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

### Wellbeing Initiative - Classroom Pulse 'Check-In'

As in past years, each term during week 5 and 6 every student in a Catholic School in South Australia will participate in a simple online Classroom Pulse Check-In. This Check-In has been developed to ascertain how students are currently feeling about their experience in school. It is tailored to allow your child's teacher(s) to Check-In and provide immediate feedback and support to them. The Check-In will be carried out during the school day.

I am conscious that life in school has its' ups and downs, but I am also confident that your child's teachers want to understand how they are feeling so they are able to support you and your child in meeting any social, emotional, or learning needs that they may have.

To enable this, your child's teacher and I will have access to their responses to facilitate follow up and support as required. Please be assured that, as your child's prime caregiver, any support required will be communicated and discussed with you in advance.

In addition to supporting your child, de-identified data from all participating schools will be used by Catholic Education SA to identify trends to assist in future planning for the support of the learning and wellbeing for students across South Australia.

### The Season of Lent





You can start small by simply sparking conversations with your kids about Lent and exploring creative ways to integrate compassion into their daily lives.

We're encouraging parents to Give it up for Lent! Whether you decide to forgo your daily coffee over Lent, or you are opting to 'walk to work' instead of your car commute – every small action makes a significant impact!

### **Project Compassion**

Throughout the six weeks of Lent (40 days), students will learn about the work of Project Compassion and how it has provided help to individuals and communities. Each week of Lent, Caritas Australia highlights a different project or program that they support in a particular country. These projects focus on issues such as education, healthcare, food security, and access to clean water.

This week we introduce Ronita, who is 22. She lives with her husband and two children in a barangay (local district) in Quezon City, which is situated in the Philippines. Ronita left school when she became pregnant as a teenager. This could have had a life-long impact on her ability to find work and provide for her family but, thankfully, she heard about the Alternative Learning System (ALS) program run by the Faithful Companions of Jesus (FCJ), Caritas Australia's local partner in the Philippines.

Gael Chizungu - Perception: Before and After

My diptych titled 'Perception – Before and After', (44cm x 50cm) is a multimedia piece on exposed wood, comprising of photos, acrylic paint, collage, Zart Slicks and Posca's. 'Perception' depicts my childhood memories of Africa, whilst living there and my alerted perception of Africa after migrating to Australia.



### Lilli Spooner - Strawberry

My painting titled 'Strawberry', oil on wooden canvas (20" x 16"), features two images of strawberries in different states. The first side section has a punnet sitting on a kitchen sink, the second composed of chopped strawberries on a cutting board with a knife above them. The intention behind this piece was to capture the beauty of my surrounds. The piece moving left to right of whole strawberries to cut up pieces of the fruit displays the effect of time and human action on a mundane, inanimate scene. This was a significant aspect of the piece that linked to the beauty from the mundane topic, not only displaying physical beauty but also the beauty of life within it. The appreciation of beauty of the of a scene allows us to find our day-to-day lives extraordinary.



Jemma Gittins - Humans and Nature

'Humans and nature' is a 420x596mm acrylic on canvas painting depicting the view of a dreary and unhealthy city out of a window. This painting represents my personal views about issues in this world causing the mass destruction of nature such as overpopulation, overconsumption, and pollution. The themes of the painting were influenced by artist Alexis Rockman who focuses on the negative effects that humans have on nature in his paintings. I was inspired by some of the imagery used in his paintings such as chaos and clutter to represent overconsumption. I also took inspiration from his use of bright, unnatural colours, which shows unnatural human impact. This painting should inspire action against the unsustainable ways in which humans are treating the Earth and all of its delicate and magnificent nature.
