To support students the Expo will offer subject information booths which will provide information in relation to:

- Tertiary and TAFE education options;
- Employment providers and employment support agencies
- Samples of student work;

The Pathways Expo will be held in the MacKillop Junior School Building and a year 7 Subject Information Session for 2025 Year 7 students will be conducted at 6:00pm in the top floor of the Pam Ronan Centre.

The Expo with a range of booths, information session and range of providers will be highly beneficial in assisting students and families to make informed decisions about their learning and subject selections; consequently, we strongly encourage all 2025 students and their parents to attend the Expo.

CESA Community LLL Perception Surveys

By the conclusion of week five of term 3 all Catholic Schools in South Australia will complete the CESA Living, Learning, Leading Perception Surveys. The surveys are a product of a collaboration between Catholic Education SA (CESA) and Curtin University and are focussed on the development, validation and use of a system-wide survey to examine the understanding of the vision and extent to which Catholic Education SA's Living Learning Leading Framework is taking place in schools as perceived by students, family and staff.

Each survey has been trialled, refined and piloted in a range of CESA school settings and the development team is confident that schools will derive very useful information for planning and improvement.

Reception Enrolments 2025

Families are finding the best place to pick up their children and I ask if children cross White Avenue to cross at the Koala Crossing. Using the Koala crossing offers some extra safety, as cars slow down to navigate the narrowed road.

Parish Planned Giving Rebate

I remind families that parents contributing to the Parish Planned Giving may claim a rebate from Tuition Fees of 50% of their contribution up to a maximum claim of \$750. Official Parish receipts are to be presented to the Finance Department after the 30 June 2024 for a deduction to be made.

School Card Support

Families who would like support to meet school fee commitment are urged to apply for School Card. Eligible school card recipients will receive a 50% discount off tuition fees. School card qualification criteria is outlined below.

For families who meet the criteria (for the taxable year ending 30 June 2024) it is worthwhile and all you have to do is either make an appointment to see the Business Manager for the completion of the appropriate forms or apply online via https://www.sa.gov.au/topics/education-and-learning/financial-help-scholarships-and-grants/school-card-scheme if you wish to complete them yourself. If you are applying online, please ensure to select Tenison Woods College *not Tenison Woods Catholic School*.








Open Boys Knockout AFL Football
