inspiration to Samuel and Liam. It will be an experience they remember for many years to come.

Year 2 Student Lyla Woolston is 8 years old, and was accepted to compete at the Victorian Dressage Festival at the Werribee Park Equestrian Centre on the weekend.

Lyla was honoured to have been accepted to compete at the event, as this is done by having high enough scores in dressage throughout the year. Plus, she was the only child competing in this class, and the youngest in the whole competition.

She was competing against 12 other adult riders and won her first test with a personal best score of 72.411%. Overall from both tests she was the highest scorer and won the title of State Champion in Preliminary Pony dressage. She was awarded a beautiful rug, ribbons and prize money.

Lyla is still 4 years too young to compete in the FEI children's tests as the minimum age is 12 years. This is why she is having to compete against the adults until she is of age.

Lyla works and trains extremely hard, and her pony Loriot Skyes The Limit is an absolute superstar & the ultimate dancing partner for Lyla.
